Two years ago, the people of Paschim Banga brought the Government of Maa, Maati, Manush into power to end 34 years of Left misrule and tyranny. Today, as we complete two years of the state's first true pro-people government in decades, I thank all those whose faith has been our fuel in our fight for social justice. It has certainly not been a smooth ride. There have been ups and downs, but it has been an enriching experience, which has further reinforced our resolve to undo the wrongs perpetrated on our beloved state and to speed up the march towards making it a better place to live in.

We are aware of the challenges — the mindless and needless opposition we face everyday — that lie ahead. We draw confidence from the fact that our government enjoys your overwhelming support in this journey towards equality and justice.

Two years is a just a milestone for our young government. It is certainly not long enough a time frame to assess correctly the performance of a two-year government that has been elected for a five-year term against the misdeeds of 34 years of previous regime. We started our journey with the promise to serve "Maa, Maati, Manush" and we shall remain true to our commitment till our last breath.

We all know the state we inherited from the previous government is saddled with an unimaginable debt burden exceeding Rs 200,000 Crore! The previous regime, blind from its penchant for nepotism, myopic vision and flawed fiscal policies, left the state on the brink of economic bankruptcy.

Two years ago when you voted us to power, the administrative machinery was in a state of disarray and a general sense of gloom engulfed the entire system because of over 34 years of misrule. The police force was totally demoralized. The former ruling party's men lorded it over

in every sector, throwing all principles to the four winds. They were arrogant and interfered with every sociopolitical aspect of the society by using money and muscle power. Our state's Manush suffered them silently for more than three decades before showing them the door in the best traditions of democracy. We came to power because people wanted us to.

I am happy to observe that we have been able to restore a sense of discipline, an urgency to focus on what's important for the State and a genuine upsurge in the morale of the entire state machinery. Today, even a state functionary of the lowest rank is aware of his responsibilities and his duty to discharge the same.

We always take criticism in the right spirit, because unlike many of our critics, we truly believe in democracy and will never shy away from taking corrective measures wherever and whenever necessary.

Let it be remembered that we are fighting a principled battle with the Centre in order to get what is rightfully ours. We have made it clear that we are not going to them with a begging bowl. West Bengal has a genuine claim because of certain unique circumstances that the Union Government must consider and meet in order to help it revive its economy and give the State an overall boost. There is a concerted attempt from within and outside the State to give our Government a negative image, calling it anti-industry and anti-progress. We have done enough during the past two years to show that we do not deserve such labels. We shall dauntlessly carry on our efforts and prove that the confidence reposed in us by the people of this state is not misplaced.

We have been doing much better than what the state had achieved under the Left Front. And the figures show that very clearly.

While India's GDP growth has been 4.96% in 2012-13,

growth in agriculture and allied sectors has been 2.56% compared to the national figure of 1.79%. While India has grown by 6.59% in the service sector, we have achieved a 9.48% growth rate. Our growth in tax revenue hit a record 30%. Industry is our asset and agriculture, our pride. We have

reached out to the farmers of the state in a never-before manner. More than ten lakh farmers have received financial support of up to Rs 45,000 to purchase farming equipment through the Kisan Credit Scheme. Under the Jal Dharo, Jal Bharo scheme, we had a target of digging 50,000 ponds in five years. We are happy that in a span of merely two years, we have already dug nearly 51,000

ponds. To ensure that the other backward communities (OBCs), including minority communities, do not remain bereft of the benefits of higher education, we have reserved 17% seats for them in higher educational institutions, which will be effective from 2014-15 educational year. We have also distributed scholarships to SC, ST, OBC and minority community candidates. Measures have been taken to hasten the process of issuing caste certificates. Another example of our concern for minority communities could be seen in the fact that most of the suggestions tabled by the Sachar Committee for the central government have

been executed by our state.

For 34 years, the Left had ravaged the prospect of the state by perpetuating a sense of great inertia and poor work culture. Normally, it should have taken decades to erase the scars of the damages done. However, in just two years, we have succeeded in reversing much of this. We have taken great initiatives towards industrialisation. Our efforts have brought, in the last two years, investment proposals of more than one lakh crore of rupees. Pioneering initiatives such as establishing land banks, web-based banks, e-governance, e-tender, e-systems and FRBM have been started by our Government. In the government sector alone, more than 3 lakh jobs have been created. As a happy consequence of an upsurge in industrialization and other commercial activities in the state, hundreds of thousands of people have

found employment in private firms as well. We are proud to mention that we have succeeded in ending a decades-long tradition of lethargy. Today, the state has an atmosphere of positive work culture. In the 34 years of the Left Front rule, Bandhs had made us lose an unbelievable 78 lakh work-days. It is indeed a matter of great pride that in the past two years, loss of work-days due to bandh has been dramatically reduced to only 5000. Employees at various levels in administrative and government departments now have an open access to us. It has enthused them in carrying out their duties. We believe,

We are also trying to ensure holistic benefits for the rural population through innumerable projects like "Anandadhara", "Geetanjali", "Adhikar" and "Nija-Griha - Nija-Bhumi".

such families will get a one-time help of Rs 25,000 for their financial improvement. Apart from this, we have also undertaken many initiatives such as establishing the first exclusive university for women at Diamond Harbour and 65 women police stations, of which 10 have already started functioning. We will soon start 45 special courts to address crimes against women.

In 2012-13, we have given subsidy amounting to Rs 131.25 Crores for 23,465 projects under the self-employment schemes. This initiative has created employment potential for 78,000 people.

Providing social security to the citizens of this state has been one of our priorities. Our initiatives to this effect have resulted in a sharp decline in criminal activities especially against women. We have also exercised firm control over political disturbances. In 2010, 118 people were killed in 1119 political encounters. The number had plummeted to 10 deaths in 542 such violent events in 2012. We have also been able to curb Maoist attacks to a great extent. It comes as a rude shock to realize that 149 people were killed in 343 Maoist attacks in 2009. After we came to power, our stern measures against such activities were able to bring down the figures to 13 deaths in 32 attacks. In 2012, there was no such incidence. The state once had 151 fast track courts financially supported by the Centre. On April 1, 2011, the Centre discontinued its support and the state government, in spite of limited resources, ran those courts for the next two years. However, under a Supreme Court order, we are

changing 88 of them into permanent courts. Also, 24 of these erstwhile fast track courts will become equivalent to District Judge Courts.

We are happy to see these achievements as the first few milestones of a great journey. We are sure that we will be able to cross every barrier with the help and support of you, the people of our state. The recent Chit-Fund Scam has not escaped our immediate attention. The erstwhile Left Front government had literally nursed them to health during its long tenure of oppression and obfuscation. They never probed into the business mechanics of these swindlers and as a result, today, countless poor investors are devastated. We are taking swift action

West Bengal's Growth of Revenue hit a record of 30% (29.94%)

WEST BENGAL COLLECTS Rs. 32,000 CRORES IN 2012-13 AGAINST THE APPROVED RESOURCE PLAN OF THE PLANNING COMMISSION OF RS. 28,413.14 CRORES

In 2010-11, the Year before this Government took office, the Revenue collected was only Rs. 21,000 Crores as against Collection of Rs.32,000 Crores in 2012-13.

The Tax GDP Ratio will cross 5% for the first time in 15 years.

Unfortunately, out of Rs. 32,000 Crores of Revenue generated in 2012-13, over Rs. 25,000 Crores is cut off by the Reserve Bank of India for meeting interest and repayment obligations, due to the Debt of over Rs. 2,00,000,000,000/- (Rs. 2 Lakh Crores) thrust on us by the Left Front Government.

Micro & Small Scale Industries

- > Under Cluster Development Programme, 54 Clusters are under implementation.

- > Under the Integrated Handloom Development Scheme, 39 Handloom Cluster Development Projects and 83 Group Approach Projects made operational.

Power

- > 33 Lakh new consumers have been added in WBSEDCL area during 2011-12 and 2012-13, which is an all time record.
 - Ministry of Power has recently rated WBSEDCL as the 2nd best utility in the country for the purpose of credit rating.
- > A comprehensive rural electrification programme introduced in 11 backward districts.
- Under rural electrification extension work, 7 new 33-KV sub-station have been added during 2012-13 and more than 4200 new mouzas electrified.
- > Conventional grid electricity extended to Sagar island.
- > Power banked by the State during 2012-13 (upto January 2013) 952.71 million units. Corresponding return power will reduce power shortage during 2013-14 by about 400 MW.

Infrastructure



Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

 Agriculture Department, for the first time, adopted a strategy to transform agriculture into a vocation which is economically viable and adequately competitive so as to enable every farmer to experience substantial increase in their income in foreseeable future.

•Successfully increased both production and productivity of clean rice by 10% in 2011-12 to 14600 MT and by further 5.5% in 2012 -13 to 15375 thousand MT over the previous years

*A total of 10,83,217 number of farmers were directly brought under the developmental activities of the State Government in Agricultural Sector under "Crop Demonstration" on Rice, Wheat, Pulses, Oilseeds, Maize, Sugarcane during this period and other Demonstration programme like "System of Rice Intensification" (SRI) etc. to demonstrate ways of increasing productivity of chosen variety of each crop and cost reduction possible.

•On an average 10 % increase in production has become a reality due to timely assistance extended to the farmers in the form of 'Quality tested' Agricultural inputs like seed, seed treatment compounds, herbicides, fertilizer and micronutrients etc.

*During 2012-13, despite delayed rain in monsoon, the productivity in Kharif has increased by 10% to 2600 kg/ha during 2012-13 from 2565 kg/ha during 2011-12. This has been achieved with timely integrated planning, extension and by ensuring judicious irrigation round the day with both surface, and subsoil sources through optimal utilization of electricity.

•In our effort to diversify to profitable crops we have reversed the declining trend from 2006 – 07, by increasing the area under Pulse crops from 2010-11.

Consequently, the production of Pulses in the State has recorded significant growth – winning "Krishi Karman" award, of Gol during February 2013. During 2012-13, the production and productivity of total Pulses are likely to further increase by 13% and 4.16% respectively over 2011-12.

•For Development programme on Mustard, Groundnut, Sunflower, TII and Maize, 52675 number of farmers were provided with critical inputs and hands on training. Further 1,63,000 farmers were supplied with Plant Protection chemicals, soil ameliorants etc.

•Following the same trend of growth in Oilseed sector, the productivity is expected to increase (as on 25.2.2013) by > 6% during 2012-13 over 2011-12.

•To obviate the scarcity of farm labour and reduce cost of sustainable farming, modern agricultural machines and implements were provided to the farmers on subsidy ranging from Rs 45000/- for 40 HP tractor or > 8 HP Power Tiller; Rs 40000/- for Power Reaper and Rs 15000/- for Zero Till Machine. A subsidy of Rs 10000/- for diesel/electric Pump sets, were also given under farm Mechanization Scheme.

•To support marginal farmers with a set of Small Implements, viz Sprayer, Manual Paddy Thresher, Cono Weeder, Drum Seeder, PVC Delivery Pipe, and Spade, Rs 5000/- each is being given to 30000 farmers

•For the first time, the subsidy amount has been credited to beneficiary's Kishan Credit/ (Bank) a/c for purchasing above machines and each set of small implements as per their own choice.

•To help to reduce the cost of cultivation, a new Scheme of extending 'One Time Assistance' for electric connection to electric Pump sets @ Rs 8000/-, has been provided to the

farmers. 31125 farmers are expected to be benefitted with power connection, during this period.

•To reduce the vulnerability of small and marginal farmers of the State, additional 11.10 Lakh farmers have been covered with special campaign, under Krisan Credit Card (KCC), during 2012-13 Vs 6.6 Lacs in 2010-11 and 7.24 Lacs in 2011-12. Outreach / Extension: All extension efforts, advisory and subsidy schemes were regularly broadcast over AIR and TV channels.

These efforts were further strengthened by Mobile Extension Unit.


•Krishi Mela was organized in each Block and Sub-division with all allied Sectors participating projecting the services offered by each. The displays and exhibition of distinctive products of fruits, vegetables and agricultural crops were overwhelming – best of the produce were awarded.

*The 'melas' culminated in a week long 'Mati Utsav', where all services rendered to the rural sector who lives on our precious earth were on display. Large numbers of rural artisans, creative farmers, fishermen were conferred State's awards for the first time by Honble CM herself.

•66042 numbers of farmers were provided with Farmers' Old age Pension facility.

•Govt has planned to cover 7 Lac hacs under Integrated water Shed Management Scheme, in a phased manner over 5 years to complement the much stressed State Mission namely. "Jal Dharo Jal Bharo".

•Earlier, the Water shed Dev was covered under NWDPRA, which will terminate with coverage of 13000 Ha in 12-13 vs 7500 in 11-12 ans 7000 Ha in 10-11



Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

Agricultural Marketing Department has undertaken program for development of marketing infrastructures up to Block level, market intervention as and when necessary through procurement, monitoring and market intelligence, regulatory measures through agricultural marketing legislations and direct support for promotion of marketing of agricultural produces to the producers. These new initiatives aim at realization of maximum share in consumers' price of state's agricultural produces.

The exclusive elements of the new programs include macro agricultural marketing infrastructures like KISAN BAZARS, setting up of COOL CHAIN, regular market monitoring through formation of task force and fortnightly high level meetings in presence of Hon'ble Chief Minister of the state and distribution of post harvest devices to the producers.

Infrastructural Development:-

Department of Agricultural Marketing creates, develops and maintains marketing infrastructures throughout the state.

Rs 46.70 crores (including RIDF) have already been received and disbursed to West Bengal State Marketing Board in the year 2012-13 for implementation of various infrastructural development schemes

"Krishak Bazars" to be set up Lands for 95sites have been identified throughout the State for construction of "Krishak Bazars".

Detailed Project Reports for (DPRs) for all 91 sites have been prepared. Cost estimated is Rs 523 Crores

Work orders have been issued for 82 of the projects

Work at 81 sites are in progress
Preparatory Works for the 2nd phase of
construction of further 100 Krishak Bazars
have started.

Purchase of Refrigerated Vans for development of Cool Chain:-

A project worth 4 crores has been approved for purchase of 20 Refrigerated Vans through which vegetables will be procured from the farmers directly at remunerative prices.

9 such vans have already been delivered.

Promotion of Non Basmati Aromatic Rice:-All necessary ground works such as identification of farmers groups for

Identification of farmers groups for sourcing the supply, designing and arrangement of Packaging etc have already been done for brand

building of Tulaipanji and Gobindabhog rice varieties of Bengal.

License has been obtained from Govt of India as a Registered Packer under the brand name "Banga Krishishree".

Promotional sale of those two rice varieties on a pilot scale has already been started from the sales counter of Paschim Banga Agri-Marketing Corporation Ltd at Banga Bhavan, New Delhi as a part of brand promotion. An outlet is being set up in Writers' Building for opening of the 2nd sale counter.

Construction of Potato Flake Factory:-The project had already been approved by APEDA. Approved cost of the project is 25.47 crores.

Extension of State MSP for Potato

Notwithstanding financial constraint, the Govt. procured common Variety of Potato: 'Kufri Jyoti' directly from the growers at MSP of Rs. 275/ 50 Kg Packet and thus helped in stabilizing the farm gate price of Potato in the current season.

Cold Storage Activities

Between May 2011 to March 2013, 41 new Cold Storage Licenses have been issued. Total no of cold Storages in the state is 524 at present with a total capacity of 65.54 lakh MT. Loading of potato in the cold storages have started and about 80% space of cold storages have already been loaded with potato.

Price Monitoring

All important markets including Kolkata markets are monitored and the price as well as arrival data are recorded, analyzed and disseminated regularly so that producers get rational and

remunerative share in consumers' rupee. It also facilitates to control the retail prices of agricultural produces. A state level TASK FORCE comprising of senior officers has been notified and a state level fortnightly meeting chaired by Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal has been monitoring marketing scenario of Agricultural and allied produces in the State.



Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

Livestock sector offers significant potential for human development through poverty reduction and nutritional security. It also focuses on woman empowerment. ARD Department is working with a vision to increase quality production of MEM (milk, egg and meat). The performance of ARD Department over the last two years in the various sector is as follows:-

2. Mother Dairy Calcutta (MDC):

Fresh milk collected from village level dairy cooperative societies (through Milkfed) & self help group in Non-MPCS areas. This has resulted in increase of collection capacity of Mother Dairy from 80,000 litres to 2.20 lakh litres per day. From loss it has come to profit of Rs.11.00 crore. MDC is also producing a new variety of MD special cow milk along with the brand name "Maa-Shakti" Cow Milk.Toned Milk, Cholesterol Free Milk and Full Cream Milk. MDC has also launched several new milk products - Flavoured Yoghurt, Mishti doi, Paneer, Ghee, Whey (Ghole) drinks as well as packaged drinking water. MDC is going to launch 40 gm. Vanilla and Chocolina Valentine Ice-cream, mango pudding. Outlet increased from 1250 to 1400 and it intends to open outlet in 22 hospitals. Average milk sale increased to 3.35 lakh litres per day.

MDC has taken over Burdwan State Dairy which was closed for more than 9 years. The project is in pipeline at a cost of Rs.5.70 crore.

3. Development works in LWE Blocks:

Each of the 23 LWE blocks has been covered through a major initiative in the ARD activities.

- 12 Blocks have been covered under Bishes Go-sampad Bikash Abhijan.
- 7 Blocks have been covered for intensive goat production (8220 no. distributed).

 6 Blocks have been covered under bullock rearing scheme with two bull calves for socio-economic development.
 2216 bull calves have been distributed among 1108 numbers of BPL beneficiaries.

4. Paschim Banga Go-Sampad Bikash Sanstha (PBGSBS):

Bishes Go-Sampad Bikash Abhijan (a special campaign for breed improvement of cattle for augmenting milk production) extended from 6 to 100 Blocks covering all the districts. At present 2.49 lakh Heifer has been brought under Scientific Management System (this includes health coverage, nutritional support and compulsory insurance to all heifers born through artificial insemination) to boost dairy sector.

West Bengal Cooperative Milk Producers' Federation Ltd. (WBCMPFL):

At present 2092 no. registered Dairy Cooperative Societies in the village level are collecting milk from its 265418 producer members.

New District Milk Union established in the District of Purba Medinipur named as "Tamralipta Milk Union" along with 79 new MPCS. The procurement volume is 3.28 lakh litre per day from 3.16 lakh litre per day.

With a view to strengthen HIMUL, Rs. 4.96 crore was released for payment of arrear bills of raw milk procured from primary milk producers' societies as well as its NDDB loans liquidated.

6. West Bengal Livestock Development Corporation (WBLDC):

This Corporation has been entrusted with marketing of meat and meat products like Chicken, Turkey, Quail, Duck, Pork and Rabbit etc. along with other consumable products through various outlets, retailers and franchises. The production capacity increased from 1000 kg. to 2000 kg. per day. Chicken processed items introduced like ready to eat chicken sauces and loaf chicken.

7. West Bengal Dairy & Poultry Development Corporation (DAIRPOUL) .

This Corporation is producing different types of cattle feed, poultry feed and fish feed in its five feed plants. The Capacity increased from 27952 MT to 33937 MT.

8. Manpower Development:

Staff Selection Commission, West Bengal recommended 82 candidates for the post of Veterinary Pharmacist and 124 candidates for the post of Livestock Development Assistant. Appointment of 100 Veterinary Doctors is in pipeline through PSC.







9. Infrastructure works done and in pipeline

- (i) Modernisation of Farms, Vet. Hospitals, Disease Diagnostic Lab, Training Centre in Darjeeling (in pipeline at a cost of Rs.5.79 crore).

Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

About 68% of the population of West Bengal belongs to SC, ST and OBC. The BCW Department is working for the social, educational, economic and cultural development of these Backward Classes of the State. The Department has initiated some innovative changes in the delivery system during the last year. Speedy disposal, dose monitoring, timely submission of reports and returns and outreach to the poor SC/ST/OBC people are the essence of changes. A few highlights about the major schemes and programmes executed by the BCW Department are given below:-

+ Reservation: The Benga Backward Classes (Other than Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) (Reservation of Vacancies in Services and Posts) Act. 2012 has been published to provide reservation for the Other Backward Classes (OBC), so long dependent on executive orders, the force of law. Strict monitoring has ensured submission of statutory returns on reservation by Government departments. This Improved has observance of reservation norms. At present there are 60 castes identified as Scheduled Castes, 40 tribes as Scheduled Tribes, 65 classes as OBC Category - A.

West Bengal. There are a total of 98 minority classes in the lists of OBCs out of which 86 belong to Muslim minority.

+ Issuance of Caste Certificate: Monthly Issuance of caste certificates improved from 50,000 to around 60,000. Compared to 6.00,210 Caste Certificates Issued In 2011-12, 7,06,071 Caste Certificates were issued in 2012-13.

Educational + Implementation of schemes: Under different educational schemes, Rs. 442,22 crore to 37,74 lakh students in 2012-2013 and Rs. 414.16 to 32.58 students in 2011-2012 were disbursed. Under newly Introduced Pre-Matric Scholarship to around 3.00 laich SC students were provided scholarship. Besides, education loan for higher studies in Engineering / Medical / MBA / Nursing are available to SC / ST students living below double the poverty line from the West Bengal SCs and STs Development and Finance Corporation. During 2011-12, 84, 5C & 36, ST students availed loan of Rs.2.10 Crore and Rs.19.94 Lakh respectively. During 2012-13, 98, 5C and 6, ST students availed loan of Rs. 2.08 Crore & Rs. 5.09 Lakh respectively as education Ioan. Similarly, 54 & 42 students belonging to OBCs availed education amounting to Rs.31.18 & 29.49 2011-12 & 2012-13 lakh during respectively.

During the financial 2011-12, minimum support price of Kendu leaves was raised to Rs.75.00 per Chata (2.5 kg) from Rs.35.00 per chata. 60,303 and 1, 90,628 man-days were created during 2011 and 2012 crop year respectively with a total cost of Rs.8.00 crore.

> +Social Security scheme economically backward sections: Rs.127 crore to 1,30,463 STs and Rs.165 Crore to 1,30,463 STs have been disbursed during 2011-12 & 2012-13 respectively.

+ Inditvidual Beneficiary Oriented Scheme: West Bengal SC ST Development & Finance Corporation extended soft loans and assistances of Rs. 47,30 crore for self-employment; skill development etc to 47,300 SC beneficiaries during 2011-12. The corporation also extended financial assistance of Rs. 18,70 crore to 18,702 nos. of ST beneficiaries in 2011-12. During 2012-13, financial assistance and soft loans of Rs.100.04 crore was extended to 66696 nos. of SC beneficiaries under different self-employment schemes and financial + Satting up new schools: Two Eklavya. assistance of Rs. 32.25 crore was provided Rs.2.83 crore has also been utilised for

 Infrastructure Development Programme in SC/ST dominated areas: 74.95 Crore for 2011-12 & Rs.185.80 Crore for 2012-13 have been utilized for execution of various infrastructure development programme like Minor Irrigation (Deep tube Wells, Shallow Tube Wells, Excavation / re-excavation of ponds / canals), Sinking of tube wells / wells drinking dua for water. construction of roads, bridges & culverts, construction / re-construction / repair & renovation of hostel buildings / primary buildings, construction community halls etc. under SCA to SCSP, SCA to TSP and Art.275(1).

+ Setting up of Hostels under Babu Jagjivan Ram Chhatrawas Yojna for the SC & ST Boys and Girls: Under Babu Jagjivan Ram Chhatrawas Yojana, construction of 6 Boys Hostels and 6 Girls Hostels for SCs have been taken up during 2011-12 and construction of 4 Boys Hostels and 13 Girls Hostels for SCs have been taken up during 2012-13. Construction of 4 Hostels located in Jalpaiguri and Cooch Behar having a total capacity of 400 Girls is completed.

+ Improvement on the living condition of existing hostels: During 2011-12, repair / renovation of 213 hostels were taken up. In 2012-13, department ensured completion of all such repair works and also arranged for repair of another 141 hostels for SC/ST.

+ Ambedkar Centre for Excellence:

During the year 2011-12, the Government decided to set up the Ambedkar Centre for Excellence (ACE) at Kolkata with its branches in all the Districts for coordinating the Educational, Socio- economic, Cultural, Professional and Skill Development activities.

+'Mayel Lyang Lepcha Development Board': Approval for setting up the 'Mayel Lyang Lepcha Development Board' under the control of the Backward Classes Welfare Department for the preservation of Rich Tradition and Cultural Heritage of Lepchas of Bengal has been received.

+ Ensuring implementation of POA and PCR Acts: Arrangement for building awareness through workshop, Flex Boards. Leaflets etc. has resulting in filing more cases under POA act. Marriage incentive has been increased from Rs.5,000/- per couple to Rs.30,000/- 118 cases have been sanctioned in 2012-13.

+ Uttarbanga Sech Samabay Prakalpa (UBSSP): 1000 units Minor Irrigation schemes for small and marginal SC farmers have been sanctioned for Jalpaiguri & Cooch Behar districts at a cost of Rs.8.00 crore. 750 units have already been completed out of 1000 units during the year 2012-13.

+ Pre-IAS/WBCS training for poor but meritorious SC/ST students has been introduced during the year 2011-12. At present, 4 students are availing subsidised coaching at New Delhi.

+ Computer training of SC/ST students: Training on 'O' Level Computer course of ECIL-ECIT in 66 centres in State at a cost of Rs. 2.96 Crore has been introduced during 2011-12. During 2012-13, DOEACC 'O' level computer course is introduced, 700 students in 14 Centres are pursuing course.

+ Job Focussed Training Programme -Job-focused Training Programme was introduced with the objective of increasing employability of SC/ST candidates. It was decided to target unemployed youths having educational qualification of 10th standard and below. In the year 2011-12, out of 1345 SC/ST youths trained in 'New Age Security Guard' trade, 1043 were provided job employment and in 2012-13, out of 1157 candidates trained, 1016 were provided iob-employment. In Plastics Engineering & Technology Trade, through CIPET, Haldia, 300 SC/ST youths were provided skill development training and 270 were placed in the industry successfully in 2011-12 & 2012-13.

+ During 2012-13, loans amounting to Rs.73.2888 lakh have been disbursed to 696 beneficiaries belonging to Muslim OBC communities.





Biotechnology Department

With the mission of fostering a conducive scientific research atmosphere for societal development in the State, this department extends financial help to different scientific research proposals for which are received from scholars of universities, scientific research institutes on different subjects like agri-biotech, healthcare biotech and environmental & community biotech etc.

Significant Achievements:-

As many as 28 (twenty eight) scientific research projects on different subjects and other Biotechnology related matters have been financed by this Department.

- · The full fledged commissioning of Kolkata Biotech Park has been done at EN -24, Salt Lake, Sector-V, Kolkata 700 091 with a highly specialised common instrumentation facility genomics laboratory (fourteen) 14 State-of-the-Art instruments collaboration with Dr. B.C. Guha Centre **Engineering** Genetic Biotechnology under University of Calcutta as knowledge partner.
- Work has started for setting up of 4 (four) BT-kiosk-cum-Training Centres in Paschim Medinipur, Burdwan, Bankura and South 24 Parganas. One BT-kiosk-cum-Training is on the verge of being operational in Paschim Medinipur. This is a unique concept of dissemination of basic knowledge of biotechnology which would help common farmers / other people in the

said districts as a single-window solution for almost all problems of low-end biotechnology.

- Tissue culture Phase-II at Women's Technology Park, Sagar Island", Vivekananda Institute of Biotechnology, Nimpith has trained up 30 (thirty) women in plant tissue culture and each trained woman has been tagged with 12 (twelve) farmers. A total of 360 (three hundred sixty) farmers have been harvesting the fruits of plant tissue culture in Sundarban areas in West Bengal.
- The project titled "A Biotechnological Intervention in Barren Land of Gopiballavpur-I Dev. Block of Paschim Medinipur for sustainable Livelihood of Tribal people" covers 3 (three) mouzas and more than 5000 (five thousand) tribal people are actively engaged in this societal development programme. Thus 25,000 (twenty five thousand) mandays have already been created. It has generated additional scope of employment for both men and women living below the poverty line in the forest fringes of Paschim Medinipur.

Upcoming pipeline projects: [New Initiative]

a) Efforts are being made to establish a biotech-hub at Burdwan on the land belonging to the Burdwan Development Authority (BDA)

b) It is also proposed to set up a hub of Marine Biology & Biotechnology near Sundarban areas of South 24 Parganas.

c) Efforts are being made to establish a Finishing School of Industrial Biotechnology for biotechnology graduates / post-graduates as an 'Industry-Academia' in collaboration with University of Calcutta.



Child Development Department

To envisage special importance of care, protection, welfare and development of children in the State the Department implements various schemes and programmes.

1) Integrated Child Development Services Schemes (ICDS)

Programme aiming at improvement of nutritional and health status of children in age group of 0-6 years and for pregnant and lactating mothers through Anganwadi Centres at the village level.

New Projects-The Govt. of India has sanctioned 160 additional ICDS Projects for which the Department has taken steps to operationalise all the projects in the year 2011-12 and 2012-13.

Monitoring Committee-for ICDS from State Level up to Gram Panchayat Level have been constituted in the year 2012-13.

Initiative for filling up of the vacant posts in 23 LWE Blocks of the Jungle Mahal (3 LWE Districts) which is expected to be completed in the first quarter of 2013-14. Anganwadi Karya Katri Bima Yojana of LIC - AWWs and AWHs have been provided with the benefits under since the year 2011.

Uniforms for AWW's & AWH's AWWs and AWHs of Anganwadi Centres are being provided with uniforms (Sarees 2 each) and badges w.e.f. 2011-12 which has been already distributed in the LWE affected Districts.

Survey on Nutrition - through the National Institute of Nutrition has been taken up by the Department for improving and brining in variety to the SNP. In the meantime change the daily menu in Angawadi Centres under

SNP have been introduced instead of "Khichuri".

Mission Mode— as per new Mission Mode, The Department has set up target for prevention and reducing the children under nutrition by 10%, enhancement early development and learning outcome in all children of 3 to 6 years of age would improve care and nutrition of girl and women to reduce anemia in the children, girls and women by 20%.

Construction of AWCs - Department has constructed 1087 numbers of Anganwadi Centres in the year 2011-12 and 1916 number in the year 2012-13 under various schemes of different
Departments like

RIDF-XIII/XIV/FC-XIII/MSDP/BRG/BADP/ MPLADP/BUP/P&RD etc.

Education - Initiative taken in the field of education wherein it has taken up the issue of admission of children to Primary School directly from the Anganwadi Centres at the age of six.

2) Integrated Child Protection Scheme (ICPS)

New scheme being implemented since 2009-10 with the objective of improving the distribution system of services by way of Integrated Street Children Programme, Correctional services scheme and adoption.

*The Central Govt. has adopted the State Govt.'s Web based Child Tracking System named "Track Child 1.0" for tracking of missing and found children (and also women) and has universalized this system in all States of our Country.

*The State Commission for Protection of Child Rights has been set up and vacancies in the offices of State Child Protection Society, District Child Protection Society are being filled up in brisk pace.

*Since 2011-12 construction, repairing and renovation work of Training-cum-resource Centre in the office

premises of the District Social Welfare Officer and other Homes in Purulia, Paschim Midnapur, Nadia and Balurghat.

3)Welfare of the destitute children and Cottage Scheme-

Meant for destitute children, imparting education through Voluntary Organisations.

*The Maintenance cost of Home inmates- increased to Rs.1250/- per month per head w.e.f. 2012-13.

*Repair & Renovation of Homes - 28 Govt. Homes running under this Department are in a deplorable, pathetic and dilapidated condition. The Department has taken necessary action for repair, renovation and improvement of infrastructure of these Homes.

*Creation of new posts in Homes -335 posts of different category as per the minimum need for betterment of services in Govt. Homes have been created in the year 2012-13 and directed

to be filled up within the 2nd quarter of 2013-14.

4) Adoption Programme-

Adoption – 17 NGOs are processing In-country and Inter-country adoption to the unwanted and unclaimed children.

5) Correctional services:

Since 2011-12 construction, repairing and renovation work of Training-cum-resource Centre in the office premises of the District Social Welfare Officer and other Homes in Purulia, Paschim Midnapur, Nadia and Balurghat.

6) State Commission for Protection of Child Rights

Has been set up in the year 2012-13

(Keeping with the preventions of National Commission for Women by protection of child rights 2005.)

7) The State Level Inspection Team Has been set up in the year 2012-13 in terms of Rules 63 of West Bengal Juvenile Justice (care and protection

of children) rules 2009 to visit Homes and oversee day to day function of the Homes.

8) Pipeline Projects

*In collaboration with the School Education Department taken initiative for spreading awareness regarding health, nutrition, hygiene etc. among adolescent girls in Schools.

*In collaboration with Health and Family Welfare Department has taken initiative to conduct regular health check up at the Anganwadi Centres and provide advice and medicine both for preventive and curable diseases among the children and pregnant and lactating mothers.

*Initiation of convergence programme on various issues with the School Education Department, Mass Education Department, Health and Family Welfare Department, P&RD Deptt. Home (Police) Department and Labour Department on various awareness and preventive issues among the children, adolescent girls and pregnant and lactating mothers.

*In collaboration with NIC, introduction of IT with e-Governance is being done in the Secretariat and Directorate.



Civil Defence Department has four distinctly separate organisation under It, namely:

- 1) Civil Defence,
- 2) Home Guards,
- West Bengal National Volunteer Force (WBNVF),
- 4) NCC.

Civil Defence

The West Bengal Civil Defence Organisation has been thoroughly revamped and has now the capability of handling any disaster / calamity, natural / manmade that may strike anywhere in Bengal.

 The Central Civil Defence Training Institute (CCDTI) at Kolkata has been upgraded.

- West Bengal is the first State to have moved from a Town-Centric to a District-Centric set-up, enabling the District Administration to immediately react to any disaster.
- Over 13,000 new Volunteers have been enrolled and given Basic Training all over West Bengal.
- 1550 Civil Defence Volunteers have been deputed to work as Auxiliary Fire Fighters.
- 19 Heavy Civil Defence Rescue Vehicles (CDRVs) and 25 Mini CDRVs with all the requisite Rescue Equipments and PPE&C Articles have been procured and one CDRV along with one Mini CDRV will be deputed to each District to enable every District to have a Quick Response Team to effectively respond to and tackle any disaster that may strike the District.
- Civil Defence Volunteers worked efficiently and effectively to mitigate the impact of disasters in the State. 20 Volunteers were awarded a Certificate and a cash reward of Rs.5000/- each by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal in recognition of their services during the fire at Surya Sen Market in Kolkata.

- gold medals in the G.V. Mavlankar Shooting Championship 2012.
- West Bengal NCC Cadets participated in the Republic Day Parade in New Delhi and West Bengal Air Force Cadet Bhupinder Singh was declared the best Air Force Cadet at the Republic Day Camp 2013.

Target for 2013-14

 Setting up of a NCC Nagar at WBNVF Campus at Kalyani to enable West Bengal NCC Directorate to hold NCC Camps round the year.





Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

1. The Government continued to receive investment proposals from various entrepreneurs taking the total investment proposals to more than Rs. 1,10,000 crores for proposed employment generation of more than 3 lakh persons. This includes investment in the State from SAIL, Indian Rlys., Burn Standard, Tractors India Ltd., HPCL, Matrix Fertilisers, Ambuja Cernent, ITC.

2. Director of Industries has already registered total number of 136 units during calendar year 2012 and during 2013 (upto 31st March, 2013) in the medium and large industries scheme with projected investment of Rs. 10,173.85 crores under West Bengal State Support for Industries Schemes. 2008. This includes majority of 35 projects which are registered as Mega Projects (Fixed capital investment of Rs.50 crores and above) under WBSSIS 2008). During the current financial year 2012-13, total investment of Rs 6641 cr. (Prov.) has been achieved, which includes investments compiled by this Department from various sources, as per the initial compilation made for the financial year 2012-13.

 The Department continued to pay ex-gratia to land-looser families of Singur during the current financial year and payments have been released upto March, 2013 for a sum of Rs. 10.49 cr. during 2012-13

4. In order to facilitate investment, the State has adopted Multi Pronged Approach, which included development of industrial estates by WBIDC and WBIIDC, recommendation for holding land beyond the ceiling prescribed under the law, extending incentives under the existing schemes, industrial cluster-based estates facilitating creation other infrastructure etc.

5. The department also continued to organize promotional activities through various events such as Bengal Leads, India International Trade Fair, Pragati Utsav, Maati Utsav, interactive sessions with the Chambers of Commerce at various fora etc. Mamata Banerjee, Hon'ble C.M. also held interactive session with leading industrialists of the country on 17-12-12 at New Delhi.

6. Bengal Leads 2013 was organized very successfully at Haldia, following Bengal Leads 2012 at Kolkata. The event, inaugurated by Mamata Banerjee, Hon'ble Chief Minister, West Bengal, was attended by leading industrialists. representatives of Chambers Industries. Commerce and representatives of various consulates, senior executives of the industry etc. The total number of 72 Stalls were set up. Besides, seminars were also held on important topics such as opportunities in Power sector, Food Processing

Industries, Petrochemicals, other infrastructure etc. which were attended by experts from the respective fields and various representatives of the trade and industries.

7. The Govt. of West Bengal has decided to dis-invest its share holding in a transparent manner through open competitive bids to an entity which is considered capable of revival of the unit. A Transaction Advisor has already been appointed after following required procedure. At the same time, State Govt. and Haldia Petrochemicals Ltd. have also taken up with Financial Institutions and sought their support in continuing efforts for revival of the company.

8. Approvals have already been issued for 7 (seven) new projects for holding land beyond the prescribed ceiling. Besides, the department has also recommended proposals for holding land beyond prescribed ceiling in case of other 14 proposals. The Department has also prescribed procedure for certain information to be submitted by entrepreneurs seeking land beyond the prescribed ceiling such as justification for the required quantum of land, reasons for choice of particular site etc. at the time of submission of the DPR itself for expeditious processing.

9. The Department has also started taking up allotment of land at various

industrial parks promoted by WBIDC and WBIIDC, as per the norms prescribed in the land policy issued by the Government of West Bengal. Accordingly, the information relating to the land, land availability indicating price etc. have been up loaded on the website of the concerned organizations and proposals for the land required for developing industrial projects are invited on continuous basis. Monthly allotments of land are being taken up by the concerned organisations. WBIDC and WBIIDC have already approved allotment /assignment/execution of lease deed of land to more than 40 units during financial year 2012-13.

10. The Department had also laid emphasis on early completion of cluster-based projects, namely, Foundry Cluster and Rubber Cluster Project by continuous review. Besides, proposals regarding new cluster based project namely, Gems and Jewellery Park is also in advance stage. Various steps are also being taken for early implementation of projects relating to Zari Park and Hosiery Park in Howrah.

Proposal regarding deep sea port near Rasulpur in the district of Purba Midnapore, is also under consideration of the State Govt. Necessary steps are being taken in this regard. Discussions have also been held for exploring the possibilities of proceeding further on Kulpi Minor Port Project.

11. During the financial year 2012-13, a sum of Rs. 26.24 crore approx. has been released for development and creation of infrastructure projects meant for promotion of exports. This included two new projects, namely, Tasar Silk Yarn and Fabric Production Centre, Tantipara, Birbhum and Universal Vegetable **Processing Centre for Tomato Powder in** Land Customs Jalpaiguri. Besides, Station at Phulbari on Indo Bangladesh Border has also started functioning during the financial year 2012-13. A number of proposals such as Solid Waste Management at Pineapple Development Centre and Floriculture project at Darjeeling are also under active consideration. A project developing medium to long term plan for creation of infrastructure for promoting exports in West Bengal in various thrust areas, such as leather, textiles and food processing, has also been initiated, with the active involvement of FIEO.

12. PNGRB has authorized GCGSCL, vide its approval dated 26th February, 2013, to lay, build, operate or expand city gas

distribution network in the city of Kolkata and parts of its adjacent districts, subject to certain conditions. It may be recalled that a MOU had been also signed amongst HPCL, GAIL Ltd.,GCGSCL on 17th November, 2011. Discussions are now being held with the proposed joint venture partners for working of details, based on the terms and conditions laid down by PNGRB in the Letter of Authorisation issued by PNGRB.

13. West Bengal Mineral Development and Trading Corporation Limited has continued to expand its activities through increased production at Trans Damodar Coal Mine Project at Barjora, Bankura and other mines such as Black Stone Mining Project at Panchami, Birbhum, Black Stone Mining Project at Hatgacha-Jethia in Birbhum, Blackstone Mining Project at Palsara-I in Purulia etc. As a result, Trans Damodar Coal Project achieved production of about 3,18,000 tonnes of coal. The Corporation has earned profit of Rs. 694.00 lakh (Prov.) during the financial year 2012-13, after incurring loss during preceding five





The main function of this Department is protection of interest of consumers.

State Commission and District Forum:

The total number of consumer cases disposed of during the period almost touches 10,000 (9,495). At the beginning of May, 2011 number of cases pending in State Commission and District Consumer Fora was 5,628 and during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013 10,440 cases have been filed.

- While 2,823 cases were disposed of during May,2011 to March, 2012 by all the district fora, this increased by more than 70% to 4,853 cases during April, 2012 to March,2013. For the State Commission, this increase in disposal amounts to 32% during the same period.
- The effectiveness of Consumer Awareness campaigns by the Department can be gauged from the fact that the number of Consumer cases filed in the District Fora have also gone up substantially from 3133 to 4634

during the period mentioned above.

Directorate of Legal Metrology:

 There has been an important amendment to the Legal Metrology (General) Rules, 2011 by the Union Government which now prescribes verification and stamping to be done bi-annually or at an interval of five years, instead annually earlier. Notwithstanding the amendment the Legal Metrology Directorate realised Rs.13,41,00,976/- from April, 2011 to March, 2012 and 12,14,71,650/from April, 2012 to March, 2013 as verification and compounding fees through conducting raids in new and unexplored areas.

 Four Secondary Standard Laboratories of Legal Metrology Directorate are being set up at Kankurgachi.

Directorate of Consumer Affairs & Fair Business Practices:

- The Directorate spread the message of Consumer Awareness and Protection by conducting hundreds of activities. While In the period May, 2011 to March, 2012, 13,320 activities like seminars, sit and draw competitions were held in the next year 2012-2013, 15,118 such activities were conducted throughout the state.
- Participations in different fairs and important festivals of all communities are being done throughout West

Bengal.

- Live-phone-in Programmes on consumer awareness regularly broadcast through F.M. Gyanbani Radio of All India Radio and "Kena Katar Sat Satero" telecast through Doordarshan.
- Consumer awareness messages are being spread through F.M Radio channels.
- Consumer Helpline was inaugurated by the Hon'ble M.I.C. on 24th December, 2011. The Toll-Free No. is 1800-345-2808.
 Since Inception, 9099 consumers availed counselling services through this Helpline upto March, 2013.
- For e-governance, modified and redesigned version of the Departmental Website www.wbconsumers.gov.in has been inaugurated. Consumers can now post their complaints / grievances online. Intra and inter Departmental communications are also being made through this web-portal.
- During the last two years, the Department has laid the infrastructure to ensure consumer awareness and protection through the Toll-free Help-Line, On-line registration of complaints and a more effective functioning of the Grievance Redressal Cell. The Department now has the capacity to redress a larger number of such complaints.



+ A special thrust has been given to the Co-operative Movement in the State in the last 2 years.

Membership / Borrowing Membership Coverage in Primary Agricultural credit Societies:

- +168002 nos. of new members have been enrolled and no. of borrowing members increased by 41125 during 2011-12.
- +Total no. of members and no. of borrowing members was 38.96 lakh and 21.53 lakh respectively at the end of 2011-12.
- ◆There has been increase in the strength of membership by 0.71 lakh and strength of borrowing members by 0.75 lakh upto 31-12-2012. Total no. of members and no. of borrowing members stood at 39.67 lakh and 22.28 lakh respectively as on 31.12.12.

Self Help Groups:

◆During 2011-12, an additional 7576 nos. of SHG has been formed raising the nos. of SHG in the Short Term Cooperative Credit Sector to 167266.

+5301 nos. of new SHGs have been formed during 2012-13 bringing the total no. to 172567 at the end of the period.

Business Diversification:

+422 Nos. of PACS started the Fertilizer business, 188 nos. of PACS started Seed business, 171 nos. of PACS started Marketing of Agril. Produce business during 2011-12.

+230 new PACS have taken up Fertilizer distribution, 68 new PACS have started seed trading, Rain water harvesting is being done by 21 societies, Vermicompost units have been established in 18 PACS during 2012-13.

+Overall,total expenditure under state plan increased from Rs.6288.17 lakh during 2011-12, to Rs.13088.76 lakh during 2012-13.



- ◆ To strengthen security of Correctional Homes X-Ray Baggage Scanners have been installed at DumDum C.C.H, Jalpaiguri C.C.H & Berhampore C.C.H in the financial year 2012-2013.

The famous danseuse with permission of proper authority visited Alipore Central Jail and decided to organise a stage performance of Tagore's Balmiki Pratibha with the inmates in various roles. The initiative was later made into a critically acclaimed movie, in which Nigel had the central role.



1. The new Government emphasised in the first Cabinet meeting to prioritise the system of disaster management and for this purpose brought three different Departments of Disaster Management, Fire and Emergency Services and Civil Defence under one Minister so that it becomes easy for him to effectively coordinate in crisis and ensure holistic disaster management. A direct outcome of this merger is running of the State Control Room in the Writers' Buildings 24x7 on all days of the year with staff from the Departments of Civil Defence and Disaster Management.

Achievements:

Allocation of funds for Ex-gratia Grant in natural Calamity, Economic Rehabilitation Grant, Construction of Rescue Shelters and Construction of Relief Stores was hiked considerably during last one year over previous years.

Earthqkuake Memorandum:

A Memorandum was sent to the Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt. of India, for getting fund from the National Disaster Response Fund in view of the earthquake, which occurred on 18th September in south Sikkim and caused major damages tod the hilly areas of the district of Darleeling.

Assistance to Sikkim after occurrence of Earthquake on 18.09.2011:

2000 food packets comprising cheera,

gur, bread/biscuit, match box, candles and small medicine kits were airdropped by Airforce helicopters.

AlLA: Provided House Building Grants (i) of Rs.88 crore in connection with AlLA, 2009 to the District Magistrate, South 24 Parganas and (ii) Rs.33 crore for making payments of all claims in respect of AlLA to the District Magistrate of North 24-Parganas.

House Building Grants: Provided house Building Grants of (i) Rs.20 crore

and Rs.5 crore respectively in connection with earthquake to the District Magistrates of Darjeeling and Jalpaiguri, (ii) Rs.4,62,500 in connection with subsidence in the coal mine areas to the District Magistrate, Burdwan and (iii) Rs.111.85 lakh to the District Magistrates of eight districts of Darjeeling, Birbhum, Purba Medinipur, Cooch Behar, Burdwan, Dakshin Dinajpur, Nadia and Purulia on account of fire.

Ex-gratia Grant:

(i) Man-made calamity-

AMRI: Provided Rs.273 lakh to 91 families of AMRI fire victims. The State Government also decided to offer Government job in either Group C or D category to one willing member of the unfortunate victims of AMRI fire incident. Proposals for employments have been received with recommendations from the District Magistrates of Burdwan, Hooghly and Director of Disaster Management from the valid application received from the family of 54 victims, 34 applicants have already given appointment.

Sainthia Rly. Accident:

The previous Govt. announced compensation but did not sanction fund. The present Govt. has sanctioned Rs.186 lakh to 62 families of Sainthia Rly. Accident victims.

Ganga Sagar Mela victims: Provided Rs.6 lakh to 3 families of Ganga Sagar Fair pilgrims who died by road accident during 2011-12 and Rs.1 lakh for one case of 2010-11.

Death of Indian Fisherman by Bangladeshi Pirates: Provided Rs.6 lakh to 3 families of 3 fishermen who were murdered by Bangladeshi pirates.

Illicit liquor consumption victims:

Sanctioned Rs.344 lakh for 172 families of Sangrampur to the District Magistrate, South 24-Parganas.

Ex-gratia due to accident - Rs.16 lakh was granted to the next-of-kin of 8 deceased died due to bus fall in Bhairab Banki river in Bankura, Rs.6 lakh to next-of-kin of 6 person died due to boat capsize in Ganges in Konnagar, Rs.15 lakh to families effected by riot at Nuliakhali in South 24-Parganas, Rs.42 lakh to the next-of-kin of 21 persons died to fire accident at Surya Sen Market, Rs.3 lakh to next-of-kin of 3 persons died in boat capsize in Japani Ghat in Uluberia, Rs.6 lakh to 12 property owners gutted by Fire Accident in Chowk Bazar in Darjeeling. (ii) Natural Calamity: Families of 245 persons died due to different natural calamities during 2012-13, Ex-gratia of Rs.492.52 lakhs was sanctioned. Families of 296 persons died of snake bite were also sanctioned Rs.294.70 lakhs, the families of 8 persons died due to a bus fall into river Bhairabi in Bankura Dist. were sanctioned Rs.16 lakh, families of 6 persons died due to boat capsize near Konnagar in the river Bhagirathi were sanctioned Rs.6 lakh; victims of arson in Nuliakhali in South 24-Parganas were sanctioned Rs.15 lakh, victims of conflagration at Surya Sen Market were sanctioned Rs.32 lakh for the families of 21 persons died in the incidents. Provided Rs.366.4 lakh for death due to natural calamities to 199 families and Rs.22 lakh to 11 families of earthquake victims,

Supply of relief clothings through MLA Quota: Supplied 1,75,200 dhuties, 87600 lungies, 262800 sarees, 65700 sets of children garments for both girls and boys, 73000 sets of salwars and kameezs, 175200 wrappers, 65700 sets of half-sleeve Punjabi and pyajamas and 147500 tarpaulin sheets to the District Magistrates for supply to the Hon'ble Members of West Bengal Legislative Assembly before the Id and Durga Puja festivals.

New Tendering and Checking of relief materials by third party: An expert committee comprising representatives from all related departments (GoWB & GOI) has been formed to determine the specifications of relief clothing. Third party checking of relief clothing has been successfully done by Indian Jute Industries Research Association (IJIRA). As a result the quality of relief clothing has been enhanced and has been widely appreciated.

Sanction from the State Disaster Response Fund: Rs.15903.16 lakh was sanctioned by the State Executive Committee from the State Disaster Response Fund to favour various Departments of the State Government emergency repair roads, embankments, school buildings, minor irrigation instalments, drinking water schemes, for supply of Input subsidy, fodder concentrate, purchase of Search & Rescue equipments, upgradation of disaster response network service of the PWD, etc. A sum of Rs.1142.15 lakh has been sanctioned for this fund in 2012-13 financial year.

B. Disaster Management sector -

* SMS based Early Warning System: Developed SMS based Early Warning system through the IT Deptt. For alerting the mobile users in the districts of the State of the advent of natural calamities like tropical cyclone, tsunami, earthquake, etc.

* Strengthening the capacity of Search and Rescue Teams:

(i) Rs.50.65 lakh was sanctioned to Commissioner, Kolkata Police and Rs.257.62 lakh to the Director General of Police, West Bengal, for procurement of Search and Rescue equipments from the SDRF and Rs.378.28 lakhs was sanctioned for the financial year 2012-13, (ii) Rs.26 lakh was sanctioned to the District Magistrate, North 24-Parganas as the cost of Search & Rescue equipments from 13th Finance Commission grant, (iii) Aquatic Disaster Management Training of 652 youth from the district of Cooch Behar, Murshidabad, Purba Medinipur, South & North 24-Parganas and Nadia was done by Rastriyo Life Saving Society from 13th finance Commission grant and (iv) Rs.24.85 lakh was sanctioned to Magistrates the District procurement of Micro Phone sets as part of early warning dissemination system from 13th Finance Commission grant.

C. Capacity Building Initiations -

- * Constructions of Multi-purpose Cyclone Shelter:
- * Prime Minister's National Relief fund (PMNRF): With fund from the Prime Minister's National Relief fund, National Disaster Management Authority engaged two central Government PSUs namely (i) engineering projects (India) Ltd. and (ii) Hindustan Steelworks construction Ltd. to construct 50 mulpurpose cyclone shelters @ 15 in coastal Blocks of South 24 Parganas and 20 in as coaster Blocks of Purba Medinipur, Construction work starred in 15 sites of all three districts in the first phase. Process is on to procure sophisticated equipment for cyclone shelter and to map it on GIS. Construction of 45 cyclone shelters is under progress (2012-13). It is expected that the work will be completed within 2013-14 financial year. The progress of 5 shelters may be delayed due to technical problems.
- * National Cyclone Risk Mitigation Project(NCRMP): 150 cyclone shelters are proposed to be constructed under World Bank assisted "NCRMP" in coaster districts. MHA has already given approval for the same. The total project cost is approximately Rs.550 crores. Soil testing and design consulting have started.
- * District Magistrates were provided fund for procurement of 50 computers for 50 Block Disaster Management Officers as preparatory step for introduction of on-line communication system in the Department.



The Government is making huge investments in the higher education sector, apart from bold policy changes, so that West Bengal / Kolkata can regain the mantle of being the country's intellectual capital. The watchwords of the State's new initiatives are Expansion (increasing the number of colleges and universities away from Kolkata), Equity (giving access to socially and economically backward sections of society) and Quality (nurturing a culture of excellence).

Achievements:

- •The West Bengal State Higher **Educational Institutions (Reservation** in Admission) Bill, 2013 has been passed by the West Bengal Legislative Assembly in March, 2013 with a view to provide reservation in respect of admission of the students belonging to Scheduled Caste (22%), the Scheduled Other Backward Tribe(6%) Classes(10% for Category 'A' and 7% for Category 'B') of citizens to State Higher Educational Institutions, established & maintained or aided by the West Bengal Government, to enable the students of socially and educationally backward classes to get access to higher education.
- Cooch Behar Panchanan Barma
 University: After the enactment of the
 Cooch Behar Panchanan Barma
 University Act, 2012, the notification for
 commencement of functioning of the

University has been issued. The Vice-Chancellor and other key officials have been appointed and the University will start P.G. Courses from academic year 2013-14.

- Kazi Nazrul University: After the enactment of the Kazi Nazrul University Act, 2012, the notification for commencement of functioning of the University at Asansol has been issued. The Vice-Chancellor and other key officials have been appointed and the University will start P.G. Courses from academic year 2013-14.
- Women's University at Diamond Harbour: The Diamond Harbour Women's University Act,2012 has been passed and the notification for commencement of functioning of the University has been issued. The process for appointing the First Vice Chancellor is on. Academic activity is expected to commence from academic year 2014-15. This will be the State and Eastern India's first Women's University.
- Administrative action has been initiated for setting up of 42 General Degree Colleges to be set up in

unserved/under-served areas of the State. These are:-

- Administrative action for setting up two new Govt. Engineering Colleges at Purulia and Cooch Behar has commenced. Land has been obtained and the Detailed Project Reports are being finalizaed.
- in the Jangalmahal area (in the

district Paschim Medinipur), construction of buildings in respect of setting up of three Govt. Colleges at Lalgarh, Salbani & Nayagram has been started in July,2012 and the work is expected to be completed within December, 2013. Rs.7 crore has been released so far. Academic activities will start from academic year 2014-15. Construction work of Girls' Wing in the **Jhargram** Raj College, **Paschim** Medinipur, has been started on 09.07.12. Completion of work is expected within December, 2013. Academic activities will start from academic year 2014-15.

- •66 new teaching posts and 38 non-teaching posts were created in the Government Colleges coming up at Salboni, Lalgarh, Nayagram and Girls' Wing at Jhargram Raj College.
- Policy on Establishment of Private
 Universities in West Bengal:
 Considering the growing need for quality facilities in the State's higher education system to cater to the growing number of students emerging out of the State's secondary school system, the State Government has

notified a Policy on Establishment of Private Universities to provide a stable institutional framework to encourage private investment in the higher education sector of the State, with an emphasis on the guiding principles of expansion, inclusion and quality. Several proposals have been received from prospective investors and are under process.

- The State's first private university, Techno India University, has been set up in August 2012 and it will start its academic activities from academic year 2013-14.
- The Govt. has published the revised Recruitment Rules in respect of Assistant Professors and Librarians in Govt. Aided Colleges. After a long gap, recruitment of teaching employees in the State's Government-aided Colleges has been resumed. West Bengal College Service Commission has started the recruitment exercise for filling up the posts of 1435 Assistant Professors, 20 Assistant Professors in B.Ed Colleges and 91 Librarians.
- •The West Bengal University Laws (Amendment) Act, 2011 has come into

force, streamlining the affairs of the State Aided Universities, including the selection of the Vice-Chancellor through a Search Committee.

- The West Bengal University Laws (Amendment) Act, 2012 has also come into force which provides, inter-alia, greater transparency and accountability in the administrative affairs of the University, including selection of Dean through a Committee.
- Presidency University (Amendment)
 Bill, 2013: An amendment to the
 Presidency University Act,2010 has
 been passed for making the University a
 Centre of Academic Excellence by
 giving it enhanced authority and
 delegation of powers for managing its
 affairs.
- West Bengal Govt. Merit-cum-Means Scholarship Scheme has been renamed as Swami Vivekananda West Bengal Govt. Merit-cum-Means Scholarship Scheme to commemorate 150th Birth Anniversary of Swamiji. During 2012-13, 39,294 meritorious students from economically weaker sections have been granted scholarships cumulating to Rs.24.64 crore.





Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

The School Education Department has taken up various important projects for the benefit of the students all over the state. Among the projects, most important are up-gradation of school to Higher Secondary level and providing teachers, and library grant, providing computers, printer and other accessories with faculty under ICT programme, completion of 34 Girls Hostels in the Jangal Mahal Area and supply of Ladies Bicycles to the girls students studying there. Construction of Model Schools in the economically backward blocks, construction of 105 no 50 beded hostels, 23 Nos new School Building with Hostels in the Jangal Mahal Area, 6 new School Building with Hostel in Riverine belt in Sundarban, 11 PTTI, 11 New School Building with Hostels in the 11 backward Districts under BRGF are also nearing completion.

- Up gradation of schools (High to Higher Secondary):- 903 Secondary schools have been upgraded to H.S. level.
- Construction of additional class rooms (Primary & Upper Primary) :- 39613 additional class rooms have been constructed.
- Construction of New School building (Primary /Upper Primary/SSK/MSK under SSA) :- Total no of New School buildings constructed is 2836 (Primary-165, Upper Primary-1003, SSK-1568, MSK-100)
- Construction of Toilets:- Total no of Boy's toilets constructed is 2570 and Girls' toilets constructed 6689.
- Supply of drinking water: Total no. of 873 tubewells have been sunk.
- Recruitment of Primary Teachers: During 2012-13, 3942 Primary teachers have been recruited and process for recruiting of another 34559 have been started.
- Recruitment of Secondary Teachers :-

During 2011-12, 10698 secondary teachers have been recruited and during 2012-13, process of recruiting 45618 secondary teachers have been started.

- Printing of Text Books: During 2011-12,
 7.03 crores text books and during 2012-13,
 7.46 crores text books have been printed and distributed free of cost among the students.
- ICT at schools (schools covered):- 2600 schools have been covered under ICT programme. These schools have been provided with computers, printers, projectors, broadband connectivity and instructor.

Fund allotted for Supply of Fire Extinguishers to 50878 Primary schools & 10717 Upper Primary Schools.

- Construction of Model Schools:-Construction work of 18 no. of Model Schools is going on. Out of 18, 4 no. of Schools, namely in Gopiballabhpur, Onda, Chhatna and Mejia have been completed and teachers are being appointed make the school functional from this year.
- Educational Infrastructure under Backward Region Grant Fund :- In 11 backward districts construction of 105 Girls' hostels, 23 New school buildings in LWE areas, 6 New school buildings in Riverine areas of south 24 parganas, 11 New school buildings & 11 PTTIs in 11 backward districts have been taken up under the project. Fund amounting to Rs. 194 crore has been placed with PW(CB) & HRBC for construction of total 156 projects (72 to be executed by PW (CB) and 84 by HRBC).
- Construction of 34 Girls' Hostels in LWE affected Blocks:- construction of 34 Girls' Hostel in 3 LWE affected districts (Paschim Medinipur-17, Bankura-9, Purulia-8) are in progress. 5 Hostels have been completed, and the rest will be completed in 2013.

Implementation of RTE Act:-To enforce RTE

Act, 2009 Right to Education Protection Authority (REPA) and the State Advisory Council have been constituted. Rules for RTE have also been published.

- Supply of Lady's Bicycle to Girl Students of Jangal Mahal Area :- 41, 111 bicycles were provided to girls students of Class IX to XII of Jungal Mahal areas. Necessary fund of Rs. 11.829 crores were provided to BCW Department for this purpose.
- Incentive to Poor Girl students:- Rs 9,10,13,000/- has been released to encourage /help poor girls students in 2012-13.

Recruitment Of Alchiki Santhali Para Teachers:-For smooth running of schools in jungal mahal area so far 884 para teachers have been recruited (for Paschim Medinipur 335, Bankura-265, Purulia-284)

• Mid-Day-Meal Programme :- Number of Primary students covered :- During 2011-12 7782132 primary students were covered (i.e. 87.31%) and during 2012-13, 7853781 (i.e.91%) primary students have been covered.

Number of Upper Primary students covered: During 2011-12 3845660 (82%) upper primary students were covered and during 2012-13, 4135827 (87%) upper primary students were covered.



1. Technical Education imparts

a. Technical Education at the Diploma level through Polytechnics through Directorate of Technical Education & Training (DTET). They also look after Non formal Vocational Training through Short Term Vocational Training (STVT) Programme They are supported by the West Bengal State Council For Technical Education (WBSCTE);

b. NVEQF is being implemented as a Pilot Project in 93 Schools of the State in collaboration with School Education Department

c. A training programme for Private Security Services was started at Jhalda, Purulia in association with Central Association for Private Security Industries. This is a one month residential training followed by 100% guaranteed employment through security agencies. 1338 trainees have successfully completed training on 'Security Services' in 5 batches.

Environment Department

Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

Department of Environment undertook several projects through its affiliated Institutes & Boards.

- The West Bengal Pollution Control Board (WBPCB) has beautified Rabindra Sarovar and installed a spectacular Musical Fountain in the Sarovar. Laser shows on various environmental themes are being conducted for the public.
- The Environment Department and the West Bengal Pollution Control Board (WBPCB) have taken up the task of remediation of some important water bodies by cleaning the invasive alien species, repairing the bund, making sitting arrangement, walking path etc. This scheme is being implemented through local bodies. So far 16 nos. of such projects have been implemented. The projects are (1) Beautification of Sethpukur Pond in Ward No. 26 of Barasat Municipality, 24 Parganas(N) (2) Renovation of pond in front of Y.S. PalparaVidyalaya, Palpara, Patashpur-I PurbaMedinipur Development of pond and pond-side land as Park at East DhangarparaRoad at Nagar, Barrackpore, Niranjan Beautification Parganas(N) (4) Waterbody in Ward No. 26, Naihati



 The West Bengal Pollution Control Board (WBPCB) is implementing a project on industrial pollution management with financial and technical assistance from the World Bank. Under this project remediation of Dhapa Municipal Solid Waste dumping site has been started. In subsequent stages 7 orphan hazardous dumpsites in Hooghly district will be taken up. Once remediated these areas will be available for civil use. Besides the above, this project helps in capacity building of West Bengal Pollution Control Board.

- Under Integrated Coastal Zone Management Project (ICZMP) which is being implemented by Institute of Environmental Studies & Wetland Management (IESWM) with the financial assistance from the World Bank considerable progress was made. Details of achievements under this particular project are given below:
- Work for total electrification of Sagar Island is going on. Already all Panchayat offices, Health centres and 600 house-holds have been connected with grid power.
- ◆ Sewerage system and Sewerage Treatment Plant (STP) construction in Digha is going on.
- Drainage system of Digha town is being constructed. Already, total length of 1700 meter drainage line has been constructed.
- ♦ 1200 house-holds have been benefitted through community contracting for afforestation programme in Nandigram&Khejuri area. well built microbiological AA laboratory has been developed at Calcutta University for cataloguing of microbes in Sundarbans which will be used for conservation as well as

business development.

- ♦ The marine aquarium at Digha is being modernized for increasing tourist attraction at Digha.
- ♦ A network of permanent sea level measurement stations is being developed in Sundarbans for studying impact of climate change.
- ♦ More than 1000 house-holds of disadvantaged sections of people have been benefitted through livelihood development programme.
- The West Bengal Pollution Control Board (WBPCB) has identified 31 industries which discharge their effluent to the river Ganga or its tributaries under National River Conservation Directorate Programme in West Bengal. Characteristics of effluent are regularly monitored to keep pollution level within permissible limit.
- An important scientific study is being undertaken by Institute of Environmental Studies and Wetland Management(IESWM) on monitoring the quality of waste water at different points of thenullah and the fish pond. This project is very important from ecological and health point of view as the feed and fish grownhere cater to the nutritional need of Kolkata. Thus the output of the study has tremendous practical importance. This five year project started in 2011.
- The Department has commissioned a study through The Energy & Resources Institute (TERI) to assess the vulnerability of coastal areas of West Bengal. The report has been submitted and is under review. A study titled, "Vulnerability of Kolkata Metropolitan Area to Increased Precipitation in a Changing Climate" has been completed. This is the first climate change vulnerability assessment of any city in India and fourth in Asia.







During the last two years focussed attention on preventive activity as well as introduction long awaited reforms in excise sector has yielded positive result. Thrust on transparency and e-governance has been welcomed and appreciated by the stakeholders. Rejuvenated administrative leadership has helped the excise organisation to perform optimally. The following paragraphs will show the performance of the Excise department.

•Achievement in collection of revenue: Collection of Excise Revenue was Rs.2101 crores in the financial year 2011-12 which was 18.1% over the last year's collection. In 2012-13 the excise revenue has been Rs. 2609 crores and it is 24.4% over the collection in 2012-13. Collection of excise revenue from May, 2011 to March, 2013 increased by 53.6%

in comparison to the revenue earned in the corresponding period of earlier financial years.

•Achievement in preventive activities: As a result of special thrust on the preventive activities and awareness campaign the number of arrest for excise offences, increased from 8540 to 9768, the quantity of seizure of illicit liquor also increased from 18,42,560 Litre to 21,07,688 litre, the quantity of seizure of foreign liquor increased from 51,910 Litre to 81,873 litre and the quantity of fermented seized also increased from 1,06,75,866 litre to 1,59,83,092 litre.

E-Governance:

- i) A website of the Excise department was launched;
- ii) The Excise directorate has been connected with the network of NIC System,
- iii) Computerisation of the process of grant of Import Pass for Bulk spirit, daily reporting of Preventive activities through departmental website,

monthly on-line revenue reporting module has also been introduced.

- v) Digitisation of information regarding excise licenses in West Bengal;
- **Provisions** Penal made more stringent: Necessary amendments have been made in the Bengal Excise Act, 1909 (Government Notification No. 1137-L, Dated 2nd August, 2012) to make the penal provisions more stringent. A new section (Section 46 AA) has been introduced in the said act to increase the punishment of the offenders involved in adulteration of liquor or any intoxicating drug which is likely to cause disability and death to the people (punishment increased to imprisonment for life, or imprisonment of either description for a term which may extend to ten years and fine). Barring a few, all the offences under the Bengal Excise Act were non-bailable. In addition, fine and imprisonment in various contravening sections of the Bengal Excise Act have also been increased.

- Issuing of Licenses for new Country Spirit Bottling Plants: In this period from May, 2011 to March, 2013, 5 (five) new licenses for establishment of country spirit bottling plants have been issued by the Department during this period. Establishment of these new bottling plants will increase the supply of bottled country spirit to cater the growing demand of such liquor.
- Reorganisation of Excise Administration: To curb excise crimes effectively and to maximise revenue potential decision of Reorganisation in Excise Administration has been come into effect from 1st November, 2012. The department was last reorganised in 1966. As a result of this Reorganisation:
- ♦Number of Excise Districts increases from 21 to 24 (This includes creation of Excise District, one in Kolkata , one in Alipurduar and one in Jhargram) + 2 Zones in North 24 Pgs (Each coterminous with concerned Police Commissionerate)
- ♦Number of Ranges has been increased from 65 to 87 (Each Range comprising of 2 or more Circles has the responsibility of supervising the activities of the Circles, prevention of excise crime and inspection of excise establishments under its jurisdiction. The jurisdiction of each Range which on the average extended to 2-4 Circles has been reduced in order to strengthen the preventive activities)

- ♦Number of Circles has been increased from 159 to 215 (Circle is the lowest administrative unit of Excise administration comprising of areas of 3-4 police stations, has the responsibility of prevention of excise related crime and collection of revenue. The jurisdiction of each Circle which on the average extended to 3-4 police stations has been reduced in order to strengthen the preventive activities.)
- ♦In addition to this number of Preventive Divisions increased from 3 to 8 (each consisting of average three districts)
- ♦To give effect to this reorganisation 462(four hundred sixty two) new posts of Excise Constable, 137(one hundred thirty seven) new posts of Assistant Sub-Inspector of Excise, (eighty-eight) new posts of Sub Inspectors of Excise, 33(thirty three) news posts in West Bengal Excise Service including 3 new posts of Additional Excise Commissioners 2(two) posts of Systems Analysts having degree in computer soft ware engineering have been created. In addition to this and 112 posts of sweeper and water carriers are created for the proposed new offices.

Pipe line Projects

• Recruitment of Excise Constable: In order to intensify the preventive activities further and to give effect to the re-organisation the Police Recruitment Board has been requested to initiate the process of recruitment of

- 1267 Excise Constable so that this recruitment will be completed within August, 2013.
- Recruitment of Assistant Sub Inspector of Excise: The Staff Selection Commission West Bengal has already been requested to start the process of recruitment of 246 Assistant Sub Inspector of Excise.
- Hologram and Bar Code based Liquor inventory management system - The key objective of the project is to track the production, distribution and sale of liquor in West Bengal, and monitor the inventories of liquor in distilleries, foreign liquor and country spirit manufactories, liquor warehouses and liquor retail outlets throughout the state. The objective would be achieved by affixing bar-coded holograms on liquor bottles, and ID linear barcodes on liquor cartons and Excise permits and passes. The barcodes would be scanned for information at various points of the liquor supply-chain in the state, and the information gathered upon such scanning would be made available to Excise authorities through web-enabled mechanism
- Project of digitisation of all Excise records: A project has been contemplated for digitisation of all excise records up to circle level for effective framing of policy and its implementation.





The new Government has endeavored to make the tax administration simple, responsive, transparent and citizen centric. The effort has been to incentivize self-compliance and extend the e-governance initiative to all sectors of tax administration. The services of the various directorates under the finance department have been made available [24 x 7] and the interface has been made totally electronic with a view to introduce efficiency, transparency and accountability.

The initiative has been widely appreciated by the users and the results are evident in augmented revenue.

Major decisions taken:

A. Finance Department

◆The Department has developed a central e-receipt portal known as Government Receipt portal System (GRIPS) for online and offline submission of all Tax, Non-Tax Revenue and other deposits. West Bengal is the second State in the country to introduce Central portal for receipt of Government Revenue.

♦With a plan to execute and monitor the activities of different Directorates, the Department has decided to install a Central Server which will be connected over intranet with all the offices under different Directorates. The work order has already been issued for providing connectivity under MPLS system.

♦Payment of salary to the State Government employees and employees of autonomous bodies through Electronic Clearing System (ECS) using COSA software.

♦Decentralization of DDO function from the Finance Department to all Administrative

(2) Construction of new Fire Stations:

The Deptt. has taken 10 (Ten) sites for construction of new fire stations in and around Kolkata in 2013-2014 in the backdrop of the recent fire accidents. These are at:-

- (1) Pragati Maidan(By the side of EM Bypass)
- (2) Khidderpore(Inside tram depot)
- (3) Tangra-II (Inside WBSIDC Industrial Estate)
- (4) Nonadanga(Right side of Ruby Nonadanga road)
- (5) Prince Anwar Shah Road (Near South City Mall)
- (6) Rajarhat(Newtown) [Near Axis mall]
- (7) Rajabazar(Inside GCGSC premises)
- (8) Baranagar(NearSinthee more)
- (9) Madhyamgram(On Badu road)
- (10) Bansdroni.

Out of these, foundation stone at (a) **PragatiMaidan** and (b) **Nonadanga** (c) **Rajarhat (New Town)** have already been laid. Construction work at these sites would commence within a couple of months.

This department has also decided to construct new Fire Stations in rural areas of West Bengal too at the following places:-

- 1) Kakdwip (South 24 Parganas)
- 2) Sonarpur (South 24 Parganas)
- 3) Mirik (Darjeeling)
- 4) Lalbagh (Murshidabad)
- 5) Bethuadahari (Nadia)
- 6) Dankuni (Hooghly)

- 8) Salugara (Darjeeling)
- 9) Sitalkuchi (Coochbehar)

Out of these locations, foundation stone at (a) **Dankuni**, (b) **Kakdwip** & (c) **Sonarpur** has already been laid. Construction work at the above mentioned sites would start within a short span of time.

On the whole, the department is now ready to construct approximately 26 to 28 nos. of Fire Stations in the Financial year 2013-2014, including the above mentioned 19 areas/locations, where we have already taken possession of the identified land or process for inter-departmental transfer is in its last phase.

At least *three existing fire stations* namely (a) Howrah Fire Station (b) Barrackpore Fire Station and (c) Dalkhola Fire Station have been decided to be *upgraded* based on the assessment of increasing population and urbanization of those localities.

(3) Providing adequate manpower: To provide all the fire stations with adequate

manpower, procedure for engaging 2000 (two thousand) Auxiliary Fire Personnel from Civil Defence Volunteers, 200 (two hundred) Auxiliary F.E.O.Ds from ex-servicemen (to be recruited from RajyaSainik Board) and 20 (twenty) Assistant Mobilising Officers (AMOs) from retired AMO of the Directorate have already started.

(4) (a) Construction of New Fire Stations (from May 2011 to March, 2013):-

During the last two years, construction of new fire stations was started in 18(eighteen) places, out of which work has been completed in 8 places and work is in progress in 10 other places.

- (6) Fire Safety Audit Committee: A Fire Safety Audit Committee has been working since 2012 to monitor whether the high rise buildings and public places are following the fire safety norms. The said committee has inspected around 40 hospitals and have identified deviations which they are suffering with respect to fire safety norms. The committee formulated fire safety guidelines for hospitals and nursing homes which have been widely circulated. Out of the 40 Hospitals inspected by the Committee, NOC has been issued to 23 Hospitals as they have completed all the necessary fire safety norms.
- (7) Co-ordination with other departments: Not only with the Disaster Management and Civil Defence departments, but also this department has been working keeping close contact with the Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC), the Municipal Affairs and Urban Development departments etc. by holding co-ordination meetings and frequently holds joint visits to ensure fire safety in the high rise buildings having various risk factors and the like.
- (8) Revision in the Acts and Rules: A committee has been constitued for revision of the existing West Bengal Fire Service Act,1950 and rules thereunder.Based on the suggestions given by the committee, changes in the act and rules is to be brought soon.



The contribution of Fisheries Sector towards SDP is second in agriculture sector. West Bengal produces 20% of fish production, 30% of inland fish production and 40% of fish seed production in the country. In order to achieve better fish in sustainable manner diversification of fish culture practices and introduction of new species of fish and shrimp as well as conservation of endangered species have given priority.

- ◆Development of Inland Fisheries and Aquaculture: 2417.96 hectare of inland water bodies, 156 units of cold water fisheries in hill areas, 8 units of ornamental fisheries and 1 unit of fish seed hatchery have been developed with financial achievement of Rs. 437.20 lakh.
- ◆Development of Social Fisheries: To supplement stock as well as to restore the breeding ground of indigenous carps and endangered fish species in natural water bodies; 2.82 lakh of fingerlings were released in 11 riverine sites of 7 districts under river ranching programme with financial involvement of Rs.18.70 lakh. Liberation of 9 lakh fingerlings in the big water bodies is in progress.
- ◆Economic Upliftment of Tribal People: Renovation of water bodies with infrastructural facilities and composite fish culture are being executed in the tribal areas of different districts. So far

466 nos. of beneficiaries covered with financial achievement of Rs. 111.09 lakh. Schematic works for another 276 nos of beneficiaries are in progress.

◆EWS Housing Scheme Amar Bari/Gitanjali: To provide housing facilities for the economically weaker section of beneficiaries an amount of Rs. 330.00 lakh has been sanctioned for 250 nos of houses – "Amarbari" which is under process. Another 5722 nos of houses- "Gitanjali" have been sanctioned.

◆National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB) sponsored schemes:

•In order to enhance fish production, diversification of fish species i.e. culture of pungus has been started. Two farmers have been assisted under NFDB scheme with financial involvement of Rs. 0.53 lakh another 12 units have been assisted during 2012-13 with the financial involvement Rs. 19.17 lakh.

•For the development of ornamental fish farming through SHG Rs. 0.50 lakh has been utilized for two Women SHG in Murshidabad district. Another few SHGs have been covered under this scheme with the financial involvement Rs. 26.62 lakh during 2012-13.

◆Measures taken for Coastal Security & Security of Marine Fishermen:

- •Biometric I. Card to Marine Fishers: In order to ensure safety and welfare of fishermen, the work of issuance of biometric identity cards to 2.56 lakh fishermen living in coastal areas has been taken and 1.44 lakh cards is being distributed.
- •Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT): For safety of fishermen at sea, 1000 nos (500 nos in Contai sector & 500 nos in Diamond Harbour sector) of Distress Alert Transmitter (DAT) have been

distributed among the marine fishermen who are engaged in fishing in sea.

Online Registration of Fishing Vessels: With support from Government of India, the process of e-registration of fishing vessels has been started by the Fisheries Department in the coastal districts of West Bengal. Out of a target of 9283 the certificate for e-registration of 8914 is ready and 50% is distributed.

◆Development of e-governance in Fisheries sector: To aware the Government decisions in a transparent manner with relevant rules and regulations; e - Governance programme has been started under the supervision of Project Manager, Fisheries Mapping Project Office at http://eservices-wbfisheries.gov.in

◆E- tendering: The process of etendering system has completed.

◆Fisheries Mapping Project: The central sector scheme was taken during the 11th plan period and continued upto 12th plan period. Progress of work as follows:

*Image Processing and generation of maps completed in 328 Block

- *Attribute data collection for GIS development completed in 143 Blocks
- * GIS development completed in 4 Distrits.

The major activities of Food & Supplies Department relate to procurement of foodgrains, creation and maintenance of storage facilities, distribution of foodgrains to the eligible beneficiaries and overall smooth running of the PDS system in the State.

A. Performance and significant achievements.

1. Procurement: -

I] The procurement of rice which stood at 9.4 LMT as against a target of 17.6 LMT in 2005 has reached to 20.5 LMT as against a target of 20 LMT during 2011-12. Procurement of rice in KMS 2012-13 has already crossed 11 lakh MT as of 10th April, 2013 against the tentative target of 22 lakh MT.

ii] No distress sale of paddy has been reported and middlemen have been eliminated through direct purchase of paddy from farmers at MSP and ensuring payment to them through A/c Payee Cheque at the time of purchase for which opening of "zero balance" account has been arranged. Farmers have been sensitized by mass awareness campaigns through TV, Radio, Print media and organising camps etc. 7625 Paddy Purchase Camps have been organised in KMS 2012-13 so far

iii] Legal action has been initiated against delinquent 5 rice mills for failing to deliver their procurement obligations during 2011-12. Farmers deprived of their due sale proceeds were compensated for by a generous aid from C.M's relief fund.

2. PDS and special package of PDS to deserving families:

i] PDS is smoothly running to cover 2,00,20,068 BPL, 6,53,80,187 APL, 73,00,948 AAY and 56,883 Annapurna beneficiaries in the State, totalling 9,27,58,086.

ii] 19,70789 no. of beneficiaries of Jungle Mahal areas of Paschim Medinipore, Bankura and Purulia whose income is below Rs. 36,000/- per year all tribal families are getting 2 Kg rice @ Rs 2/ per kg per week.

iii] Around 3,24,688 families in Aila – affected areas and families of 3569 farmers of Singur who were unwilling to receive cheques for losing their land are getting 16 Kgs. Rice per month @ Rs. 2.00 per Kg. in addition to their normal monthly entitlement.

iv] AAY coverage has been extended to 33026 HIV persons, Leprosy afflicted patients, orphans and destitute.

v] 1201 homeless families in Kolkata are getting AAY rice and wheat at the scale of 1 Kg and 750 gms, respectively per adult unit per week at a price of Rs. 2/per Kg. and Rs. 3/- per Kg.

vi] Under Special Hill PDS scheme, total entitlement of foodgrains has been enhanced from 1750 gms. to 3300 gms. per AU/week for 11,28,613 beneficiaries of hill areas of Darjeeling district.

vii] 49 additional outlets have been opened in Jungal Mahal areas for easy

availability of ration to the rural poor in the area.

3. Augmentation in storage capacity:Prior to May, 2011, functional capacity
of food storage godowns (Govt.
godown) was 40,000 MT. During this
period it has been augmented to 65000
MT. The Department has added godown
capacity at Cossipore GFD, Shalimar
GFD, Kharmatala GFD, Pandua, Bankura,
Ramjibanpur & Balichak.

4. Reforms in PDS:-

i] To contain diversion of foodgrains in transit, doorstep delivery to the F.P.S dealers' at their shops has been ensured in all areas except riverine and hill areas.
ii] Digitization of PDS related information relating to dealers, distributors, godowns, F & S offices in the districts has been completed and hosted on our Departmental website http://www.wbfood.gov.in.

iii] The Department is ready for hosting

Transparency Portal from which SMS alerts will be triggered about the arrival and delivery of foodgrains covering more than 17,000 F.P. shops to more than 2.5 lakh registered mobile users.

iv] Public redressal mechanism has been strengthened through installation of a toll free number 1800-345-5505.

B. Schemes in the pipeline

- Storage godown capacity build-up for 2.30 Lakh MT (1.75 + 1.45) under RIDF-XVII and XVIII tranches, is under implementation.
- 2. Under Private Entrepreneurship Guarantee Scheme, construction activity is ongoing for 30,000 MT of godown while tenders have been floated for 3.23 Lakh MT capacity.
- Completion of storage godown presently under construction at Bolpur, Bankura, Shalimar GFD for a capacity of

8000 M.T.

- 4. A full-fledged call centre with mechanism of on line interaction with the consumers for grievance redressal on 12x7 hrs. basis is under implementation.
- 5. New PDS control orders, for both urban and rural areas, in keeping with the changing dynamics of PDS in the State, are ready for notification.
- 6. Modernized Quality Control Laboratory in Kolkata and at Zonal offices at Burdwan, Krishnanagar, & Siliguri will be set up.
- 7. Proposals are being finalized for computerized office rooms at 57 Government godowns with set up of QC Laboratory by accessing RKVY Fund.





The commitment of this Department in the current years was upon maximizing the utilization of the limited resources by giving emphasis on making the most of central and state funds, regular meeting of the empowered committees, monitoring the work at field level by Directorate as well as Departmental officers, easing bottlenecks in implementation and parallel stress on building peoples' potential by giving financial. infrastructural. insurance support. These resulted in increased utilization of plan fund from Rs 44.4 Cr in 2011-12 to Rs 72.3 Cr in 2012-13 along with covered increasing areas under cultivation, vermicompost, offering land in food park etc.

Directorate of Food Processing Industries

- 1. National Mission on Food Processing launched with effect from 1.4.2012. The organizational set-up has been activated at all the levels and wide publicity given regarding various components of the Mission.
- 1.1 The Directorate organized three state level and four district level seminars, participated by national level Research & Development Institutions such as CFTRI, CIPHET, NRDC etc. Besides, interactions with the Chambers of Commerce held from time to time.
- 1.2 Comprehensive Survey on Potentials of Food Processing Industry in West Bengal finalized and placed on the Website of the Department. Also, a Help Desk set up in the Department to guide willing entrepreneurs.

- 1.3 The Directorate utilized earmarked funds of 1st Instalment by the Government of India and became the only State in India to receive the 2nd Instalment under NMFP during F.Y. 2012-13.
- 1.4 Proposals sanctioned under NMFP: 17 EDP (Entrepreneurship Dev. Programme), 05 FPTC (Food Processing Training Centre), support to 02 Colleges for diploma courses, setting up of 07 Industries, 01 Blood Rendering Plant under abattoir, 04 seminars etc.
- 1.5 West Bengal also obtained approvals for new components for assistance under NMFP from Government of India, such as Mini-Food Parks, Cluster Development Programmes. Implementation under process.
- 2. With comprehensive follow-up, it has been possible to make the Food Parks at Malda and Jangipur functional. A number of units have already started production or land development / civil construction at Malda Food Park. Allotments have also been approved at Jangipur Food Park.
- 3. Comprehensive follow up of projects under RIDF, like Cold Storage by Taki Municipality etc., have ensured that their execution have started again.

Directorate of Horticulture

- Comprehensive review of projects under RKVY done and work initiated on new RKVY projects from available resources for optimum utilization of funds emphasizing on close monitoring of previous projects for speedy execution. Construction of Technology Dissemination Centre Projects at Hooghly, Murshidabad, Malda and Post Harvest Dissemination Centre at Narendrapur Ramakrishna Mission was initiated.
- 2. Emphasis laid on evaluation of

previous year plans and formulation of plans based on demand potentials under NHM, NVIUC etc.

- 3. Emphasis given for regular sanctions, at State Level, by holding regular State Level Executive Committee meetings of National Horticulture Mission resulting in sanction of Rs 11.85 Cr. for projects against the target of Rs 8.42Cr.
- 4. Some of the physical achievements in 2012-13: 03 Multi-chamber Cold Storages, 02 market infrastructures, 127700 sq. m. poly-houses, 212400 sq. m. shade nets, 1490 vermicompost pits, 20 ponds excavation, distribution of 10 tractors, 265 power tillers, 38 motorized vending carts etc. The performance in same items in previous year (2011-12) was 02 Multi-chamber Cold Storages, 03 market infrastructures, 134100 sq. m. poly-houses, 19400 sq. m. shade nets, 98120 vermicompost pits, 31 ponds excavation, 5 power tillers etc.
- 5. Targeted intervention for increase of production and productivity in select crops,like, Mango Rejuvenation (90 Mango trees) and Protected Cultivation of Chilli (10000 sq.m.) were taken up in 2012-13.
- 6. Crop Insurance extended to 12 crops and to Loanee and Non-Loanee farmers for the first time in West Bengal, with active involvement of Bankers and Insurance Companies. 2681 farmers in Kharif and 3897 farmers in Rabi covered (provisional) in 2012-13.
- Efforts to increase market linkage of farmers continued by earmarking space for sale of vegetables by Farmer Organizations in different markets of Kolkata.
- 8. 05 Farmer Producer Organizations registered and 639 Farmer Interest Groups formed in 2012-13 to continue linkages of farmers with markets, reducing role of intermediaries.
- 9. A survey on potentiality of

Micro-irrigation done in Puncha Block of Purulia District. 102.37 ha (2011-12) and 25.00 ha (2012-13) covered under micro irrigation under National Mission on Micro Irrigation.

Directorate of Cinchona & Other Medicinal Plants

- 1. The officers and staff of Directorate of Cinchona placed on deputation with Gorkha Territorial Administration, pursuant to the State Government decision.
- RKVY project for increased production of cymbidium orchids, pineapple and mandarin oranges continued. Inputs for orchids distributed to 300 beneficiaries whereas 300 acres covered under mandarin orange and 24 acres under pineapple.
- 3. Efforts made to dispose the huge stock of cinchona through transparent process of bidding, in a phased manner; 400 MT has been sold through the Bidding Process under the supervision of the State Level Tender Committee.
- 4. An educational film was developed on the Orchids in the District of Darjeeling, for the first time, for use by the Directorate of Cinchona.

West Bengal State Food Processing & Horticulture Development Corporation Ltd.

1. WBSFPHDCL made a turnover of Rs 12.50 Cr in 2011-12 and Rs 13.10 Cr in

2012-13 with net profit (unaudited) of Rs 0.31Cr and Rs 0.32 Cr respectively.

2. Tissue Culture Laboratory at Ayeshpur, Nadia, a joint venture project is scheduled to be functional by June 2013, resulting in immense benefits to farmers with availability of quality inputs at reasonable prices. Protocol development for seven plants, namely, banana, ipecac, potato, cucumber, tomato, orange, large cardamom is complete, under the same project.

Awareness & Extension Activities

1. To increase coverage of farmers and optimum utilization of infrastructure and resources, a joint collaborative Agri-Horti Food Fest 2013 was organized by this Department, wherein extension activities of Agriculture Department, Directorate of Horticulture through its various Missions, Directorate of Food Processing Industries through NMFP were promoted through various Seminars, **Publicity** Materials. one-to-one interaction of farmers and entrepreneurs etc. over a period of 4 days, in collaboration with Indian Chamber of Commerce.


Beside this, fairs were organized at Block, Subdivisional and District levels also for the first time, which culminated at State Level.

2. The Department also organised extension activities at Pragati Utsav, Bengal Leads 2013, Maati Utsav,

Pineapple festival in North Bengal and other State Level events.

Upcoming Projects:

- Major efforts to continue to ensure optimum utilization of available resources
- Directorate of Horticulture to make Subdivisional offices operational during FY 2013-14, with appointment of Assistant Directors of Horticulture, for better coverage of extension activities.
- Targetted focus on select crops to continue, particularly on increased coverage of area under Khariff Onions
- 4. Increased use of Departmental Website for interface with beneficiaries under NMFP through online receipt of applications, transparency in proposals received, sanctioned and funds disbursed etc.
- 5. Engage selected Chambers of Commerce as Resource Partners for increased interface between Research Institutions and Entrepreneurs, as a Pilot Project.
- Provide updated Project Profiles for entrepreneurs in the Tiny and Small Scale Sector in Food Processing Industries.
- 7. Promote Mini Food Parks, Cluster Development Centres for providing better infrastructure.





In spite of only 13% of state's land recorded as forest, a large portion of forest and tree cover is attributed to people's participation in Social Forestry and involvement of Joint Forest Management Committees. The strategy for conserving our rich biodiversity is through protection of six national parks, fourteen sanctuaries, two Tiger Reserves, one biosphere reserves, and identified wetlands and coastal areas.

- The Directorate of Forests and its subordinate offices were brought under treasury system with effect from 1st April, 2012 and LOC system was introduced with effect from 1st July 2012 for better financial management.
- Timber auction with gross sale value of Rs 120.91 Cr has been conducted for 2011-12 and Rs 134.40 Crores for 2012-13. Usufruct shares given to the Forest Protection Committees for the corresponding periods are Rs 17.133 Crores and Rs 28.20 Crores respectively.

- West Bengal Forest Development Corporation Ltd. (WBFDCL) has procured honey from Sundarbans and sold them under the brand name MOUBAN. Initiative has been taken to promote citronella, turmeric and various medicinal plants. The NTFP division has taken up citronella plantation. It has also launched 17 new products during the period.
- WBFDCL now runs its eco-tourism activities at 20 resorts: 17 in North Bengal & 3 in South Bengal with a total capacity of 380 beds. It has taken over management of 15 eco-resorts of the Forest Directorate. The approx. Gross revenue earned by the Forest Dept from eco-tourism is Rs 3.19 Crores and 3.35 Crores for 2011-12 and 2012-13 respectively.
- West Bengal Wasteland Development Corporation Ltd. established in 1989 was almost non-functional in the past, has been activated recently. During 2012-13 it has undertaken afforestation scheme on wastelands belonging to poor farmers in the districts of Purulia, Bankura and Birbhum of nearly 1260 ha. The Corporation is also involved managing 15 parks of the Forest Directorate.
- The Japan International Cooperation Agency (JICA) sponsored West Bengal Forestry and Bio-diversity Conservation Project, for a total amount of Rs.406 crores which will be spent in 8 years. The West Bengal Forest and Biodiversity Conservation Society has been registered for the purpose of

- implementation of the project, as required under the agreement. An amount of Rs 1.35 Crores has initially been placed in 2012-13 to set up initial activities.
- A major eco-tourism development activity was taken up in Darjeeling and Kalimpong areas through the participation of Lamahata Forest Protection Committee. The project has been completed.
- Old Takda Club in Darjeeling, established in 1910 was taken over possession by the Forest Department and the same has been converted into a eco-tourism resort.





We had inherited a weak healthcare system with an acute shortage of physical infrastructure, machinery and equipments, technical manpower and other facilities. It was therefore an extremely difficult task to remedy the situation, but with active support and cooperation of all concerned, we have been able to achieve significant progress within a reasonably short span of time. Our intention is to proceed in a well-planned and graduated manner to address the difficulties, overcome the hindrances in the Health Sector and ensure availability of quality health care services across the length and breadth of the State.

1. Mother and Child Care:

(a) Sick New-Born Care Units (SNCUs) have been increased from 6 in 2010-11 to 34 In 2012-13. The department is considering establishment of another 16 new SNCUs in the year 2013-14.

(b) 127 Sick New Born Stabilization Units (SNSU) were established from NIL 2010-11. The department is considering establishment of another 173 new SNSUs in the year 2013-14.

(c) Sanction orders have been issued for establishment of 11 Mother and Child care Hubs (MCH) in 2012-13. Orders for 2 more will be issued in 2013-14.

(d) 10 (vr 2011-12) and 12 (vr 2012-13) Nutritional Rehab centres (NRC) were established in vulnerable districts to take care of acute malnourished children. The deptt. is considering establishment of another 13 new NRCs in the year 2013-14.

2. Capacity increase for Doctors:

(a) 395 (yr 2011-12) and 150 ((yr 2012-13) UG seats were created (current strength: 1900)

(b) 63 (yr 2011-12) and 44 ((yr 2012-13) PG seats were created (current strength:

(c) 60 (yr 2011-12) and 23 ((yr 2012-13) Post-doc seats were created (current strenath: 114)

3. Use of Technology:

(a) One web based 'Store Management Information System' software was developed and installed in procurement of drugs and equipments and robust inventory management at all Medical Colleges and District Reserve stores.

(b) E-Procurement has also been introduced for high-value contracts (yr 2012-13).

(c) The 'Biometric attendance' has been Introduced at Swasthya Bhaban (yr 6. Reduction of out-of-pocket

2011-12), and at all 9 Medical Colleges & 5 District Hospitals (vr 2012-13), Rest of DHs will be covered in yr 2013-14.

(d) E-counseling techniques were adopted for admission in medical colleges.

4. Fair Price Shops:

(a) 33 (vr 2012-13) Fair Price Medicine Shops were established across the State in PPP mode at MCH and DH, for offering 142 life saving drugs at discounted prices (48 to 67% of MRP). More than 7.5 lakhs patient parties have availed this service so far and gross sales have crossed Rs.22.85 cr. with discount of more than 13.89 cr.

(b) 52 more shops at selected SDH/SGH will be established in yr 2013-14.

5. Fair price diagnostic centres providing High end diagnostic services like digital X-Ray, CT scan and MRI services, dialysis etc. are being established through a PPP mode at 52 different govt. hospitals (all MCHs, DHs and selected SDH/SGHs) to offer services at discounted rates along the lines of fair price medicine shops in the year 2013-14.

3 CT scan, 1 MRI, 7 pathology labs were already set up in PPP mode during 2012-13.

expenditure:

Fund for Drug purchase was substantially increased i.e. almost double in yr 2012-13 (Budget: Rs. 284.79 Cr. & Expenditure: Rs.262.72 Cr.) against fund in yr 2011-12 (Budget: Rs 153.39 Cr. & Expenditure: 139.18 Cr.) to ensure free supply of essential medicine at govt. hospitals to reduce the out-of-pocket expenditure.

7. RSBY:

- (a) 'Rastriya Swasthya Bima Yojojan' programme was launched at 1 (yr 2011-12) and 13 (yr 2012-13) govt. hospital in collaboration the Labour deptt.
- (b) Such schemes will be launched at another 20 govt. hospitals in yr 2013-14. The Nodal administrative deptt will be migrated from labour deptt to Health & FW Deptt for this scheme in yr 2013-14.

8. Mobile medical units:

- (a) Free treatment, investigation and drugs services through 37 Mobile Medical Units in remote areas like Jangalmahal, Sunderbans, Tea-garden are being provided through tie-up with NGOs. Mobile Boat Dispensaries are being used to reach the riverine villages.
- (b) NGO was engaged to provide Tertiary eye care in the LWE affected Blocks.
- Engagement of Health personnel:
 (a) In Yr 2011-12, 1063 Medical Officers,
- 37 specialists, 770 nurses, were engaged at different hospitals & sub-centres.

- (b) In Yr 2012-13, 534 Medical Officers, 172 specialists, 83 Public health officers, 660 AYUSH doctors, 983 nurses, 12 nurse practitioners were engaged at different hospitals and administrative units
- (c) In yr 2012-13, 209 Medical Officers have been re-employed to meet-up the crisis.
- (d) 317 (yr 2011-12) and 695 (yr 2012-13) Medical teachers of different disciplines were engaged at different medical colleges.
- (e) To expedite the process of recruitment for health personnel, the Govt. of WB has created 'West Bengal Health Recruitment Board' in 2012-13. The Chairman and members have already been appointed.

10. Enhancement of beds & Specialty services:

- (a) 5289 (yr 2011-12) and 3507 (yr 2012-13) **hospital beds** were created (current strength: 59,176)
- (b) 34 Multi Specialty and Super Specialty Hospitals are being constructed in the far-flung areas of 11 districts of the State to ensure that advanced medical facilities. In phase I, 'consultants' were engaged for 13 such projects in yr 2012-13.

11. Upgradation of Rural health services:

- (a) 72 (yr 2011-12) and 108 (yr 2012-13) non-bedded PHC were upgraded to 10 bedded PHC.
- (b) 68 (yr 2011-12) and 76 (yr 2012-13)

- BPHC were upgraded to Rural Hospitals.
- (c) 7 New additional 'Health Districts' were created for better supervision and management of health services in yr 2012-13.
- (d) 6 SD Hospitals and 1 Rural Hospital are being upgraded to District Hospital in yr 2012-13.

12. New initiative in Medical Education:

For the first time, one new course named Fellowship in Family Medicine under WBUHS in collaboration with Royal College of General Practitioners, UK will commence in 2013-14.

13. Referral Transport Schemes:

477 (yr 2011-12) and 448 (yr 2012-13) **Nischaya Yan** for free referral transport facilities through network of PPP were empanelled. Empanelment of more vans under such schemes is in progress.

14. Hospital Services:

- (a) OPD attendance was 960 lakh (yr 2010), 1053 lakh (yr 2011) and 1154 lakh (yr 2012).
- (b) IPD admission was 40 lakh (yr 2010), 43 lakh (yr 2011) and 45 lakh (yr 2012).
- (c) Lab tests performed were 98 lakh (yr 2010), 134 lakh (yr 2011) and 182 lakh (yr 2012).
- (d) X-Ray & USG test performed were 17 lakh (yr 2010), 20 lakh (yr 2011) and 23 lakh (yr 2012)





Peace in the hill areas of Darjeeling district has been restored. Numbers of tourists in this area have been increasing day by day and the Tourism Industry of Darjeeling has been rejuvenated.

The Gorkhaland Territorial Administration Act, 2011 has come into force with effect from 15.03.2012 and the election to the Gorkhaland Territorial Administration Sabha has been held on 29th July, 2012 and Gorkhaland Territorial Administration Sabha (GTA) has been formed with effect from 4th August, 2012.

Status to the Chief Executive, Deputy Chief Executive, Chairman, Deputy Chairman and the Executive Members of GTA has been determined.

Almost all the Departments have already issued Notifications regarding transfer of their offices & establishments to GTA in consultation with the Committee of Secretaries.

Additional Central Assistance of Rs. 65 crore has been allotted during 2012 – 2013 to Gorkhaland Territorial Administration for this purpose.

An amount of Rs.63.69 crore under Plan Sector and Rs.244.18 crore under Non-Plan sector have been sanctioned to GTA during the financial year 2011-2012. An amount of Rs. 194.11 crore under Plan Sector and Rs. 351.28 crore under Non-Plan Sector have been allotted during the financial year 2012 -2013 under different sectors for development of hill areas of Darjeeling. Various schemes under communication, education, rural electrification, Irrigation & Waterways, fisheries, sports & youth welfare, tourism, health & family welfare, minor irrigation, public health engineering sector etc. have been undertaken with the fund allotted to Gorkhaland Territorial Administration under State Plan.

Major schemes like the construction of new roads connecting villages with block, sub-divisional and district head quarters, upgradation of major roads in different municipalities, construction and repair of school buildings, rural electrification, construction improvement of community halls, river bank and jhora protection works, improvement of water supply in rural as well as urban areas, improvement of district hospitals and primary health centres, improvement of Mirik Lake, renovation and improvement different tourist lodges etc. under Gorkhaland Territorial Administration area have been taken up for execution under Special Central Assistance Sector. Under RIDF different schemes like construction of Rural Roads, Minor Irrigation, Social Sector projects like construction of new school buildings and reconstruction of old school buildings, construction of bridge etc. are being implemented.



The overall law and order situation during the period under report has been totally under control. The Government emphasized upon making the criminals with unauthorized arms inactive and a sizeable number of illegal arms, ammunitions and bombs have been seized. The festive season in 2011 & 2012 covering Id, Durgapuja, Id-ud-Zoha, Kalipuja, Diwali and other major festivals were handled very efficiently and passed without any major incident.

West Bengal Police Directorate:

·Overall situation has significantly improved in the Left Wing Extremist (LWE) areas consisting of Paschim Medinipur (including Jhargram Police District), Bankura and Purulia districts after the new Government took over in May 2011. 33 LWE leaders / activists have surrendered before the administration and some of these lethal people also surrendered weapons. The new Government has started steps to solve the root cause of such violence by introducing political activity, proper development-work including employment and means of earning for the local poor tribal population. Apart from the various development projects / programmes, 10,700 local youths from affected areas have been recruited as Junior Constables / NVF / HGs which has resulted in confidence building of the local poor people on the Government and the administrative machinery.

•A long pending issue in hills of Darjeeling has been resolved through the initiatives taken by this Government by signing a tripartite agreement followed by creation of Gorkha Territorial Administration (GTA) after holding of elections. Law & Order situation of hills of Darjeeling is now peaceful and numbers of tourists, both national and international, have increased manifold this year in comparison to previous years.

•Five new Commissionerates of Police namely, Asansol-Durgapur, Howrah, Bidhannagar, Barrackpore and Siliguri have been set up. To streamline the vehicular movement and good traffic management, Government has accorded sanction of 5000 Civic Police **Volunteers** these Commissionerates.Five cyber crime Polce Stations, in each of these Commissionerates have been created.

 Permission has also been accorded for enrolment to another 1,38, 421 posts of civic police in WBP Dte.

•05(five) New Police Stations namely, Belur, Nischinda, Dasnagar, Saktipur and Santragachi have been established by trifurcating the existing Bally Police Station and Jagachia Police Station under Howrah Police Commissionerate.

•10 Women Police Stations at Sub-Divisional Head Quarters have been set up with the creation of 550(five hundred fifty) posts in different categories. 10 more Women Police Stations will be set up during 2013-14.

•District Missing Person Bureau (DMPB) in every Police District Including GRP Districts have already been set up with the creation of 207(two hundred seven) posts in different categories for this purpose.

An additional 750(seven hundred fifty) posts in different categories have been created for the 18 District Armed Police units in the State. Also, 219(two hundred nineteen) posts in different categories have been created for 6 districts namely Howrah, Burdwan, Paschim Medinipur, Murshidabad, Uttar

Dinajpur and Jalpaiguri. Additional 668(six hundred sixty eight) posts in different categories have been created for augmentation of Jhargram Police District.

•Approval for filling up of 3000 posts of Lady Constables out of 6000 created Posts of Lady Constable in West Bengal Police have been accorded. Permission has also been accorded in March,2013 for filling up the rest 3000 posts. 5000 Posts of Junior Constables have been created for the LWE affected areas under West Bengal Police.

•To bridge the gap of village policing, the Government has accorded sanction of 3351 Village Police volunteers at Panchayat level. Recruitment process has been completed. Training of these volunteers has started.

•Thus, 22515 new posts have been created under the West Bengal Police Directorate after the new Government took over in May,2011.

 New Government Railway Police Stations have been set up at Uluberia and Digha Railway Stations.

•Plea-bargaining- Efforts have been made with the assistance of the District Legal Services Authority / State Legal Services Authority to decide the cases where plea-bargaining as per amended provision of CrPC is applicable. 11 cases were decided and more such disposal is expected in the coming months. Steps have also been taken to dispose of cases Lok-Adalats through and upto 01.11.2012 a total of 3852 cases (both GR & NGR) have been decided with fine realized to the tune of Rs. 50,36,847/-.

•From May 2011 to September 2012 a total of 6,823 numbers of illegal / unclaimed arms, 33,083 nos. of ammunitions and 14,750 numbers of bombs were seized. This includes Seizure of 05 AK47s, 06 SLRs, 05 INSAS, Rifles 13, Magazines-26, Chargers-06 IEDs 26, Detonators-146, G. Sticks- 48, from LWE affected areas.

•Significant achievements have been made in control of trafficking by CID in respect of women and children. A total of 30 female (9 major and 21 minor) and 04 males have recovered in the State and a total of 74 persons have been arrested in connection with 26 specific cases.

•Major achievement has been achieved in the control of narcotics and illicit poppy cultivation with Birbhum district receiving a special award from the Government of India.

•For modernizing the police force, Rs. 9.99 Crore have been sanctioned by the Government for 24 ongoing building construction projects in different units under West Bengal Police. Mobility has been improved with 883 numbers of different types of vehicles like being procured for which a sum of Rs. 10.10 Crore has been sanctioned, 116 numbers of additional vehicles are under process of procurement. includina Weaponry, Non-lethal weapons have been procured, for which fund of Rs. 7.61 Crore have sanctioned. Equipments include etc. A sum of Rs. 18.65 Crore has been sanctioned by the Government for procurement of different types of equipment for Traffic, Law & Order, Training, Investigation, Telecom and Security-related Equipment.

•West Bengal Police Housing & Infrastructure Development Corporation has been set up to cater to the housing needs of the policemen and their families

Kolkata Police:

 After the new Government took charge, the entire geographical area of the 141 wards under K.M.C. has been brought under the jurisdiction of Kolkata Police.

•As a result of it 9 (nine) Police Stations under West Bengal State Police have been brought under Kolkata Police. 8 (eight) Police Stations out of those 9 have been bifurcated by means of rearrangement of the area under their jurisdiction.

•These 17 (seventeen) Police Stations are as follows:-

Behala, Parnasri , Thakurpukur , Haridevpur, Jadavpur, Patuli, Regent Park, Aurobinda Park, East Jadavpur, Survey Park,Kasba, Garfa,Tiljala,Pragati Maidan,Nadial, Rajabagan and Metiabruz.

•Two new Divisions namely Behala and Jadavpur have been set up under

been Kolkata Police.

•Two new traffic divisions with 10 Traffic Guards have been created. Close Circuit television (CCTV) sets have been placed at strategic location.

•Ambulances equipped with critical care facilities and a Transit Trauma Care Unit have been placed at important locations to provide immediate help to critically injured victims of road accidents and to transport them to hospital.

•3536 new posts have been created in Kolkata Police since May,2011

•The recruitment process for 3751 posts of different police ranks, and 107 Medical Officers and Hospital Staff for Kolkata Police Hospital is under process. 1000 Home Guards, 764 Civic Police volunteers, 891 Ex-Servicemen as Constables on contractual basis, have already been recruited in Kolkata Police during the period under report.

•A "Cyber Lab" has been set up at Lalbazar to tackle cyber crimes by providing training to police officers in cyber forensics.

 'Community Policing Wing' has been working to communicate with the masses.

 Kolkata Police Housing & Infrastructure Development Corporation has been set up to cater to the housing needs of the policemen and their families.

Independence Day Parade was held successfully for the first time in the history of Kolkata at Red Road on 15.08.2012. A cultural programme, Jaya Hey was organized for the members of force and their family at Netaji Indoor Stadium which received appreciation from different quarters of society.

 Kolkata Police Law Institute has been set up.

Coastal Security

• During the last two years, this Government took sufficient efforts to clear the pendencies in respect of Coastal Police Stations in the 1st phase of Coastal Security Scheme for the purpose of safety measures and vigil in the Coastal region. As a result, all the sanctioned six (6) Coastal Police stations in West Bengal at 1) Digha Mohana 2) Talpatighat 3) Haldibari(Sundarban) 4) Maipith 5) Frezerganj & 6) Hemnagar in the first phase of the scheme are

functioning effectively.

•Ministry of Home Affairs, Govt of India declared second phase of the scheme to be implemented during the period 2011-16 and sanctioned construction of eight more Coastal Police Stations in West Bengal 1) Junput 2) at Mandarmoni 3) Nayachar 5) Gobardhanpur 6) Gangasagar Jharkali 7) Harwood Point and 8) Diamond Harbour. The matters of procurement of land for all these 8(eight) Coastal Police Stations of phase-II have also been taken up in right earnest.

•For construction of Talpatighat and Sundurban Coastal Police Station administrative approvals and financial sanctions have been given.

•Effective measures have been taken towards identification land. finalisation of plan & estimate. inter-departmental transfer of land, waiving of restrictions under Forest Conservation Act and disposal of matters relating to clearance from **Environment** Department implementing the second phase schemes.

Land for three Coastal Police Stations
 Viz. Harwood Point, Mandarmoni and
 Junput have already been settled and
 administrative approval for the plan and
 estimates for Harwood Point and
 Mandarmoni Coastal Police Stations
 have been accorded.

•From the date of advent of the Coastal Security Scheme, Government of West Bengal has explored every possibility to give it a new dimension.

Border Area Development Programme(BADP):

Border Area Development Programme (BADP) is being successfully implemented in 65 blocks in 9 border districts namely North 24 Parganas, Nadia, Murshidabad, Malda, Dakshin Dinajpur, Uttar Dinajpur, Cooch Behar, Jalpaiguri, Darjeeling.

Border area developmental schemes in different sectors like Roads, Education, Health & F.W., Public Health Engg., Power, Irrigation & Flood control, Agriculture, Community development & Employment generation have been implemented in last 2 (two) years in 718 schemes with fund allocation of

Rs.135.63 Cr. for the year 2011-12 and in 594 schemes with fund allocation of Rs. 144.82 Cr. for the year 2012-13.

e-Governance

•Finalization of Detailed Project Report and granting of administrative approval for introduction of File & Letter Tracking System — making the entire tracking system faster, efficient and transparent — is in the final stage.

 Another part of this project is storing and managing records of Home Department in digitized form for the purpose of preservation and archival, accessibility, security, confidentiality and data management.

Financial Adviser

The department has introduced the system of Financial Advisor. Through this system all the comprehensive and authenticated proposals for expenditures upto Rs. 10 Crore will be cleared without referring to Finance Department.

Forensic Science Laboratory:

 Efforts are being made for filling up of Long pending vacancies in State
 Forensic Science Laboratory. Six posts of Senior Scientific Officers have already been filled up.

•For up-gradation of the Laboratory, the Government has taken up a broad project viz "VISION-2015" duly recommended by a High Power Committee. The said project, if can be implemented, will take the State Forensic Science Laboratory to a Global-standar

Significant Policy and Initiatives

- > All quota systems in respect of allotment of flats have been abolished.
- **Departmental website** has been launched with the address <u>www.wbhousing.gov.in</u> wherefrom everyone will be able to know the activities and performance of the Housing Department.
- For the sake of bringing transparency in the system, allotment of flats (Rental Housing Estates (RHE) for the govt. employees and the Public Rental Housing Estates for LIG, MIG, and HIG people) will be done through application of software by a fully computerized system on first come first serve basis. Actions have already been initiated for this purpose.





PREFACE

- This Department is the nodal department of the State that has been assigned the task for addressing industrial sickness of 'closed', 'sick' and 'weak' industrial units in the medium/large scale sectors.
- The new government upon taking over the charge of the State in May 2011 had observed that the policies taken by the earlier government did not result in any significant result in addressing industrial sickness in the state.
- Despite stretched resources, the efforts of the new government to combat industrial sickness with the objective of undertaking meaningful reconstruction in the changed socio-economic scenario have however, generated its own impact. Increasingly, a coherent policy is emerging and performance has emerged for the long-term benefit of the society.

SIGNIFICANT ACHIEVEMNTS

- Steps have been taken for a comprehensive survey on land held by sick/closed/weak industrial units in the state with a view to unblock and prospective industrial use. The report of the Consultant is expected shortly.
- It is decided by the new government that no industrial land would be allowed to change its prospective character but could be transferred strictly for industrial use only.
- A significant amendment in the relevant section of 14Z of WBLR Act
 1955 has been appropriately made in June 2012 in consistent with the

- present policy of the new government to stop prospective use as residential/commercial.
- It is suggested that if an investor wishes to invest in the State, he would be requested to explore the possibilities of taking one closed unit of the State along with new proposal.


PERFORMANCE

- During the period, this department has closely monitored the progress of revival of 36 sick units (7 CPSUs and 29 Private) during implementation of their revival packages approved by BIFR.
- This Department has granted support of appropriate relief/concessions to the eligible units for which revival/rehabilitation efforts have been taken by their existing/new entrepreneurs.
- All-out efforts have been initiated by the department for recovery of the outstanding loans from the defaulted units which were granted Sales Tax/bridge-loans as required in their revival-scheme duly accepted by the government.
- Support measures have been assured by this Government in the revival efforts initiated by GOI in respect of M/s Braithwaite and Burn Standard, both CPSUs having their major wagon manufacturing units located in this State
- Upon persuasion with Government of India, 2 closed jute mills (Khardah and Kinnison) of M/s National Jute Manufacturers Co. Ltd. have been reopened and resumed commercial operation.

- The closed units of Hindustan Fertilizer Corpn. Ltd. at Durgapur and Haldia have since been decided by GOI for revival on the request of this new government.
- Strategic JV partners have been formally transferred land by GoWB for reopening/revival of closed MAMC unit at Durgapur. Progress of its reopening and resumption of operation is being regularly monitored by the department.
- Efforts have also been taken by GOWB in consultation with GOI and High Court so that some other closed units lying under liquidation proceedings can be revived.
- The Department has also declared status of 'Relief Undertaking' to 5 ailing industrial units during the period under review.
- With the support of the department, the closed unit of Bengal Waterproof (Duckback) has been reopened and started commercial operation.
- The government is taking proactive steps to reopen Dunlop plant at Sahaganj, Hooghly under the guidelines of the Hon'ble High Court.

EFFORTS in PIPELINE

 Introduction of a policy to consider appropriate support-measures to eligible sick/weak industrial units is underway. It is proposed to introduce a new set of programme towards arresting industrial sickness at incipient stages and to formulate timely intervention in extending support measures by the government.



This Deptt.has over the last two years grown beyond a mechanism for disseminating government policy to an organisation that consolidates efforts to nurture, promote and develop all kinds of cultural activities in the State of West Bengal. The new initiatives are of four types.

I - A number of Task Forces and 32 Committees have been set up to systematise and implement the Govt's. policies on culture and information. These Committees comprise eminent persons from all fields of culture. By functioning through these Committees, the I&CA Deptt's. working is not only more responsive to the felt needs of the cultural community but is also totally transparent. These Task Forces and Committees, under the overall guidance of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, have taken several major policy initiatives.

The Committee on Press Accreditation assessed the requirement of print and electronic media for press accreditation cards through transparent standards of eligibility. The Press Accreditation cards have since been printed and distributed. Acknowledging the long standing demand of the media fraternity, a Press Corner has been set up in Writers' Buildings and the briefing area has been widened and renovated appropriately. The State Government is committed to provide financial assistance to needy

Journalists for whicha policy on "Journalists Benevolent Fund"has been formulated.

The State Govt, has also set up the KaziNazrul Academy Islam preservation and promotion of Kazi Nazrul Islam's works. The Birsha Munda Academy, Rajbanshi Bhasha Academy and the Nepali Academy have also been set up for the preservation of the language and culture of these regional entities respectively. In a bid to uphold the language and culture of the linguistic minorities of the state, the State Government has decided to accord the languages such as Urdu, Hindi, Nepali, Oriya, Santhali and Punjabi (with Gurmukhi script) the status of second languages where the people speaking these languages constitute 10 per cent or more of the population. Urdu has already been declared the second language.

A Committee for social communication has been constituted to draw up a rural communication strategy for taking up intensive campaign programmes in the field of health, education, minority development, SC & ST welfare, women and children's rights and environment etc.

The Publication Wing of the Department regularly publishes the Journal Paschimbanga in Bengali, Hindi, Urdu, Santhali and English. Apart from

this, a booklet named 'SarkareNabboi Din' (Ninety Days of the Government) been published containing extensive information on the projects implemented by the State Government. Another booklet named 'Kichu Katha Kichu Kaj' has been published covering the adopted and implemented programmes during the first eight months of the State Government and has been translated into English, Hindi, Urdu and Santhali. A book titled 'Pratyasa-theka-Prapti' in Bengali was published on the occasion completion of one year of the present Government. The English version of this book titled 'Hope to Reality'was also released simultaneously.

Considering the vital role played by the Basumati Sahitya Mandir in the freedom movement of the country and its association with eminent and historic personalities such Swami Vivekananda, Mahatma Gandhi, Netali Subhas Chandra Bose, Sarat Basu, Surendranath Bandyopadhyay, Jatindra Mohon Sengupta, Sarojini Naidu, the State Government started the process of revival ofthe Basumati Corporation Limited. The publication of Masik Basumati Sahitya Patrika, one of India's oldest and most popular monthly literary magazines, has already been launched in the Kolkata Book Fair after a long gap. The magazine is being

published regularly. Basumati Corporation Ltd.is also taking up various printing works, orders etc. from different organizations including Government offices. In the financial year 2011-12, the Corporation earned revenue of Rs. 5 crore.

II - The Govt. has taken special steps to recognise the contributions of eminent litterateurs, musicians, theatre and film personalities and others eminent in culture. In addition, the Govt. in the I&CA Deptt, has revived some schemes and started others to provide financial assistance to deserving cultural persons includina folk performers; assistance comes in the form of allowances, pensions and special support to different cultural groups. The Deptt., under the directions of the Hon'ble Chief Minister, has also provided ad-hoc assistance to many needy artistes and performers.

The Deptt. operates a Literary and Cultural Pension Scheme for the distressed people who have made significant contributions in the fields of performing arts and literature. The existing list of pension holders has been verified and updated by the District Magistrates and the Information & Cultural Affairs Department. Pension is being disbursed to pensioners through account payee cheques. Introduction of special pension for eminent personalities of the cultural world who are now in financially distressed condition. In March 2013, a scheme was started under guidance of Hon'ble Chief Minister, to provide annual assistance ofRs. 7000/- each to deserving folk music performers. Assistance has been disbursed to 115 such performers. The Deptt.under the direction of Hon'ble Chief Minister, has revamped the scheme for assistance to deserving theatre groups. 100 such groups have been identified from all over the State for this annual support.

The Department has instituted the practice of awarding outstanding achievers in the fields of art, music, films, literature and sports. In order to make the system more transparent and accountable, the State Government has constituted an Awards Committee for all awards given by the State Government. The Banga Bibhushan Awards were initiated by the State Government in 2011 for giving awards to persons with outstanding contributions. The awards were given to Shri Manna De, Gitasree Sandhya Mukherjee, Shri Sailen Manna, Shri Haradhan Bandyopadhyay, Shri Dwijen Mukhopadhyay, Smt. Mahasweta Devi, Smt. Supriya Devi, Smt. Amala Shankar and Ustad Amjad Ali Khan. The 2nd Bangabhusan and Banga Bibhusan awards in 2012 were conferred on 3 persons and 13 persons respectively. The Bangabhusan Awards were conferred on Ustad Rashid Khan. Sri Bikram Ghosh and Sri Nachiketa The Bangabibhusan Chakraborty. Awards were conferred on Sri Lesley Claudius, Smt. Suchitra Sen, Sri Rudra Sengupta, Prasad Sri Sirsendu Mukhopadhyay, Sri Sanjib Chattopadhyay, Sri Bibhas Chakraborty, Sri Jogen Chowdhury, Ustad Ali Ahmed Hossain Khan, Sri Ranjit Mallick, Smt. Saonli Mitra, Sri Goutam Ghosh, Pandit Ajay Chakraborty and Sri Goswami. The State Govt. has plans to organise the next Banga Bibhushan awards on the 20th of May, 2013.

In order to honour renowned personalities in the fields of art, culture and public life, the State Government has for the first time started the practice of commemorating their birthdays. These functions are being held regularly in Writers' Buildings in a befitting manner and on many such occasions, Hon'ble Chief Minister remains present.

III - Third, the Govt. has systematically organised major cultural events across the State, thus not only promoting the

local culture but also providing support and encouragement to many artistes. Many state ceremonies have been organized across the State. Besides the annual Republic Day Parade, the Govt. has for the first time organised a parade on Independence Day. Besides, special ceremonies are now organised each year in honour of Mahatma Gandhi, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose, Jawaharlal Nehru, Raja Rammohan Roy, Swami Vivekananda, Rabindranath Tagore, Ishwar Chandra Vidyasagar, Sister Nivedita, Martyrs Kshudiram Bose, Prafulla Chaki, Binoy Badal and Dinesh, Sree Sree Ramakrishna Paramahansa, Sree Sree Ma Saradamoyi, Dr. Meghnad Saha, Ritwik Ghatak, Salil Chowdhury, Mother Teresa, Abul Kalam Azad, Master Surva Sen, Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, Pritilata Waddedar and Dr. Nilratan Sarkar to name a few.

The Natya Mela was organized in Kolkata and Howrah as well as at North Bengal. All forms of drama were performed by over 100 theatre groups from all over the State.

The Festival on Uday Shankaris organized every year to commemorate the birth anniversary of the great Indian Maestro. Artistes and dance troupes all over the State take part in this festival. Indian Classical Music Festival/Conference is also organized with participation by senior classical singers. In 2012-13, classical singers from all over India as well as Pakistan participated in this classical music conference. These dance/classical music programmes, organized by West Bengal State Music Akademi, were well attended and earned appreciation from all concerned. Meanwhile, the old building of Music Akademi has been thoroughly renovated under guidance Hon'ble Chief Minister workshops, seminar, long term training courses on song and dance are being held regularly in the Akademi.



Rajya Charukala Utsav is organized regularly at Rabindra Sadan-Nandan Complex and also at Gaganendra Pradarsashala. Renowned artistes groups from all over the State participate in this Utsav. Remarkable works of art of eminent artistes are exhibited at Gaganendra Pradarsashala. In 2012-13, Jatra Utsav was inaugurated in Kachari Maidan, Barasat by Hon'ble Chief Minister with participation of a large number of people. The other venue of Jatra Utsav was Phanibhusan Bidyabinod Jatra Mancha which has been thoroughly renovated in 2012-13. Thus, the scale of Jatra Utsav was expanded to a great extent.

Birth Anniversary of The 150th Rabindranath has Tagore been observed throughout the State in a befitting manner. This Govt. has taken the initiative to bring out the Kabi Pranam programme on Pachishey Baisakh from the small confines of Rabindra Sadan. In 2012, a large stage was put up on Cathedral Road and the occasion was celebrated in presence of a huge gathering and with participation from many artistes, dignitaries and personalities.Other eminent programms of Kabi Paksha continued as usual. The State Govt. has plans to celebrate this year's Pachishey Baisakh in a similar manner. The first edition of a book, published by this department, for commemorating the 150th Birth Anniversary of Rabindranath Tagore was completely sold out.

Baishey Shraban was commemorated across the state in 2012, with participation by school and college students and people from all walks of life.

Rabindra Rachanabali is being published by Paschimbanga Bangla Akademiin 17 (seventeen) volumes. The 1st volume wasreleased in an event attended by His Excellency, the Governor of West Bengal, the Vice Chancellor of Vishwa Bharati University and other noted literary personalities in Kolkata. So far, 4 (four) volumes have been published and have been well appreciated.

The 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda has been observed in a befitting manner by the State Government. State Government used this opportunity to spread the thoughts and teachings of Swamiji amongst youth of the state. Yuba Utsavs in the name of Vivek Melas have been organized by the Youth Services Department at blocks, districts and state level including Jungle Mahal areas. Vivek Medha Puraskar and Vivek Sahasikata Puraskar were given to

eligible students. The World Youth Festival was held in Salt Lake Stadium (renamed as Swami Vivekananda Yuba Bharati Krirangan) on 12th January 2013 with participation of a large number of people, dignitaries, eminent persons and others.

The Santhal Uprising was commemorated on Hool Divas by the State Government in a befitting manner through distribution of pattas of land among landless tribals of Paschim Medinipur district and awarding scholarships to tribal students in the presence of the family members of Sidhu and Kanu.

The Birth Anniversary of Nepali Poet Bhanubhakta was organized on July 13, 2011 at Darjeeling, Kalimpong and Siliguri after 20 years. The Department also provided assistance to the North Bengal Development Department for organizing the Uttar Banga Utsav in these districts of North Bengal.

Bangla Sangeet Mela is now being organised in alarge scale. The objective is to showcase various genres of Bengal music and to provide a forum for upcoming and deserving young artists, not only from Kolkata but also from districts. The inaugural events in 2012 and 2013 were held in Netaji Indoor Stadium; outstanding contributions in the field of music were felicitated with Sangeet Samman and Sangeet Mahasamman Awards. Each year, Bangla Sangeet Mela continued in several venues across Kolkata. In 2013, the closing ceremony of Bangla Sangeet Mela was held in Nazrul Mancha and the programme was extremely attended.

The International Children Film Festival, organized for the first time by the Sishu Kishore Academy, showcased 160 films. Paschimbanga Bangla Akademi have introduced 2 (two) new programmes namely "Gadyer Galpa-Swalpa" & "Kobir Sange Dekha" which have been hugely popular. Paschimbanga Kazi Nazrul

Islam Akademi has started functioning and its publication "Bidrohi" has received critical acclaim. The Akademi has also organized several seminar with participation of experts on Nazrul from Bangladesh.

Action is being taken to issue "Identity Card" to folk artistes all over the State. Paschimbanga Tele Akademi has been constituted and has started functioning. Organizing week-long "Pragati Utsav" on completion of 1 (one) year of the new State Govt. in 2 (two) venues of Milan Mela and Rabindra Sadan Complex.

Observance of birth anniversary of Dwijendralal Roy in Kolkata and Krishnagar. Cultural programmes were organized at 7 day-long "Mati Utsav".

West Bengal participated as a Partner State in the India International Trade Fair, 2011 for the first time, to exhibit its strengths and opportunities to the domestic and international visitors. The State also took the opportunity of the IITF platform to organise a "Rising Bengal" session with industries, entrepreneurs and foreign missions in New Delhi.

The 17th edition of Kolkata Film Festival was organized in 2011 in order to facilitate maximum participation and organise it with adherence to high professional standards. The film festival was inaugurated in Netaji Indoor Stadium to enable a large number of people view the programme and the inaugural film. 150 films from 50 countries were showcased, for the first time in the history of Kolkata Film Festival, all information with regard to the film festival was provided through a website which helped the public to easily access information.

The 18th Kolkata International Film Festival was organised between 10th November to 17th November, 2012 where 200 films of 62 countries were screened. Indian cine legend Amitabh Bacchan inaugurated this gala event on



10th November, 2012 in Netaji Indoor Stadium. 20 foreign delegates and 20 national delegates ornamented this event with their presence and media interaction. The eminent film personality Mr. Sharukh Khan was nominated as the State Brand Ambassador by the State Government.

Roopkala Kendra, Film and Social Communication Institute, a registered society under the Department of Information and Cultural Affairs, Government of West Bengal organised the first phase of 11th International Social Communication Cinema Conference scheduled from March 14 -16, 2012 at Nandan. The 2nd phase of the conference will be organized in different districts of West Bengal to screen films selected by the delegates. The conference was attended by a large number of students from different colleges and universities along with district level delegates comprising of members from the self help groups, cooperative societies, cine members, district level press etc. About 85 members of the district level delegates attended the conference. It is important to mention that this year for the first time in the history of International Social Communication Cinema Conference organized by Roopkala Kendra, narrowcast delegates from the districts participated in the inaugural session held at Nandan-I. The Kendra also organized a special screening for Hindi & Urdu speaking delegates at Nandan.

The hospitality and protocol wing of this department played an important role in extending hospitality and looking after the protocol requirements of visiting dignitaries and important delegation from all over the country and abroad. During 2011-12 nearly 1400 dignitaries visited the State.

IV - Finally, the Deptt.has planned and taken up a number of capital schemes to provide infrastructure for not only culture but also economic activity in the field of entertainment, culture and ancillary services.

In order to enable the districts to encourage talent and organise programmes within the districts, 32 Rabindra Bhavans across the State are being upgraded at a cost of Rs. 75.82 crore under the programme of Tagore Cultural Complexes Scheme Government of India wherein Rs. 30.32 crore is being contributed by the State Government. The Mongpu Villa with which Rabindranath Tagore had a very creative association has been renovated by the State Government.

The Rathindra Mancha located inside Jorasanko Thakurbari is also being restored by Government of India in consultation with the State Government.

The city of Kolkata has the potential to emerge as the cultural capital not only within the country but can also carve its own niche in the cultural map of the world Recognising this. Government has decided to develop and upgrade the cultural infrastructure in the state. The Rabindra Sadan Complex, located in the heart of the city, is being envisaged to be developed as a modern, state-of-the-art global cultural complex for display of visual and performing arts, archives for preservation of works.

In order to create appropriate infrastructure to attract the film industry back to Bengal, it has been decided to make concerted efforts to develop the infrastructure to bring back the film making talent pool in the country which today comprises of large numbers of technicians, producers and directors from Bengal and will give a definite boost to the economy.

The 100 year old Technicians Studio at Tollygunge is being revamped into a modern Studio space by the State Government for which work has already started. The West Bengal Film Development Corporation- Rupayan is being developed through Public Private Partnership (PPP). Two film cities are being taken up for development at Uttarpara in South Bengal and Dabgram in North Bengal through private participation. An award titled the 'Uttam Kumar Award for Excellence in Cinema' has been constituted and conferred on persons for their lifetime contribution in the field of cinema.

The Heritage Commission and the Centre For Archeological Studies & Training in Eastern India (CASTEI) have been reconstituted. The Directorate of Archaeology and Museums is taking active care towards the preservation of 108 State Protected Monuments and Sites within the jurisdiction limit of the State and publication of the reports on the exploration & excavation and catalogue of the museums, 'Jelarpurakirti' in Bengali, etc. as a part of routine activities for creating awareness among the scholars. students and common people. The West Bengal Heritage Commission has declared more than 200 heritage buildings for protection conservation.

The conservation of monuments are being conducted in collaboration with The West Bengal Heritage Commission, Public Works Department Archaeological Survey of India. During the recent past, the Directorate of Archaeology in collaboration with PWD has undertaken the conservation work of Radhagovinda Jew Temple at Antpur in Hooghly. The District Museums at Bishnupur in Bankura district, Malda District Museum, Balurghat in Dakshin Dinajpur district, Raiganj in Uttar Dinajpur district, District Museums at Jiaganj, Murshidabad and Bagnan Ananda Niketan Kristishala are being strengthened during the year 2012-13. New site museums are planned and rural museums will also strengthened.

The renovation of the roof of the pillared, Bhogamandapin front of the Durga Temple at Antpur is being undertaken during the year 2012-13 along with other conservation works. The ancient Portuguese Wooden Mast within the Bandel Church Complex will also be conserved during this year. Already 33 projects have been identified for conservation development of the state protected monuments, unprotected monuments and protected heritage buildings under the West Bengal Heritage Commission. Archaeological excavations out in 2012-2013 Santhaldanga located at the village Arra within the Police Station Bhatar in Burdwan, at Chandraketugarh in North 24 Parganas district and Dantan in Paschim Medinipur.

The documentation of antiquities and heritage buildings and digitisation of records will be undertaken during 2013-14 in collaboration with the National Mission on Monuments & Antiquities.


























PART I: Performance, Achievements & Pipeline in IT Promotion



- A not much talked about department in public discourses other than during floods or similar natural calamities is now being acknowledged by peoples' representatives, and a wide section of common people for its ability and efforts to create capital assets in irrigation development, flood protection and rural connectivity. This is the most significant achievement of the Irrigation & Waterways Department during last one year and eleven months, especially in recent past to be more precise.
- Creation of irrigation potential by ongoing major and medium projects in the State, an important indicator of construction activities in irrigation sector, was 68,471 acres during last two years. Achievements during this period alone stand at 68% of the total achievements made during preceding six years (2005-06 to 2010-11).
- Average annual coverage of area under Rabi / Boro irrigation by canal networks in Teesta Barrage Project in the command lying in Darjeeling, Jalpaiguri & Coochbehar districts was to

the tune of 1,10,700 acres during the period under consideration, which is the highest ever achievement since inception of the project. Target of 2013-14 is to add another 24,710 acres.

- Lost irrigation potential for fully or partially defunct medium and minor irrigation schemes and inadequately maintained major irrigation schemes completed in late 50's and 60's could be regained for 1,34,178 acres during May, 2011 to March, 2012 by extensive improvement works on canal networks. As a result, irrigation water could be provided in various areas in Burdwan, Birbhum, Bankura, Paschim Medinipur and Purulia districts, almost after two decades.
- 12 number of regulating hydraulic structures including sluices have been commissioned during the period under consideration, which would facilitate better irrigation and flood management.
- 21 number of RCC rural bridges could be completed and opened to traffic in various South Bengal districts during last two years. Number of bridges completed during 2005-06 to 2010-11 was only 16. Works of another 43 new bridges have further been taken up in Howrah, Hooghly, North & South 24-Parganas and Paschim Medinipur districts for better connectivity, which

have no parallel in last three decades. Lalgarh Bridge over river Kangsabati (Estimated Cost: ₹50.45 crore) deserves special mentioning. These new bridges are expected to be completed latest by June, 2014. Recons- truction of 73 km metalled road on the embankments of Fulahar & Mahananda Rivers has been completed in just 3 months' period (January to March, 2013), which is an unique achievement.

- As many as 82 projects in floods and irrigation sectors in 18 districts of the State have been completed between December 2012 to March 2013, having aggregate estimated cost of ₹223.76 crore.
- Total value of works of ongoing major projects is to the tune of ₹1355.62 crore at present. These, inter alia, include 'Reconstruction of 'Aila' affected Sundarban **Embankments'** 'Kaliaghai-Kapaleswari-Baghai Basin Drainage Scheme! 20 km length of embankment in the former project stated in a full fledged manner only in December 2012 is expected to be completed by June, 2013 as against zero progress during 2009-10 & 2010-11. Further acceleration of progress is expected in 2013-14. So far as the latter project is concerned, resuscitation of channels of total length 130.63 km could be completed in last one year and another 36.5 km is expected to be

- completed by June, 2013. Covering such a considerable length of channels in such a less time is really unprecedented.
- Over and above the completed and ongoing projects, this Department has taken up 158 number of important projects spread over 89 Blocks in 17 districts and also in Kolkata Municipal Corporation, and two other municipal areas during January 2013 to March 2013. Total estimated cost of these projects are ₹602.00 crore. These apart, tendering is under process for another 5 schemes sanctioned at the fag end of 2012-13, having aggregate estimated cost ₹40.90 crore. There is no precedence of taking up so many works at a time in the history of this Department. These are expected to be completed latest by June, 2014. Some of the projects worth mentioning are:
- Improvement of Mahananda Main Canal for increasing hydel power generation as well as irrigation coverage in Darjeeling & Uttar Dinajpur districts (Estimated Cost: ₹ 22.15 crore);
- Improvement of Karala River in the district of Jalpaiguri (Estimated Cost: ₹15.98 crore);
- Improvement of Karotowa-Talma Irrigation Project in district Jalpaiguri (Estimated Cost: ₹ 6.48 crore);

- Coastal protection and beautification ₹ 542.44 crore (anticipated) respectively works in Digha-Shankarpur area (Estimated Cost: ₹ 86.61 crore):
- Re-excavation of Ichhamati in North 24-Parganas district (Estimated Cost: ₹31.11 crore).
- Resuscitation of Baigachhi Khal and Nayabaz Khal system in Howrah & Hooghly districts (Estimated Cost: ₹22.09 crore);
- Reconstruction of 'Aila' Sundarban embankments in North & South 24-Parganas districts (Cluster of projects, aggregate estimated cost: ₹ 88.63 crore).
- Bank protection works on river Fulahar in Malda District (Estimated cost: ₹ 24.54 crore).
- Revamping of outfall channels of Kolkata Drainage System has also been taken up on priority basis, Improvement of Upper Bagjola Khal (Latest estimated cost: ₹67.00 crore) is going on in full Resuscitation including beautification of Adi Ganga / Tolly's Nullah is nearing completion (Latest estimated cost: ₹15.03 crore).
- Capital expenditure for creation of assets through Plan schemes in 2011-12 & 2012-13 was ₹ 323.51 crore and

- against ₹184.41 crore 2010-11, clearly exhibiting steep upward trend.
- Major important projects in the pipeline, work of which can possibly be started in 2013-14, subject to timely approval of the Government of India, include.
- Scheme for Kandi area (Estimated Cost: ₹ 438.94 crore);
- **Ghatal Master Plan (Estimated Cost:** ₹1960.78 crore);
- Cluster of bank protection schemes in North Bengal (Estimated Cost: ₹147.00 crore).
- For the time in last two decades, preparation of a Master Plan along with cost estimates has been taken up for easement of drainage congestion in Lower Damodar areas of the State in Howrah & Hooghly districts chronically suffering from floods almost every year.
- It has been planned to install 24x7 helpline for providing irrigation related information to the farmers in various districts.

Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

Several departments of the Government of West Bengal have undertaken a number of schemes for the development of Jungle Mahal areas as desired by Hon'ble Chief Minister. They are being monitored regularly by Additional Chief Secretary, Department of Planning, as desired by Hon'ble Chief Minister. This is the first time that serious focus has been given for the all-round development of the tribal

population in the Jungle Mahal areas comprising of 11 blocks (Midnapore Sadar, Garhbeta – II, Salboni, Jhargram, Binpur-I, Binpur-II, Sankrail, Jamboni, Nayagram, Gopiballavpur-I and Gopiballavpur-II) of Paschim Medinipur district, 9 blocks (Arsha, Baghmundi, Balarampur, Barabazar, Bundwan, Jhalda-I, Jhalda-II, Manbazar-II and Joypur) of Purulia district and 4 blocks (Ranibandh, Simlapal, Raipur and Sarenga) of Bankura district.

A. Sector-wise some of the developmental projects taken up, are mentioned below, briefly.

Education:

(a) The Higher Education Department is setting up three general degree colleges at Lalgarh, Shalboni and Nayagram, in addition to the construction of a separate

Girls' wing for the Jhargram Raj College.

All the above institutions will start their academic sessions from 2014-2015.

(b) The School Education Department has upgraded 245 schools from secondary to higher secondary level. Thirty four 50-seated girls' hostels are coming up of which 26 will be completed by May, 2013. 1027 Santhali teachers have been appointed for teaching the tribal children in their mother tongue at elementary level. About 48,000 bi-cycles have been distributed to girls students studying between class-IX to class-XII facilitating their attendance in schools.

(c) The Department of Minority Affairs and Madrasah Education has completed a High Madrasah at Simlapal in Bankura district. (d) Construction of Polytechnics at Ramgarh in Paschim Medinipur is underway. Much progress has been made for the construction of ITIs at Shalboni in Paschim Medinipur and Khatra in Bankura. Works has also been initiated for the ITI at Balarampur in Purulia district.

Health:

The Health Department is set to construct 5 Multi-Speciality hospitals in Jhargram, Nayagram, Shalboni, Gopiballavpur and Purulia. The Sub-Divisional hospital at Jhargram is being upgraded to a District hospital. The Blood Bank at Khatra is nearly complete. Sick Newborn Care Units (SNCUs) and Sick Newborn Stabilisation Units (SNSUs) are being set up in the Jungle Mahal areas.

The ANM training centre at Lalgarh, construction of which has started, will take care of the training demands in a big way. The Health Department, aided by several voluntary organisations, is also reaching out health care services to remote villages of Jungle Mahal. This is a follow up to the mobile trauma care, ambulance services that Hon'ble Chief Minister had flagged off in July, 2011. Multi speciality hospital in Shalbony and Purulia will be taken up this year for completion.

Water:

(a) Drinking Water

The Jungle Mahal area is drought prone. The Public Health Engineering

Department has taken up piped drinking water supply schemes. In Paschim Medinipur out of 41, thirty nine schemes have been completed and the ones at Barasukhjora and Dherua will also be completed soon. The 5 drinking water supply schemes at Manbazar-II and Arsha blocks of Purulia and the 4 drinking water supply schemes at the blocks of Sarenga, Raipur and Simlapal in Bankura have made commendable progress.

(b) Irrigation

The requirement of water for irrigation will be met through 79 schemes in Paschim Medinipur, 60 schemes in Bankura and 37 schemes in Purulia by the Water Resources Investigation & Development Department. Out of which 20,15 & 30 are nearly completed respectively.

Communication:

A new road connecting Lalagarh to Netai being constructed through Panchayat & Rural Development Department, will be completed by July, 2013. The bridge over river Subarnarekha at Nayagram which has been taken up by Public Works Department and Amkola bridge over river Kansabati at Lalgarh taken up by Irrigation & Waterways Department, are endeavours in the communication sector.

Food:

For meeting the food security demands of the tribal people, all the tribal population irrespective of their income, are getting food on the scale given to BPL families including rice at Rs.2 per kg. 29 new MR shops are being constructed for access to the remote areas.

Full financial support is being given to the tribal women for selling of 'Kendu' leaves to West Bengal Tribal Development Corporation at Rs.75 per chhata (2000 leaves) from Rs. 48.

Sports:

In order to give a fillip to the natural talent possessed by the tribal people of these areas, importance has been laid on sports activities. The upgradation of existing stadium at Jhargram where the seat capacity is being increased from 150 to 2000 has been completed. Much progress has been made for setting up of a Sports Academy at Jhargram in Paschim Medinipur and another at Kharidungri in Bankura. The existing Sports Academy at Purulia is being upgraded. Land has been transferred to the Sports Department for setting up of new stadiums at Shalboni and at Nayagram.

Employment:

10,700 appointments have been provided to the youth of Jungle Mahal as Home Guards/NVF/Junior Constables. Majority have been trained and are on the job.

(C) Special BRGF:

Under Special Backward Regions Grant Fund for the Jungle Mahal areas, above Rs.2000 crore is being spent involving construction of eighty 50-seated girls' hostels and 23 Higher Secondary Schools by the School Education Department; houses by Panchayat & Rural Development Department; domestic electricity connections by Power Department; construction of rural huts and implementation of the schemes of Natural Fibre Mission by the Micro & Small Scale Enterprises and Textiles Department; drinking water supply schemes in Bankura by Public Health Engineering Department; hospitals by Health & Family Welfare Department; extensive roads by Public Works and Public Works (Roads) Department; houses for BPL category by Minority Affairs Department; and construction of RCC bridges by Irrigation & Waterways Department.

Thus, it is seen that in addition to the usual schemes, run by the line Departments, schemes worth about Rs.2633 crore have been taken up in Jungle Mahal. Nearly all the schemes are expected to be completed by 2013-2014.



- Nineteen Human Right Courts in 19 Districts have been established.
- 151 Fast Track Courts were functional with the financial assistance of the Central Government and such financial assistance of the Central Government had been stopped on and from 01.04.2011. Thereafter, those F.T. Courts had been running by the State fund. Subsequently, the Hon'ble Supreme Court in Brij Mohon Lal's Case directed to stop such temporary Fast Track Courts and to create Fast Track Courts of permanent feature and 10% additional courts. In compliance with such directions, the following new Courts have been created:
- a) 24 Courts in the rank of District Judge (Entry Level) in 24 Sub-divisions.
- b) 88 F.T.C. of permanent feature.
- c) 29 posts of District Judge (Entry Level).
- d) 34 posts of Civil Judge (Sr. Division/ACJM Cadre).
- e) 31 posts of Civil Judge (Jr. Division/JM Cadre).
- Adequate posts of supporting staff have also been created.
- 6 additional C.B.I. Courts have been created.
- All vacancies of the Judges in the District Judiciary have been filled up. Advertisement has already been published by the W.B. P.S.C. for filling up the current vacancies.
- · All infrastructures have been created

for the temporary Circuit Bench of the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, and construction of the permanent Circuit Court at Jalpaiguri has already been started.

- Construction of the building complex of the Judicial Academy on 5 acre of land at Newtown, Rajarhat, Action Area - III is in full swing.
- Construction of new Court Buildings at places namely (a) Kharagpur (b) Barrackpore (c) Tufangaunge (d) Kalna (e) Barasat and (f) Chanchal are on the verge of completion and construction of new court buildings in places like (a) Diamond Harbour (b) Tamluk (c) Berhampore (d) Darjeeling (e) Gorubathan (f) Kakdwip and (g) Bishnupur are in progress.
- Construction of residential quarters for Judicial Officers are going on in places namely (a) Siliguri (b) Kurseong (c) Kalyani (d) Ranaghat (e) Golapbag (f) Chanchal (g) Krishnanagar (h) Kenduadihi (i) Nabadwip and (j) Asansol.
- The construction of a ten storied building of the Hon'ble High Court Calcutta has been completed and the building is already in use.
- A new Record Room has been introduced at High Court after renovation of a building of Dock Labour Hospital of Calcutta Port Trust.
- Sub-Divisional Court at Chanchal has started functioning from Oct' 2012.
 The West Bengal Advocates Welfare Corporation Act and Rules have already been given effect to, necessary authorities have been formed, Officers

have already been appointed and the Corporation is fully functional. Stipend to the newly enrolled Advocates under the provisions of the aforesaid Act has already been given to more than three hundred newly enrolled Advocates satisfying the criteria.

- Advocates Welfare Fund Trust Committee has been made fully functional and stamps have already been printed and delivered to them for raising their fund as per law.
- A special cell for the purpose of monitoring the pending cases in the Hon'ble High Court, Calcutta, where State of West Bengal is a party, would be formed very soon.
- Creation of 45 Special Courts for the trial of offences against women is under process and the process would be completed within a short period.
- Training has been imparted to a large number of Public Prosecutors and Assistant Public Prosecutors for improving the standard of prosecution for effective administration of criminal Justice system in this State.
- Approximately 1,46,549 numbers of marriages of different communities have been registered during the period 1st January, 2012 to 31st December, 2012. Pre-marriage Counselling has generated awareness on the necessity for compulsory marriage registration among the people. Marriage Officers in sub-divisional levels are being trained to cater proper service to the public. Computerisation of marriage registration is under consideration of the Government.

RSBY in WEST BENGAL [2012-13]

Rastiya Swastha Bima Yojona (RSBY) is a Central - State co-sponsored social assistance scheme to provide health insurance coverage for Below Poverty Line (BPL) families. Started in the year 2009-10 with only four (4) Districts at the end of 2012-13 all the 18 Districts have been included in RSBY Scheme.

Collection of land revenue and other Govt. dues: has considerably increased. Till 2010, annual revenue collection was on an average of Rs.230 crores. During the financial year 2011-12, revenue was collected to the tune of Rs. 380.14 crores and during the financial year 2012-13 it was to the tune of Rs. 319.15 crores till February, 2013 and will be achieved about Rs.400 crores till 15th April, 2013. Revenue collected in the year 2011-12 was all time high in the history of the L&LR Department.

Nijo Griha Nijo Bhumi (NGNB): Total no. of homestead pattas distributed under NGNB (a new scheme launched in October, 2011) up to March, 2013 was 60,193 covering 2421 acres of land. During the period 2011-12, agricultural pattas were distributed among 7912 beneficiaries while during the period 2012-13, the total of 35,461 no. of agricultural pattas have also been distributed to the eligible beneficiaries. Mutation: Mutation cases disposed of during 2011-12 and 2012-13 were 1282830 and 1214772 respectively.

Conversion: Conversion cases disposed of during 2011-12 and 2012-13 were 67050 and 53066 respectively.

Certified Copy Issued: Certified copies of ROR issued during 2011-12 and 2012-13 were 1747332 and 1949206 respectively.

Initiatives taken for better service delivery during 2011-12 and 2012-13:

Over the Counter (OTC) service: Over the Counter (OTC) service for information services is being provided in 287 BL&LRO offices. Citizen can now get certified copies of ROR and Plot Information within 5-15 minutes.

Integration between Land Records and Registration: In Howrah district a pilot project for e-integrating land records with property registration is running successfully and during the next financial year this facility will be rolled out throughout the State. Such integration will help in mutation on registration instantly.

Digitization of Maps & Records and Integration: 60,665 map sheets out of 68,328 village map sheets are digitized and 40,196 mouzas out of 42042 mouzas are digitized and updated. The digitized map data are integrated with RoR. West Bengal is the first State to integrate digitized cadastral maps with corresponding RoRs, which has been accepted as a model by the Department of Land Resources, Govt. of India.

Acquisition of land: During the last two years, lands have been acquired only for the Government to meet the public purposes. There was no forcible

acquisition of land in any manner whatsoever. The acquisition of agricultural land, irrigated land and land having dense habitation have been avoided as far as possible. No land has been acquired for any private company. Emergency provision for acquisition of land has not been used excepting in the case of national security, natural calamity, construction for irrigation embankment, etc. Land acquired for different projects under LA Act during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2012 is 1065 acres and 2012-13 is 1497 acres.

New policies on rehabilitation/ resettlement compensation for AILA Project have been formulated.

The State Government has recently framed a comprehensive Land Allotment Policy in the month of December, 2012, to streamline the settlement of government land and to introduce uniformity and transparency in dealing with land settlement/ allotment cases.

MASS EDUCATION EXTENSION SERVICES

Social Welfare Homes: In order to provide social safety net to destitute children, the Department operates 54 Social Welfare Homes. Of them 11 are under the State sector, 1 is sponsored and the remaining ones are under non Government sector.

One of the most significant achievements of the Department during the FY 2012-13 was the inauguration of a new State Welfare Home for Boys at Dudhkundi in the Junglemahal area of Jhargram Sub-division in Paschim Medinipur district.

The rate of monthly maintenance grant per inmate of the Homes was enhanced from Rs.950/- to Rs. 1250/ in 2012-13. At the same time, the income ceiling of eligibility has been raised from Rs. 11,000/ per annum to Rs.25, 000/ from the fiscal 2012-13.

Education and training for students

with special needs: Funds to the tune of Rs.3.87 crores were spent in the fiscal 2011-12 under the scheme of special schools to meet the educational and vocational needs of differently abled children. The Department has taken major initiatives for modernization of the facilities in the 147 sponsored and academically recognized Special Schools in terms of creating better infrastructural facilities, making provisions for technologically improved equipment and devices for education of students with special needs. Scholarships are also provided to such students studying in Class IX onwards.

Literacy Programme: Saakhar Bharat is a Centrally Sponsored programme with major thrust on female literacy. It is being implemented since September 2009, in nine districts of the State [Jalpaiguri, Coachbehar, Uttar Dinajpur, Dakshin Dinajpur, Malda, Murshidabad, Birbhum, Bankura and Purulia].

The programme made headway in the State only after August 2011. From a level of 1,93,505 learners evaluated in 2010-11, it shot up to 11, 35,562 in 2011-12.

During the FY 2012-13 the number of learners evaluated stood at 6.65 lakh against the target of 7.55 lakh.

A literacy programme for non Saakshar Bharat districts also is being implemented through State Government resources since 2011-12. **Pipeline Projects**

Setting up of two Social Welfare Homesone in Islampur in Uttar Dinajpur and the other at Purulia during FY 2013-14 for which possession of land has been taken from the L&LR Department. Plan and estimates are being prepared by the PWD.

LIBRARY SERVICES

West Bengal has a network of public libraries comprising of 12 Government Libraries and 2460 Govt. Sponsored Public Libraries. State Central Library is at the Apex of the Public Library system of West Bengal.

Infrastructural development: Funds to the tune of Rs.20.32 crores were spent in 2012-13 for strengthening the infrastructure of library services. This is a quantum jump from the funds of Rs.13.42 crores spent for the purpose in 2011-12. Thrust in both the years was given to areas in Jangal Mahal and that inhabited by the SC/ST and minorities population.

Pipeline Projects:

Phased introduction of exclusive women's libraries operated entirely by women is proposed on a pilot basis.

Networking facilities through Wide Area Networking (WAN) will be extended to the 170 Town/Sub divisional libraries.



Micro & Small Scale Enterprises, Handloom, Powerloom and Sericulture are the sectors that play a pivotal role in the overall industrial economy of the State. Concerted effort is the need of the hour for further growth and realization of the enormous potential of these sectors. The state government is fully committed to this.

MSE sector saw setting up of 22,627 new enterprises during May 2011 and March 2013 as compared to 7804 during April 2009 and March 2011. These enterprises have provided employment to 20,72,89 people as compared to only 51,319 people during April 2009 and March 2011. During the same period proposal for setting up 20,151 enterprises has been received by the Department. 1,59,217 people are supposed direct/indirect to get employment through these enterprises. 8,000 More potential entrepreneurs have been given EDP training during May 2011 and March 2013 as compared to 3,220 in the preceding two years.

Under PMEGP 10,886 enterprises have been sanctioned with combined project cost of Rs 383 crore. Once operational, these units will provide employment to about 86,000 people.

Rs 116 crore was disbursed during the period to micro and small enterprises as

incentive under the state government's incentive programme as compared to Rs. 65 crore only in the preceding two years.

Under Cluster Development Programme (MSE-CDP) the number of clusters have increased from 26 in 2010-11 to 48 till March 2013. 17 new clusters have been approved for undertaking soft interventions. Another 6 clusters have started the hard intervention of setting up Common Facility Centre. Hard interventions will start in 10 more clusters during 2013-14. A new project, Natural Fibre Mission (NFM) for fibre-based enterprises in the state has been launched in 2012 with a total project cost of Rs 257 crores. Spread over 11 backward districts of the state the project will provide skill development and tool kit package to more than 17,000 artisans engaged in fibre-based enterprises. 8 Common Facility Centres (CFC) / Common Production Centres (CPC) are being set up in the districts to help the small entrepreneurs, 25 acres of land has been acquired in the Vidyasagar Industrial Estate in Kharagpur to set up a Common Natural Fibre Centre (CNFC) under the project with a project cost of Rs 40 crore. To give a boost to the silk industry of the state, an integrated Silk Park is being set up at Malda with a project cost of Rs 40 crores. Land development work has already started for this Park. Facilities will be set up in this Park to provide post cocoon and post yarn support to the small entrepreneurs of this sector.

Aimed at providing major marketing

window of international standard to the entrepreneurs of micro and small sector with focus on handicraft and textiles, a Biswa Khudra Silpa Bazar is being set up at Shantiniketan over an area of 50 acres.

To provide marketing facilities to the handicraft artisans, Urban Haats are being set up at Durgapur, Siliguri, Bolpur and Kolkata. Durgapur Haat has become functional in 2012. The other Haats would be operationalized within 2013-14. Similarly, 4 Rural Haats are being set-up with the same purpose. Located at Bishnupur, Purulia, Jhargram and Alipurduar these Haats are also expected to be operational during 2013-14.

The Department facilitated participation of more than 12,500 artisans in 26 state level, 13 national level and 3 international handicraft fairs where a total sale/order procured was to the tune of Rs 65 crore.

3,87,496 handicraft artisans were provided identity cards during this period.

A district-wise Resource Directory for micro and small enterprises has been developed through physical survey. The Directory contains all necessary details for each mouza of the state in terms of raw material and infrastructure available, existing financial institutions, power availability, water bodies, nature of land & available land, road infrastructure, running enterprises and potential industries that can be set up. Once put on web this Directory will provide all these details to public on the

click of a mouse.

A comprehensive Handloom Development Project with a project cost of Rs 46 crores and covering 11,153 weavers has been taken up in Dakshin Dinajpur district. Skill development and tool kit distribution involving Rs 5 crore was taken during 2012-13 under this project. The Handloom Cluster Project which started in 2008-09 with 28 clusters, covers 39 clusters in 2012-13.

297 Weavers Cooperatives & 1407 individual weavers were covered during the period under Revival, Reform & Restructuring package for handloom sector involving Rs 24 crores.

To facilitate access to credit by small weavers Credit Cards were issued to 4966 weavers. Using this facility these weavers could access Rs 11 crore Bank Loan.

3,81,734 Weavers' families have been covered under the Health Insurance Scheme upto 2012-13. About 6700 artisans were covered under the Old Age Pension Scheme and 43,000 covered under MG Bunkar Bima Yojna.

A Handloom office and weaver's training centre was set up in Kurseong. Marketing Incentive involving Rs 18 crores has been disbursed to primary and apex cooperative societies in the

handloom sector.

Tantuja's sales increased to average Rs 75 crore per annum during the period as against an average of Rs 50 crore during the preceding two years.

In the sericulture sector, 4555 acres of land have been brought under the extension scheme which has generated employment to 26,960 people during 2011 -2013. Infrastructure up gradation work worth Rs 11 crore has been taken up for sericulture farms. Significant increase in the consumption of Tasar disease free laying has been achieved in the Jangal Mahal area of the state. Added to this is successful harvest of crops (50-55 cocoons per laying) which led to increase in remunerative price of cocoons ranging from Rs 1800 to Rs 2400 which is among the highest remuneration country-wide. On the lines of Silk Bandhu, Tasar Bandhu scheme has been launched in this area to assist farmers as Resource Persons for all farm activities related to sericulture. 2,31,202 village industry units and 312 khadi units are operational in the state providing employment to 14 lakh and 73,000 people respectively.

Infrastructure of 27 Industrial Estates (IE) has been upgraded during the period involving Rs 12 crore. Rs 13 crore

is being spent for upgrading the IE of Durgapur and Udayan. Fire safety systems will be set up in 9 IEs of Kolkata in 2013-14 involving Rs 6 crore.

With focus on jute, readymade garments, agro processing and light engineering the Industrial Estate at Rezinagar, Murshidabad is supposed to be available to the industry within 2013-14. Being set up over an area of 183 acres with an infrastructure cost of Rs 66 crores, it will provide around 1200 plots to these industries. Similarly another IE will get operational within 2013-14 at Ambari-Falakata Jalpaiguri. Potential industries that will use the 700 plots in this Rs 36 crore, 118 acre IE include agro processing, wood and cane furniture, processing of forest produce, storage battery and food processing.





Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

government has incessantly trying towards socio economic development of minorities. Many of the significant social or economic shortcomings cited by the Sachar Committee addressed during the past two years. New and innovative programs and schemes such as honorariums for Imams & Moazzins, bi-cycles for girls students of Madrasahs studying from class IX to XII, scholarship under Talent Support Program for students securing less than 50% marks etc have been introduced during the last couple years. A few of the noteworthy feats and notches attained in the past two years are summed up as under:-

Aliah University:

During 2011-12, the new government has allotted 20 acres of land for Aliah University campus at Rajarhat; construction work of which has started with a sanction of Rs. 236 crore. Further, construction work of Aliah University Campus at Gorachand Road is in progress. An amount of Rs. 62 Crore has been approved for this Campus with an area of 2.4 acres.

Hostels for boys and girls: Construction

work for 111 hostels (68 under MsDP and 43 under state plan) have been taken up involving a cost of Rs 99.66 crores. Further, a working women hostel is near completion at Dilkhusha Street, Park Circus involving a total cost of Rs 1.32 crores. The hostel shall accommodate 71 nos. of hostellers.

Third Haj House – Five acres of land has been allotted for construction of third Haj House at Rajarhat, New Town. Construction of the new Haj complex with all modern facilities has started. The project cost is Rs. 90 crores. In the year 2012, 11658 Haj pilgrims of West Bengal visited Saudi Arabla to perform obligatory Haj. Figures of pilgrimage for Haj for 2010 and 2011 were 9589 and 9783 respectively.

MsDP schemes:

The MsDP an area development program was launched in the 12 identified Minority Concentrated Districts (MCD). The objective was to address the development deficits by creating socio economic infrastructure and providing basic amenities. Out of total approved schemes of 75189 units 62560(24915 completed during 2008-2011 and rest 37645 completed during

last two years) units i.e 93% have since been completed.

ITI and Polytechnics:

With a view to boosting up technical training and employability of the Minority youth steps have been taken to establish 24 ITIs and 7 polytechnics in minority concentrated areas. With infrastructural support under MsDP all these will be maintained and run by Technical Education & Training Department of this government.

Integrated Minority Development Program (IMDP):

With a view to extend developmental works in non-MsDP districts, this scheme has been introduced in seven districts. During the last two years 2417 units of works similar to MsDP has been taken up involving Rs. 46 crores.

Boundary wall for graveyards: Protection of the public graveyards and safeguarding the same from encroachment and defilation was taken up. A total of 736 boundary walls have been taken up during the last 2 yrs at a cost of Rs 40.28 crores.

Minority Bhawan: A decision was taken to construct Minority Bhawan in all the districts to ensure easy access for the minorities by providing a single window facility for all programmes and schemes of the government. Till now six such Bhawans have been completed in the districts of North24 Parganas, Murshidabad, Birbhum, Dakshin Dinajpur, Bankura and Darjeeling and have since been functioning.

Honorariums to Imams and Moazzins: Imams and Moazzins hold a respectable position in the Muslim society. Besides leading mandatory prayers Imams and Moazzins also guide the community towards subscribing a codified and disciplined life in the society. They contribute a lot in mobilizing and sensitizing the community in execution of different schemes, including health and hygiene, of the government. The Board of Wakfs has been disbursing monthly honorarium to Imams and Moazzin @ Rs 2500/- and @ Rs 1,000/only. 27154 Imams and 16898 Moazzins totaling 44052 beneficiaries have been given honorarium worth Rs 97.92 crores.

Promotion of Urdu:- This Government has notified the West Bengal Official Language (Amendment) Act, 2012 which has come into force from December 2012 in areas having more than 10% Urdu speaking population. The legislation has in effect redressed

the long pending demand of Urdu speaking people to interact in their mother tongue with the Government offices. People who are resident of West Bengal and whose mother tongue is Hindi, Urdu, Nepali, Oriya, Santhali and Gurukukhi languages have been notified as Linguistic Minorities in West Bengal.

Bicycles for Girl students Madrasahs:

To encourage education of the Muslim girl child and to curb drop out among girl students (thereby ensuring family reforms) this new scheme has been initiated by this Government during 2012-13. About 1,60,002 girl students studying from class IX to class XII have been provided bicycles involving a fund of Rs 46 crores. Sizeable increase in student population of class IX has been noted in the current year.

Vocational/Skill Development Training - Since a large section of the Muslim workers are engaged in employment, skill development and credit related initiatives need to be tailored for such groups. Keeping this aim in view the department has been providing skill development/vocational training to the youths to enhance their employment opportunities. coaching is also being provided to the

youths for appearing in competitive examinations. During the last two years 2,44,161 persons with a provision of Rs 40.21 crores have been provided vocational/skill development training.

Scholarship & Loan:

The WBMD&FC in association with Wakf Board, Aliah University and Urdu Academy has been able to increase its beneficiary coverage with improved services fulfilling the urges aspirations of the minorities in West Bengal.

There has been a quantum jump in the number of approved scholarship over the last two years.

A significantly larger proportion of Muslim workers are engaged in small proprietary enterprises and their participation in the formal sector employment is significantly less. For the purpose of employment generation this Department has spent Rs. 270,58 Crore in the Term loan, Micro finance and Minority Women Empowerment Programme categories. About 1,57,851 vouths and women have been financed during last two years. Housing -Providing shelter to the poor is one of our objectives for ensuring improvement in quality of life. Four numbers of housing schemes are under execution by the department. An amount of Rs. 294.63 Crores has been utilised for construction of 48,565 units of Housing under Geetanjali Housing Scheme, Housing for destitute minority women rehabilitation programme, IAY under Spl BRGF and IAY under MsDP programmes during last two years. Madrasah Education: The following initiatives have been taken by the Directorate of Madrasah Education:-

(1) Printing of 80,000 nationalized text

books were carried out this year for children at primary stage. The figure for 2011-12 stood at 52350.

(2) 174870 girls students studying in primary schools were provided dress grants in 2012-13. In the year 2011-12 the number

was 112500.

- (3) While 424 science laboratories being strengthened in secondary schools in 2012-13, the number was 158 in 2011-12.
- (4) Besides several other schemes viz. improvement of libraries, reading rooms; common rooms for girls, drinking water, toilets;

support for furniture and equipments for madrasah, additional class rooms for junior high schools have also been taken up.

Upgradation of Madrasah: During the last two years 4 numbers have been up-graded from Jr High to High, 17 nos. from High to

Higher Secondary and 6 nos. from Alim to Fazil. Further, 6 new setup Madrasahs have been sanctioned.

Unaided Madrasah: The government

has decided mainstreaming Madrasahs for ensurina quality education by providing affiliation to Madrasahs under the un-aided Madrasah scheme, 1400 applications have been received till date against which approval to 150 Madrasahs have been granted.

Upcoming projects under pipeline

(1) Rural haat shed for improving marketing facilities for artisans and cultivators are being taken up in 29 locations @ Rs 3 cores each under state plan. Setting up of 16 rural haat sheds under MsDP plan @ Rs 1 crore each are also under implementation. Further, programme of construction of 121 nos. of new marketing hubs have also been taken.

(2)Minority medical college along with a multi speciality medical hospital with 150 MBBS students and 750 bed capacity is being set up at Nalmuni Mouza, PS Bhangar of South 24 Parganas.



Municipal Affairs Departments has necessitated the urban local bodies to speed up the creation of both physical and social infrastructure in the urban areas: from drinking water to drainage, from housing and transportation to the beautification of urban areas and preservation of urban green with an aim of not only to provide a better living environment for the citizens but also to make the urban centres, the focal point of growth and economic development.

- KOLKATA MUNICIPAL CORPORATION completed Beautification of River front from Prinsep Ghat to River Traffic Training Institute for a length of 1.6 km.
- Completed restoration of 14 Ghats over River Ganges.
- Land-scaping and beautification of 16 roads have been completed.
- Construction of a Gate on Kalighat Road has been completed.
- NABADIGANTA INDUSTRIAL TOWNSHIP completed installation of trident Poles and other beautification works within their jurisdiction.

E-GOVERNANCE

- A comprehensive e-governance module, with integrated financial accounting system developed under KUSP for all 40 KMA Urban Local Bodies and the step for role out to remaining ULBs taken up and so far 31 ULBs have been completed.
- Video Conferencing FACILITY- 77 out of the remaining non-KMA 82 Urban Local Bodies have been covered, apart from 42 KMA ULBS, all Development Authorities ,State Level Offices of Municipal Affairs and Urban Development Department, which have already covered.

WATER SUPPLY

- DPR for 6 More towns has been technically appraised by CPHEEO, GOI and awaiting sanction under UIDSSMT
- Work for sanctioned 22 water supply schemes are in various stages. Expected that 6 more water supply schemes will be completed by June, 2013 and by December, 2013, another 4 are likely to be completed.
- Under Special BRGF, work for all 5 towns has been partly completed and

are likely to be commissioned by March, 2014.

URBAN BEAUTIFICATION

- KMC has taken up the job of River Front beautification from River Traffic Training Institute to Babu Ghat for a stretch of further 400 m.
- Works for expansion of Nimtala Burning Ghat & R.N. Tagore Memorial Ghat have been taken up.

Work for beautification of road in front of Alipur Zoo has been taken up.

FIRE SAFETY MEASURES - A High Powered Committee constituted to examine the existing provisions of Building Rules and submit proposals to suggest changes. An Interim Report has been submitted and the committee will submit its final recommendations by April, 2013.

AMMENDMENT OF BUILDING RULE- A comprehensive proposal for amendments of KMC Building Rules have been sent to State Level Technical Committee for their opinion and thereafter necessary process for amendments will be made.

CONVERSION OF INSANITARY LATRINE INTO SANITARY LATRINES – Work of construction of 5200 sanitary latrines have been completed. Proposals for

preparation of DPR for another 69,000 new units are under process and will be submitted shortly for sanction under revised ILCS programme.

SOCIO ECONOMIC AND CASTE CENSUS FOR URBAN AREAS has been taken up under supervision of SUDA and survey works for 126 towns have already been completed. This is the first of its kind in the urban areas of the State.

SURVEY ON IDENTIFICATION OF MANUAL SCAVENGERS has been taken up in 125 ULBs in order to eradicate the in-human practice of carrying night soil by head load and for their rehabilitation. Besides, identification of insanitary latrines for their conversion into sanitary latrines have also been taken up.

RAJIV AWAS YOJANA has been extended to 50 towns. Preparation of DPRs for Pilot projects has been taken up in 11 towns and so far 2 DPRs sent for necessary sanction. Rajib Awas Yojana Mission and State Level Sanctioning and Monotoring Committee constituted under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Chief Minister, West Bengal. More Pilot Projects and preparation of SFCPOA in cities are underway.





The North Bengal Development Department came into being w.e.f 8th July, 2011.

361 ongoing projects / schemes funded by Uttar Banga Unnayan Parshad, where little progress was made, where closely monitored and 263 schemes were completed. Out of the remaining 98 schemes 33 schemes recommended by DMs have been taken up by NBDD for completion.

+ Administrative Approval for the construction of 7 new Govt. colleges (Dhupguri, Ghoksadanga, Nishiganj, Banarhat (Hindi), Chopra, Manikchak & at Kumarganj) has been received from the Finance Department and construction works of Ghoksadanga, Nishiganj and Kumarganj & Chopra Colleges have started.

- → The construction of Bus Terminus at Harirampur, Buniyadpur, Hemtabad, Balurghat (NBSTC) and at Malda have been started.

The construction work of drainage scheme at Shantinagar, under Dabgram GP of Rajganj Block of Jalpaiguri District has been started. The project cost of the scheme is Rs. 1653.87 lakhs. Once this is completed water logging problem of entire area, during monsoon, will be solved. More than one lakh local inhabitants will be benefited by this scheme.

Construction work of a bridge at Samarnagar, Siliguri, has been completed.

Policy Issues

•In 2012, the West Bengal Panchayat (Second Amendment) Act, 2012 was passed to enhance the extent of reservation of seats and offices in each tier of Panchayats for women from one-third to one-half (from "not less than one-third" to "not exceeding one-half"). Besides, reservation of seats and offices in each tier of Panchayats was introduced for Backward Classes along with reservation for SC and ST, subject to a ceiling of fifty percent taken together.

MGNREGS

•MGNREGS was introduced in February 2007 in 10 districts of the State and later extended to the entire state. Till 2010-11 financial year, total expenditure under the programme was Rs. 6947.34 crore. In the last two years (2011-12 and 2012-13), expenditure level reached Rs. 6835.97 crore. During 2012-13, the State could spend Rs. 3909.27 crore which was 94% of the State's available balance. This was second in the country in terms of percentage of utilization against available fund. Actually, if we include

the committ3ed expenditure against work executed in last financial year and could not be paid due to paucity of fund, our expenditure was actually as high as Rs. 4480.53 crore which is 109% of the available fund.

•In the last quarter of 2011-12, Rs. 1688.71 crore was utilized, 114.47 lakh families were provided job on an average of 33 days of employment per family was provided.

•In 2012-13, because of consistently high level of performance, the state could secure further revision of Labour Budget from the Government of India thereby accepting tentative person-day generation at 18.33 crore.

•At the end of March 2013, the districts reported person-days generation to the tune of 19.97 crore which is substantially higher than person-days generated in any previous year and 109 percent of the approved labour budget. •Based on the performance of the State in the current year, the State's labour budget for 2013-14 has been enhanced to 22.61 crore person-days which in terms of funding translates to Rs. 6031.59 crore out of which Rs. 5662.57 crore is supposed to be central allocation.

PMGSY

 In PMGSY, between 2005-06 and 2011-12 financial years, 2018 roads covering 8375 KM with project cost of Rs. 4623.94 crore were sanctioned by the Ministry of Rural Development. Average sanction per year during the period comes to 288 roads, 1196 KM road length and Rs.660.56 crore project cost. In 2012-13 alone 1425 roads covering 6144 KM with project cost of Rs. 3483.17 croe were sanctioned which is a remarkable achievement.

•During 2012-13, proposal for another 1101 roads with 6177 KM road length and estimated cost of Rs. 3171.40 crore have been proposed to the Ministry of rural Development for approval.

•In IAP district alone, sanction for 582 roads with 2626 K road length and an estimated cost of Rs. 1491.20 core has been received. Proposals for additional 478 roads entailing 1623 KM road length and estimated cost of Rs. 866.54 core have been submitted to the MoRD which is likely to be sanctioned in 2013-14.

•In 2011-12, the State could build 1154 K.M. of metal road, connecting 243 habitations. Fund utilization was 85.67%, which is 18% more than the achievement recorded in the previous year.

•During 2012-13, the State could build 1250 KM of metal roads connecting 203 habitations of 1000+ population category, 233 habitations with 500+ population and 102 habitations of 250+ population.

•During 2013-14, the State plans to construct 1134 roads entailing 5160 KM of road length.

SGSY/NRLM

 The State Rural Livelihood Mission has been established and made functional to provide livelihood support to rural families.

•Under SGSY, in 2011-12, 34761 SHGs were formed, 40938 SHGs passed

Grade-I, 29605 SHGs passed Grade-II, 27917 SHGs took up economic activity after passing Grade-I and 8463 SHGs took up economic activities after passing Grade-II. 128 % of the credit target was disbursed and per capita investment rose to Rs. 23570.49.

•In 2012-13 (Upto Feb.' 2013), 26810 SHGs were formed, 23195 SHGs passed Grade I, 19995 SHGs passed Grade II, 22342 SHGs took up economic activity after passing Grade I and 6216 SHGs took up economic activities after passing Grade II. 60.80% of the credit target was disbursed and per capita investment has been Rs. 23932.01.

•Credit mobilization for the SHGs substantially improved in 2011-12. The following table shows the pattern

•Steps have been taken to set up State Marketing Hub, District Marketing Hubs in all districts. For setting up district hats land in most of the district have been identified the process of preparation of the DPR is undergoing.

NSAP

•We could provide assistance to 10.68 lakh rural BPL old age pensioners, 7.39 lakh rural BPL widow pensioners and 0.38 lakh rural disabled pensioners under different pension schemes under NSAP. The lower age for sanction of old age pension has been lowered from 65 to 60 years.

•In urban areas number of old age pensioners, widow pensioners and

disabled pensioners were 2.42 lakh, 2.11 lakh and 0.09 lakh respectively.

•Since October 2012, financial support to the widow and disable pensioners has been raised to Rs.600.00 per month. State share of these pensions have been increased to Rs 300 per month from 200 per month.

•Under NFBS, central assistance to the beneficiaries has been enhanced from Rs. 10,000.00 to Rs.20,000.00. For the first time state has added a share of Rs 20,000 per beneficiary which means the support has been increased from Rs 20000 to Rs 40000.

Rs. 925.76 crore could be utilized (in 2010-11 expenditure was Rs. 751.41 crore) and 1,95,770 houses could be constructed (in 2010-11 houses constructed was to the tune of I,80, 520). In 2012-13 192285 houses could be constructed with an approximate expenditure of Rs.1000.00 crore

•Training of elected Panchayat representatives and the officials associated with the Panchayats received major thrust and the following table shows year-wise performance of the State in this sector:

In 2012-13, total IHHL constructed till February 2013 was 506900; whereas 16267 school toilets and 10942 anganwadi toilets could be constructed. •Fully sanitized Gram Panchayats (Nirmal Grams) has increased from 1041 to 1077.

•With convergence support from MGNREGS, the project cost for individual household latrine has been enhanced to Rs. 10000 for eligible job-card holders.

On completion of training on Solid & Liquid Waste Management (SLWM), pilot SLWM project has been finalized for one Gram Panchayat in each of the districts. All such 19 SLWM projects have been launched.

ISGPP

World supported The Bank Institutional Strengthening of Gram Panchayats Project (ISGPP) started in 1000 selected GPs in nine districts with the objective to develop institutionally strengthened Gram Panchayats in West Bengal. The project involves a cost of US\$235 million, out of which IDA credit is US\$200 million and counterpart financing available from State Government is US\$35 million.

•The Project became effective on 3rd September, 2010 and is scheduled to close on 31st December, 2015.

•483 GPs got two tranches of funds in 2010-11 FY and 2011-12 FY. 359 GPs got one tranche of fund in 2011-12 FY. In total 842 GPs got Block Grant in 2011-12. In 2012-13, a total of 794 GPs got Block Grant.

•The total allocation of Block Grant has

•The average allocation per G.P. has increased from Rs.9.15 Lakh in 2010-11 to Rs.12.96 Lakh in 2011-12

 Project Coordination Units at the state and district levels are established to provide support to GPs & P&RDD and being functioning at desired pace.

 A major part of the process of hiring of key positions on contract basis in the ISGPP Cell and District Coordination Units has been completed.

 All the personnel engaged under ISGP Project have started working on full time basis.

It indeed happens to be a vital part of Human Resource Development Programme.

- •In the year 2011-2012, 2410 Schools and 412 Colleges of the State participated in the Youth Parliament Competition & Quiz Contest
- •For the year 2012- 2013, Workshop on Youth Parliament Competition & Quiz Contest for Schools and that for Colleges were held in the Nauser Ali Hall, Assembly House, Kolkata on 09/10/2012.
- •Block/Municipality and District Level Competition have been held in the districts.
- 7. Further, in order to propagate the patriotic feelings and create democratic mindset among our school and college-going youngsters, Essay Writing Competition was held for the first time in the year 2012 659 essays from Schools and 124 essays from Colleges were received and evaluated.



Paschimanchal Unnayan **Affairs** Department was created in July, 2006 to intensify the development works in 74 Blocks of five districts viz. Bankura, Paschim Midnapoore, Purulia, Birbhum and Burdwan by way of filling critical gaps in all sectors of development activities. For the last two financial years, total budget allocation under Plan Head was Rs. 351.26 crore in addition to Rs. 60.00 crore under RIDF. In fact, the budget allocation was increased by three times than that of previous years, The Deptt. has given top priority under different sectors of Irrigation, Agriculture, Helath, Supply of drinking water, conservation of water & soil education employment generations etc.

- In the year 2011-2012 the budget allocation was increased from Rs. 60.00 crore in 2010-2011 to about 3 times i.e; to Rs. 180.63 crore and during 2012-2013 the budget allocation was Rs. 170.60 crore.
- Plans were chalked out through meetings held in districts with involvement of DMs/BDOs and various line departments for proper utilization of fund so received.
- It yielded better results, making it possible to release about Rs. 264.00 crore in the last 22 months in 2011-2012 and 2012-2013 for execution of 4701 various types of schemes.
- Rs. 176.15 crore has so far been utilized

to complete 3005 schemes. The work of the rest schemes are in progress.

The Personnel & Administrative Reforms Department is the Cadre Controlling Authority for IAS, WBCS (Executive), West Bengal Secretariat Service and Assistants & Typists in the West Bengal Secretariat. The attached Offices of P&AR Department are (i) Administrative Training Institute Resident Commissioner, West Bengal at New Delhi (iii) Vigilance Commission (iv) West Bengal Information Commission and (v) Lokayukta, West Bengal. Allotment of fund for development of infrastructure in district and sub-divisional level is another function this Department. Nodal lt acts as Department for Implementation of two important Acts, viz. The Right to Information Act, 2005' which is a Central Act and 'The West Bengal Lokayukta Act, 20031

Major Decisions and Achievements of the Department:

•The upper age limit in case of recruitment of group 'C' and 'D' categories of employees in government jobs has been raised from 32 years to 40 years in case of General Category, to 45 years in the cases of Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes candidates and 43 years in the case of Other Backward Class candidates.

 Staff Selection Commission has been constituted by the State Government vide Notification No. 320-PAR(Genl.) dated 20.02.2012 to recruit non- PSC Officers and Staff for Regional Offices. It has started functioning from 01.03.2012 •In pursuance of decision taken at all-political party meeting held on 3rd 19th August 2011 State Government has accorded in- principle approval for bifurcation of 4 (four) districts Jalpaiguri, Paschim Medinipur, Bardhaman and North 24 Parganas. Concurrence of High Court on the proposals is awaited.

•For better and single point delivery of various citizen centric services State Government has approved the proposal for creation of a separate Civil Administrative Unit for Kolkata. Concurrence of Kolkata High Court has been obtained.

*For better co-ordination development and law and Order administration proposal the limits reorganisation of Sub-division and creation of two new sub-divisions namely Jhalda Manbazar in the District of Purulia has been given in-principle approval by the State Government. Concurrence of Kolkata High Court to the proposal is awaited.

 The Vigilance Commission has been strengthened by turning the one-man Commission to a three-man
Commission so that it may become

 more effective and accountable. One of the main activities of the Commission will be to probe into various complaints under the provisions of the Anti Corruption Act 1988.

•An Anti Corruption Branch under the direct control of P & AR Department has been set up vide Notification No. 655-P & AR (Vig.) dated 02.08.2012 to strengthen the anti-corruption machinery of the State Government.

*From 1st December' 2011, 11 (eleven) departments have got a separate Drawing and Disbursing Officer (DDO) in respect of the Secretariat-Establishment for smooth and speedy functioning of various works related to Pay & Accounts by separating the D.D.O. from Accounts Officer West Bengal Secretariat. From 1/4/2012 it has been extended to 34

more Departments.

•E-office and e-governance on pilot basis has been taken up by the Department. North 24 Parganas district has been included for implementation of Quality Management System, "Sevottam" by Department of Administrative Reforms and Public Grievances Government of India.

•The West Bengal Civil Service (Executive) Recruitment Rules, 1978 has been amended in order to enhance scopes for promotion from feeder services to WBCS(Exe.) cadre.

•WBCS (Exe.) Officers will not depend solely on the result of recruitment examination conducted by PSC. At the induction level training the Officers will be subjected to assessment for another 200 marks and taking into consideration the scores of both PSC and induction level examination the final merit list will be prepared.

•Resident Commissioner, West Bengal

has arranged for online reservation facility for tourists, planning to visit various destinations in West Bengal. A Media Centre has been opened at Banga Bhavan for an exchange of Information. A web page titled 'Media reflection' has been created to collate all the news items pertaining to West Bengal in the print media. The centres emergency contact No. (toll free) is 1800-11-3300.

•Administrative approval for Construction of a new Training and Hostel Block for ATI has been accorded with an estimated cost of Rs. 1136.57 lakh.

•Setting up of 3(Three) Regional Training Centres in the Districts of Darjeeling, Coochbehar and Howrah has been taken up.

 Two years' Child Care Leave has been allowed to the women employees of the State Government.





- Introduction As envisaged in the Rules of Business, the reconstituted Department of Planning
 (erstwhile Development & Planning Department) formulates the State Annual Plans and the Five Year
 Plans in tandem with the other Departments of the State Government and the Planning Commission
 of India.
- Annual Plan The Plan Outlay approved by the Planning Commission, Government of India for the Year 2011-12, 2012-13 and 2013-14 are Rs. 22,214 crore, Rs. 25910 crore and Rs. 30314 crore respectively. For 2013-14, the Plan size has been increased by 17%.

Bidhyak Elaka Unnayan Prakalpa(BEUP) –

During 2011-12, Rs. 177.00 crore were distributed among 295 MLAs @ Rs. 60.00 lakh per MLA per annum for taking up developmental works in their areas as per demands of the local population.

During 2012-13, Rs. 164.10 crore have been released. 289 MLAs have received the 1st instalment and 258 MLAs have received 2nd instalment.

Member of Parliament Local Area Development Scheme(MPLADS): Rs. 1863.47 crore expenditure have been made out of fund release of Rs. 1981.50 crore during 2012-2013

Integrated Action Plan(IAP): Under IAP, developmental schemes are taken up in LWE (Left Wing Extremism) affected districts for the well-being of the tribal population. During 2010-2011, Integrated Action Plan was initiated in the District of Paschim Medinipur. Planning Commission of India granted Rs. 25 crore in this regard for 11 numbers of LWE Blocks in Paschim Medinipur. Total 635 number of

schemes were taken. All are completed.
In the financial year 2011-12, Planning

In the financial year 2011-12, Planning Commission granted Rs. 30 crore to each of the Districts of Paschim Medinipur(11 numbers of LWE Blocks viz. Binpur-I. Binpur-II, Garbeta-II, Gopiballavpur-I, Gopiballavpur-II, Jamboni, Jhargram, Medinipur Sadar, Nayagram, Salboni, Sankrail), Bankura(4 numbers of LWE Blocks viz: Raipur, Ranibundh, Sarenga and Simlapal), and Purulia (9 numbers of LWE Blocks viz Arsha, Balarampur, Baghmundi, Barabazar, Bundwan. Jhalda-I, Jhalda-II, Manbazar-II, Joypur). In the year 2011-12, the total number of projects for Paschim Midnapore was 869, all are implemented. The total number of projects for Bankura was 393. All are complete. The total number of projects for Purulia was 824, out of which 805 have been implemented (97% utilization).

In the financial year 2012-13, Planning Commission has sanctioned Rs. 30 crore each to Paschim Medinipur, Bankura and Purulia. The total number of


projects for Paschim Medinipur was 640, out of which 73 schemes have been implemented. The total no. of projects for Bankura was 195, out of which 77 are implemented. The total no. of projects for Purulia was 322, out of which 184 have been implemented. All the remaining schemes will be completed by May 2013.

Under IAP, generally the schemes are Integrated Child Development Services Centres, Community Halls, Roads, Drinking Water schemes, Markets, Culverts, Ashram Hostels, Class Rooms, Ration Shops etc are constructed. The projects are being implemented under the direct supervision of a committee of District Magistrate, Superintendent of Police and Divisional Forest Officer of the district.

In July 2012, Planning Commission reported that West Bengal is 1st in the country for both physical and financial progress of projects undertaken under IAP.







Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

In the Power sector, the State is able to meet all the demand successfully which is attributed to proper perspective planning and efficient and productive administrative processes specially in the fields of coal procurement, generation, transmission and the several areas of distribution. Efficient management of consumer needs is being emphasized which is expected to contribute to large improvements in the quality of consumer based services. Rural electrification programme has been given the highest priority and in the next two years it is expected to achieve 100% rural household electrification throughout the State.

- Construction of a new 250 MW (No. 6) power plant of Santaldih Thermal Power Station completed on a war-footing. Started commercial operation from 30th September, 2011.
- WBSETCL has completed Muriganga River Crossing Line and has extended grid power to Sagar Island from the mainland from 19th October, 2011. Rural electrification work has started in Sagar Island.
- Grid power extended to Gosaba island in the Sunderbans (Commissioned on 16th April, 2012).

- Public Grievance disposal system in Power & NES Department has been modernized to reduce response time.
- First ever Policy on Co-generation and Generation of Electricity from Renewable Energy Sources has been launched.
- A new Centre of Excellence in the field of Renewable Energy will be established soon by the State Government in collaboration with the Bengal Engineering and Science University, Shibpur. For this purpose an MOU has already been signed between WBREDA and BESU in February, 2013.
- Capacity of grid connected Solar Power generation station of West Bengal Green Energy Development Corporation Limited at Jamuria enhanced from 1 MW to 2 MW.
- Under Remote Village Electrification programme in Renewable Energy sector, 1000 numbers of Solar Street Lights have been installed and Solar Home lighting system have been provided to 3375 numbers of families in addition to existing system.
- Record power generation in excess of demand conserved through Power Banking process.
- Construction work of Unit No. 3 and 4 of 500 MW capacity each in Sagardighi

Thermal Power Plant under WBPDCL and construction work of Unit No. 8 of 250 MW capacity at Durgapur Projects Ltd. are going on in full swing.

- Renovation work of 210 MW (unit No. 5) of Bandel Thermal Power station (World Bank aided) started. Also renovation and modernization of Unit No. 6 of Durgapur Projects Ltd. has been taken up in 2012-13.
- Number of WBSEDCL consumers crossed the 1 Crore milestone and in March 2013 it stands at 1.25 crores.
- State-of-the-Art Data Centre and Disaster Recovery Centre of WBSEDCL first of its kind in India made operational.
- Contracts awarded and work is going on in full swing in Comprehensive Rural Electrification programme in 11 (Eleven) Backward Districts under Special Backward Region Grant Fund (BRGF) to cover all categories of consumers.
- The State Govt. has taken a number of initiatives towards achieving better customer satisfaction during this period which includes intensive condition monitoring of equipments of 33/11 AV sub-stations, deployment of over 1100 HT & LT Mobile Maintenance Vans and installation of Interactive Voice Response System (IVRS) for complaint

registration by customers. For payment of Energy bills facilities like e-payment, automated teller payment, spot billing systems etc. have been introduced in selected customer care centres.

- During 2012-13, 24 nos. of new 33/11 KV sub-stations have been constructed and over 12,000 (twelve thousand) new distribution transformers of various capacities have been erected across the State by WBSEDCL.
- During 2012-13, 8 (eight) new Divisional offices and 14 (fourteen) new Customer Care Centres have been opened and 50 (fifty) Customer Care Centres have been modernised for providing better services to the customers.
- The new Connection Scheme where BPL consumes get power infrastructure and connection free of cost and the scheme for APL consumers (with load demand upto 200 watts) where they can avail new connections for Rs. 379/- only have become very popular. In 2012/13, fourteen lakh new connections have been provided under this scheme which is an all time record for the State.
- For quick disposal of applications for connections to shallow tube wells a unique initiative was taken up in 2012 13 to allow for quick short-term connections. In this system, the applicant was required to deposit Rs. 1400/- per HP one time for availing connection up to 125 days. During the last Boro season around 30,000 number of such short term connections were given.
- WBSEDCL successfully completed the Renovation and Modernisation works of 35 years old Jaldhaka Hydel Project along with addition of one new unit of 9 MW at stage – I, commissioned in August 2012.
- Lodhama Inter-connection Scheme meant for interconnecting the Lodhama River with the existing Rammam tunnel to utilize the water of the river Lodhama for supplementing the Generation in non-monsoon months, commissioned on 29th January, 2013. The Scheme will enable augmentation of generation in non-monsoon period by 30 MW.
- WBSETCL has commissioned sub-station at Dalkhola (220kV), Kalna (132kV), Khatra (132kV), Kakdwip(132kV), Kurseong(132kV), Sankrail Food Park at Howrah District (132kV) and Kharagpur (400kV). A Gas Insulated sub-station (GIS) (132kV) at Salt Lake and another at Bagnan(132kV) have also been commissioned which are first of its kind in the government sector in the State. GIS requires substantially

less quantum of land and also requires less maintenance.


- · WBSETCL has taken up construction of EHV sub-stations at Foundry Park (220kV) in Howrah, Hura (220kV) in Purulia, Food Park (132kV) in Howrah. Sirakol (132kV) in 24 Paraganas (S) and 132kV GIS at Kuli (Murshidabad), Mathabangha Khejuria (Malda), (Coochbehar) & Najirpur (Nadia). These expected projects are to commissioned by 2013-14 and 1292 MVA will be added to the system. An addition of 568 CKM of transmission lines in various parts of the State has been planned during 2013-14.
- Installation of 220kV GIS at Vidyasagar Park (West Midnapur) and Dharampur (Nadia) and 132kV sub-station at Ujanoo (Darjeeling) are expected to be completed by 2014-15 and work on two 400kV sub-stations at Gokarna (Murshidabad) and Chanditala (Hooghly) are expected to commence in '13-14.
- Number of new 33 kV sub-station added for Rural Electrification Extension Work by WBSETCL is 7.
- Capacity addition by WBSETCL from May 2011 to March 2013:
- a) Transformation capacity :3441 MVA,
 b) Transmission Line : 559 CKM
- · In recognition of its continuing quest

for excellence in performance, the West Bengal State Electricity Transmission Company Ltd. (WBSETCL) was adjudged to be the winner of 'Power Line Awards 2012' in the category of 'Best Performing Transmission Company' in India. The coveted award was handed over by Hon'ble Minister of Power, Govt. of India to WBSETCL on 15th May, 2012 at New Delhi.

 West Bengal has been named 2nd in All India ranking of power distribution companies in March, 2013 as per rating conducted by the Power Finance Corporation with the help of ICRA and CARE.

Pipeline Projects

- 'In principle' clearance for setting up of 5th Unit of 500 MW capacity at Sagardighi Thermal Power Project (Phase II) at an estimated cost of Rs. 3518.43 crore has been given by the State Government.
- WBSEDCL is undertaking pre-project activity for setting up of Turga Pumped Storage Project of 1,000 MW capacity in Purulia district. They are also preparing DPR for a 900 MW Bandhu Pumped Storage Project in Purulia district.





There are 13 PSEs functioning under the administrative control of **Public** Enterprises Department. Out of them 5 PSEs viz. Durgapur Chemicals Ltd., Britannia Engineering Ltd., Gluconate Heath Ltd., Westinghouse Saxby Farmer Ltd. and Shalimar Works Ltd. have been restructured and remained profitable for number of years. But after extending 5th Pay Commission's benefits to all these PSEs, they have gone into financial crisis and are trying hard to become viable. 3 PSEs viz. National Iron & Steel Co. Ltd., Lily Products Ltd. and Neo Pipes & Tubes Co. Ltd. have no production for the last 5 years. In the **Blood Bag Division of Electro-Medical &** Allied Industries Ltd. also the production has come to a halt since 2009. However, Belghoria Unit of the company is performing more or less The remaining 4 PSEs viz. Saraswaty Press Ltd., Mackintosh Burn Ltd., W.B. State Warehousing Corpn. and Eastern Distilleries & Chemicals Ltd. are performing satisfactorily reasonable margin of profit.

Some decisions and achievements of the PSEs under the administrative control of this department during the period from May,2011 to March,2013 are as follows:-

• Durgapur Chemicals Ltd.: The company's decisions are (i) replacement of Membrane Cell Caustic Soda Plant, (ii)

Installation of Pipeline for COG/ CBM, (iii) Procurement of Salt from Gujarat and (iv) Revamping of Chlorine downstream use and storage facilities to enhance productivity. Due of lack of fund the company could not start all the schemes. They only have made arrangement for direct procurement of SALT from Open market at Gujrat to reduce the dependence on Traders and get a better price. They also have taken initiatives for replacement of outlived Membrane of their Membrane Cell Caustic Soda Plant very recently.

 Gluconate Health Ltd. The company's decisions are: (i) Upgradation of Schedule M-GMP to cGMP certification and (ii) initiation of Tetanus Toxid Vaccine Project. Upgradation Schedule "M" GMP to attain WHO-GMP certification is a continuous process. It is mandatory to comply with necessary guidelines issued from time to time by the Drug Control Authority. The company has taken up the project very recently with the fund released in favour of the company at the fag end of the last financial year 2012-13 by this department. The company has recently secured substantial orders for supply of medicine from Government of Andhra The works for ambitious Pradesh. Tetanus Toxid Vaccine Project have not been initiated as the Techno-Feasibility Report has not yet been received.

• Shalimar Works (1980) Ltd. The company's decision is to modernise the Shipyard with provision for Slipways to launch Vessels and expansion of Jetty. Project report for modernization of Shipyard has got Board approval. The company successful launched four

vessels towards execution of orders from Indian Navy.

• Saraswaty Press Ltd. has made highest turnover this year since it became a Government company in the year 1979 and it is likely to reach Rs. 110.00 Crore compares to Rs. 93.00 Crore in the previous financial year.

● The business of W.B. State Warehousing Corporation has improved remarkably during the financial year, 2012-13. Net Profit is likely to exceed Rs. 2.80 Crore compared to Rs. 2.41 Crore in the previous year.

• Eastern Distilleries & Chemicals Ltd. has installed a new C.S. automatic bottling machine at a cost of Rs. 75.00 Lakhs and it has been commissioned thereby increasing the production by 40 thousand bottles (600 ml) per day. The turn-over is likely to reach Rs. 60.00 Crore with a Net Profit of Rs. 61.00 Lakhs at the end of financial year 2012-13.

● The Turnover of Mackintosh Burn Ltd. has reached to Rs. 517.00 Crore with a Net Profit of Rs. 17.00 Crore at the end of the financial year 2012-13.

• Westinghouse Saxby Farmer Ltd. – the Manufacturing Division of the company is improving satisfactorily. The overall increase in manufacturing turnover is 20% compared to 2011-12 and 96% compared to 2010-11.

In addition to this, this department is also contemplating inter-PSE collaboration e.g. Westinghouse Saxby Farmer Ltd — Britannia Engineering Ltd. and Electro-Medical & Allied Industries Ltd. — Gluconate Health Ltd. for better utilization of existing infrastructure facilities for mutual benefits of the PSEs.



Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

Since May 2011, PHE Department, Govt. of West Bengal has brought about a paradigm shift in arena of safe drinking water supply for the rural population of Bengal.

- 1. The first major initiative of the present Government is the preparation of VISION, 2020 document with both short-term and long-term planning at an estimated cost of Rs 1,295.00 Crores and Rs 21,125.00 Crores respectively.
- 2. This Government, for the first time, has given special attention to the people of Jangalmahal Area (District Purulia, Bankura and **Paschim** Medinipur) by sanctioning of 50 nos of Piped Water Supply Schemes with an estimated cost of Rs 141.70 Crores to cover a population of 3.14 lakh (Census 2001). As on 31/03/2013, 25 nos of schemes have been commissioned, 10 nos are under trial run in the district of Paschim Midnapur and remaining schemes are at an advanced stage of completion and expected to be completed by December 2013.
- 3. In District of Bankura that falls under arid zone and where drinking water is scarce, a comprehensive water supply

scheme has been taken up under Bankura Phase-I Water Supply Project, covering 14 blocks, at a sanctioned cost of Rs 1011.12 Crores under Backward Region Grant Fund (BRGF) aiming to cover a design population of 30.15 lakh. Moreover, technical clearance has been obtained for Cluster of Water Supply Schemes under Bankura Phase-II at an estimated cost of Rs 690.74 Crores.

- 4. For comprehensive water supply coverage, special initiative has been taken for Purulia District and water supply project for Rs 1,017.90 Crores aiming at covering a design population of 15.14 lakh has been sanctioned with funding under JICA Mission, Japan. The work shall be commencing very soon.
- 5. The long pending problem of raw water requirement for New Town, Kolkata Nabadiganta, Salt Lake, South Dum Dum Municipality and Arsenic affected rural areas of Haroa and Rajarhat areas of North 24 Parganas District has been resolved by taking up a project at an estimated cost of Rs 348.37 Crores.
- **6.** During the period from May, 2011 up till March, 2013, **271 nos** of piped water

supply schemes have been sanctioned with an estimated cost of Rs 3,325.72 Crores to cover a population of 62,75,993 (Census, 2001). During such period coverage of Rural Population through Piped Water facility has enhanced from 37.95% to 42.00%. Further, approximately 19,500 nos spot sources have been created during the period.

- 7. In South 24 Paraganas District another big Surface Water Based Water Supply Scheme for saline affected areas of Kulpi and adjoining 9 (nine) Blocks has been taken up at a sanctioned cost of Rs 1332.41 Crores aiming to cover a design population of 32.89 lakh in 902 mouzas of 10 blocks in the District and field work has been started and tender has already been invited for Water Treatment Plant(WTP).
- 8. This Department is also emphasizing on use of renewable energy sources. For that purpose, 2 (two) Solar Power Based Water Supply Schemes for Shridharkati, Block-Hingalgunj, North 24 Parganas with an estimated cost of Rs 63.53 Crores and Kamakhyapur, at Sunderban Island [covering 10 Villages, and Design Populations- 38,178] have

been technically sanctioned. In addition to above, another 704 nos. of solar power based dual Piped Water Supply Schemes in the Districts of Bankura, Paschim Midnapur and Purulia have been technically cleared at an estimated cost of **Rs 51.67 Crores**.

9. This Department is consistently paying special attention on Water Quality Surveillance and Monitoring through existing 120 nos of water testing laboratories. To strengthen the facility. Detailed Project Report for further 100 nos. quality monitoring laboratories been has sanctioned at an estimated cost of about Rs 37.00 Crores and work will be taken up in 2013-2014.

10. The long pending bottleneck to commission Balason Pumping Scheme for the **Darjeeling Town**, which will eventually provide relief to 1,75,000 poulation, has been resolved by obtaining the required land from army to lay 4 km. length of pipeline. The scheme is expected to be commissioned by July 2013.

11. PHE Department has planned to set up drinking Water Bottling Plants to cater to the emergency situations like drought, flood and to ensure safe drinking water to the gathering of people in different occasions like Mela etc. Detailed Project Report (DPR) for 8 (eight) nos. of such Water Bottling Plants in South 24 Paraganas, Siliguri, Coochbehar. Malda, Murshidabad. Purbasthali, Haringhata Barrackpore with an estimated cost of Rs 42.82 Crores have been prepared. In the first phase, the work in South 24 Paraganas have been completed and 3 (three) plants at Haringhata, Nadia; Purbasthali, Bardhaman and Lalbag, Murshidabad are being implemented.



Last year on 18th-20th February, this department organized an International Conference with a Special Reference to Arsenic with grand success, where it was decided to set up an International Centre for Water Quality at Kolkata which will be the First Institute of its kind in India. Govt. of West Bengal has

provided 8.72 acres of land at Joka for the same and works have been taken up at field and Rs 50.00 Crores has been the State a holistic approach has been the State a holistic approach has been initiated by the Department for construction of 15 MLD capacity

Pipeline Projects

1. In Phase-II, in Bankura District, under Backward Region Grant Fund (BRGF), Water Supply Project for 5(five) blocks namely, Mejia, Gangajalghati, Indpur, Taldangra and Sonamukhi [Estimated Cost:- Rs. 470.16 Crores, Design Population:- 10.66 Lakh] will be taken up.

 Augmentation of Water Supply Scheme for Siliguri Municipal Corporation and en-route Rural Areas has been planned at an estimated cost of Rs 303.92 Crores. people of the Salinity affected areas of the State a holistic approach has been initiated by the Department for construction of 15 MLD capacity desalination plant at Digha, Dist. Purba Midnapur at an estimated cost of Rs 225.64 Crores to cover 2.18 lakh populations in 156 mouzas Ramnagar-I & II block. Another plant of capacity 10 MLD with an estimated cost Rs 194.97 Crores will also be taken up at Basirhat Block in North 24 Parganas to cover 1.23 lakh populations in 22 mouzas of Basirhat-I block. On successful commissioning of such desalination plant it will be replicated in other saline areas of the State.





- A ten storied High Court Annex Building with goethic features was inaugurated by Hon'ble Chief Minister and Hon'ble Chief Justice of Kolkata High Court
- 2. As promised by Hon'ble Chief Minister, a bridge over river Subarnarekha at Bhasraghat, Nayagram, Paschim Medinipur at a cost of Rs. 170 crores is getting constructed and will be completed within 11/2 years.
- 3. An elevated corridor (Fly Over) of about 1.86 km on VIP Road from Kestopur to Joramondir is In progress and will be completed within a period of 1½ years, which will certainly decongest the Airport bound traffic on VIP Road.

Major policy decision taken:-

- 1. In a major policy shift to bring in transparency and fairness, e-procurement and e-tendering have been made compulsory for all tenders above Rs. 5 lac in value and any purchase above that amount. The time taken for completion of tendering procedure as per PW Code has been reduced from 45 days to 21 days along with the introduction of e-tendering procedure.
- 2. The arbitration clause from contract

- documents draining out lots of fund from Government ex-chequer due to total misuse of the procedure.
- 3. West Bengal Highway Development Corporation Limited (WBHDCL), a Public Limited Company, has been formed which will take up of the task of up-gradation of all State Highways under Public Private Partnership (PPP) Module on BOT-TOLL / BOT-Annuity or EPC basis.
- 4. A dedicated system of accounting and administrative procedure for implementation of all schemes of Health Department under National Rural Health Mission (NRHM) Project has been introduced which has given rise to efficiency gain and has reduced the time for completion of the projects to a great extent.
- 5. It has been decided to restore the old heritage character of Writers' Buildings by shifting out several departments from Writers' Buildings. In the process, the temporary fire prone partitions erected in the corridors etc. would be removed to improve the fire safety in Writers' Buildings.

Besides the above, some prestigious building projects like "Judicial Academy at Rajarhat, "New Circuit Bench of Calcutta High Court at Jalpaiguri, Aquatic Centre at Police Training College, Barrackpore, "Aliah University at Calcutta, Administrative Building of P & R D Department at Salt Lake, "New Academy Building of IPGME&R at SSKM Hospital, Trauma Centre & Orthopedic Centre at SSKM and R. G. Kar Hospital, " 6-stroied building at Lumbini Park Mental Hospital etc. etc. are also being executed by PWD. Total expenditure to the tune of Rs. 645.00 Crore was incurred from May, 2011 to March, 2013. In Jungle Mahal Area Constn. of 34 (LWE) Girls' Hostels, "12 new school building with hostel, " 1 P.T.T.I., 40 Girls' Hostel (50 seated), " 4 new colleges, " 3 new stadiums, " 1 Sports Academy, " 1 Polytechnic, " 2 I.T.I., " 1 S.D.C. have been taken by this department. Progress of all the works are very much satisfactory.



Activities of R.R & R Dept., Govt. of West Bengal have recently been diversified in various fields.

Its work is not only confined to rehabilitate the refugees who had migrated from East Pakistan (now Bangladesh) into West Bengal prior to 25th March, 1971, but also to implement various development activities both in the rural and urban Govt. Sponsored Refugee Colonies.

The Dept. still provides Free Hold Title Deeds (F.H.T.D.) to the eligible refugees and has improved its performance in this field during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013. As there are a large number of colonies yet to be regularized, the Dept. has regularized a number of colonies during the year by way of acquisition of land particularly from the Dept. of Railways, Govt. of India in spite of its

constraint of fund therefor.

During the said period (i.e. from March, 2011 to March. 2013) basic civic facilities have enormously been extended to the Rural Govt. Sponsored Colonies. The Dept. transfers a number of plots of land to the various Departments, Govt. of West Bengal, for implementation of projects relating to welfare of the common people.

The R.R. & R. Dept. has taken up a project such as Bon-Hooghly Housing Project at Baranagar Municipality, in the Dist of North 24-Parganas to provide the refugee- inhabitants with the flats. The Dept. would take up certain other projects on PPP Model on the lands under this Dept. where production centers are presently located.

(I) 715 Deeds were distributed amongst non-displaced persons for home-stead plots on 99 - year lease basis on payment of token salami of Re. 1/- and token annual rent of Re. 1/-.

(II) Revenue worth Rs. 6.26 lakh was earned from water bodies under the Deptt. during the said period ie. From May, 2011 to March 2013.

(III) An amount of Rs. 9.96 crore has been sanctioned out of the allotment of Rs.

25.00 crores towards payment of decretal dues. includina mutation/conversion process fees etc. (iv) At Jharkhali, Sunderban 100 acres of land has been handed over to the Forest Dept for tiger reserve-cum-rehabilitation Project, 99 acres of land has been handed over to the Tourism Dept for Tourism Project & 1 acre of land handed over to the Home (Police) Dept for the purpose of setting up of Coastal Police station. Advance possession thereof have already been given to the concerned Departments. This has got recently the approval of the

(v) This dept has already relinquished an area measuring about 3.04 acres at Mouza-Bethuadahari, under Nakashipara Block, Nadia to L&LR dept for subsequent allotment of the same in favour of Technical Education and Training Dept for setting up an ITI thereon.



The aims and objectives of the Department of Science & Technology are:

- Promotion of scientific research activities for fulfillment of socio-economic needs of the people of the state.
- To identify need-based problems and solutions.
- Using Remote Sensing Technology in planning and development of the entire State.
- Popularization and awareness of science & Technology for the benefit of the common people.

Need-based problems and solutions – To assess groundwater potential and quality through the use of Remote Sensing and GIS technique, data-base for the districts of Murshidabad, Nadia, Howrah, Hooghly, Purba Medinipur, North 24-Parganas, South 24-Parganas and Kolkata are being generated under Rajib Gandhi National Drinking Water Mission Phase-IV.

Remote Sensing & GIS - Various Govt. of West Bengal and Govt. of India sponsored projects Landuse/Landcover, Sericulture Development, Hazard Earthquake Assessment of Kolkata megacity, Crop Discrimination and Infrastructure mapping have been taken up for assisting the line departments of the State in their development planning procedure. A major programme, supported by Govt. of India for generation of data for decentralized planning has also been taken up. For human resource development, Post Graduate Diploma, Certificate and Short-Term courses have conducted during this period. Zoning of Landuse/Landcover maps are going on for 13 districts of North and South Bengal.

Popularization & Awareness of Science & Technology Programmes – With a view to disseminate scientific knowledge to the common people, Science Popularization Awareness **Programmes** such Workshops, Exhibitions, Seminars, Science etc. through Fair. Educational Institutes and NGOs were organized. A Public Lecture on "Large Hadron Collider: Unveiling the Universe" by Prof. Rolf Heuer, Director-General, CERN, Geneva was arranged on 3rd September, 2012 at Centenary Hall, Calcutta University, which was attended by about 150 students among others.

The State level Science Fair was successfully held at Birla Industrial & Technological Museum, Kolkata during this period. A Science Camp for benefit of the students of Schools/Colleges of the backward areas of Hooghly district was successfully conducted jointly with the Education Deptt. of Govt. of West Bengal. A short documentary film on Witch Hunting to make the general masses aware of superstition was completed and a premier show was held at Nandan-III on 25th February, 2013.

The 19th West Bengal State Science & Technology Congress was held on 1st & 2nd March, 2012 with the active assistance of Saha Institute of Nuclear Physics, Salt Lake, at the said Institute's venue, which was attended by many dignitaries and a large number of common people.

The 20th West Bengal State Science & Technology Congress was held at Bengal Engineering Science Universities, Shibpur, Howrah from 28th February to 2nd March, 2013.

For promoting Skill development and Employment Generation particularly for SC/ST/OBC/Minorities people in the rural areas, several training programmes were organized and Entrepreneurship Awareness Camp (EAC) were also organized for engineering students.

The Patent Information Centre under West Bengal State Council of Science & Technology has completed study and documentation of Geographical Indication (GI) projects on Tangail, Tangail Zamdani, Korial, Garad were completed and has sent for filing to the

Directorate of Textile, Govt. of West Bengal. Gl registration for Baluchori and Dhaniakhali Saree has been obtained. Efforts are being made to facilitate of Moa. registration Joynagar Documentation of Sitabhog and Mihidana of Barddhaman has been completed for GI registration. from this more than 75 Patent Awareness Workshops were held for students, research scholars, scientists and technologists.

The Plant Tissue Culture comprises PTC laboratory and a modern greenhouse complex where micro-propagation and hardening of Horticultural, Forestry, Medicinal Plans is done including research & development. The Tissue Culture Unit took initiatives to transfer new and proven technologies to the grass root levels.

Lab to Land: Under this programme, benefit or product of any experimental research activity undertaken in laboratory is transferred to the field for wide use of the common people at grassroot level. Deptt. of Science & Technology, Govt. of West Bengal, has

taken initiative in collaboration with Agriculture Deptt., Govt. of West Bengal, to set up a Centre in 30 acres of land in a Government Agriculture Farm for knowledge on crop science, where tissue culture for banana and conservation, evaluation, protection and promotion of traditional species of rice will be undertaken.

Bengal Science Initiative: Under this programme, Deptt. of Science & Technology, Govt. of West Bengal, has taken initiative for 5 (five) Research Fellowships (Ph.D. Programme) in different disciplines ₹2,00,000/- per annum for 3 (three) years and 2 (two) Research Grant Awards for College/University Faculty Members ₹5,00,000/- per annum for 3 (three) years.





There has been considerable enhancement in release of subsidy and employment generation through Swami Vivekananda Swanirbhar Karmasansthan Prakalpa or SVSKP in the last 2 years. 7 new training-cum-marketing complexes have been completed and a number of new projects have been taken up. The department has also introducedseveral procedural changes like enhancement of subsidy from 20% to 30% for SVSKP and direct electronic payment of interest subsidy through RTGS/NEFT. A new project for sustainable livelihood of SHG's has been launched in Purulia. These initiatives have given a fillip to the self-help group movement in the state.

• Swami Vivekananda Swanirbhar Karmasansthan Prakalpa or SVSKP (erstwhile Bangla Swanirbhar Karmasansthan Prakalpa or BSKP):

It aims at Self Employment of Unemployed Youth through providing Government Subsidy against Bank Loans for projects submitted by individual entrepreneur or a group of entrepreneurs.

Performance of the scheme:

i) Government Subsidy enhanced from 20% to 30% of project cost subject to maximum ceiling of Rs.1.5 lakh for individual and Rs.3.5 lakh for group scheme.

West Bengal Swanirbhar Sahaya Prakalpa(WBSSP):

It provides interest subsidy to the SHGs on their bank loans . SHGs have to bear 4% interest on their bank loans and the rest interest not exceeding 7% charged by banks is subsidized by the State Government.

WBSSP has been activated by changing the payment structure through electronic mode. Now, Interest Subsidy is being credited directly to the bank accounts of SHGs since 01.04.2012 through RTGS/NEFT/ECS due to which the quantum of claims has considerably increased.

♦ SABALA MELA:

District level SABALA Melas have been organized in all districts for promotion of marketing of SHG products.

An amount of Rs.149.07 lakh has been spent for organizing such melas during May, '11 to March, '13 for the districts.

State SABALA Mela has been organized at Central Park, Salt Lake, Kolkata during the period of 14th to 23rd December, 2012 for which an amount of Rs. 225.50 lakh has been spent for the purpose.

♦ Sustainable Livelihood Programme :

A new project viz. Sustainable Livelihood Programme – a pilot project for Purulia Distict involving a project cost of Rs.7.00 crore(approx.) for training and capacity building has been undertaken by the Department during 2012-2013 which is being implemented in collaboration with NABARD. It is expected to cover 5000 SHGs and 50000 SHG members in a period of 2 years with resource mobilization and spending of Rs.300 crores(approx.)

Promotion of Sports throughout West Bengal is the top priority of Sports Department. There are hidden sports talents in rural area who if given the opportunity can be groomed and do well in their respective fields. In many sports such as Athletics, Kabaddi, Kho Kho, Volleyball, Football etc., sports persons from the state have done well. It is not always possible to fully promote sports activity and search hidden sports talents by the Government itself. Clubs and Sports Associations can play a pivotal role in organizing sports activities which help young talents to join in bigger sports arena. These clubs and associations have poor resources and infrastructure and often they need fund for survival. Sports events like football matches and cricket matches have been organized in Jungle Mahal area and in the districts of North Bengal with huge success with the involvement of local clubs.

> In order to give thrust and promote sports activities priority was given for creation / up-gradation of Sports infrastructure like stadium, swimming pool, sports academy, sports hostel. Total Rs. 2.79 Crore was released for Upgradation for stadia at Lebong (Darjeeling), **Jhargram** (Paschim Medinipur) and Uluberia (Howrah). Rs. 1.50 Core was released for construction of sports complex at Purulia. Rs.75.00 Lakh was released for installation of Flood lighting System at Kancheniungha Stadium, Siliguri.

➤ Rs. 52,69,000/- and Rs. 7,05,038/- was released for maintenance of Netaji Indoor Stadium and Swimming Pool at Subhas Sarobar, Beliaghata respectively.

➤ East Bengal, Mohun Bagan and Mohammedan Sporting clubs were granted with Rs. 1.00 Crore each for development & improvement of their Ground, Gallery etc.

➤ 4th National Level Rural Tournament under Panchayat Yuba Krida Aur Khel Abhiyan (PYKKA) for 3 disciplines viz. Volleyball, Taekondo and Athletics were successfully conducted at Vivekananda Yuba Bharati Krirangan, Salt Lake from 4th January to 7th January, 2012. Stadium at Jhargram has been completed.



Establishment of Network

The Sundarban Affairs Department is mainly engaged, in building connectivity infrastructure in the 19 blocks under the South & North 24 Parganas districts in the form of roads, jetties and small and medium size bridges. The Department is also involved in distribution of agricultural inputs, raising of mangrove plantation and giving economical and technical support to fish farmers.


2. During the period from May' 2011 to March' 2013, the Department has achieved the following results in road construction:

Construction of nearly 48 K.M. of Bituminous Road, 22 K.M. of Concrete Road in different Blocks is still going on.

3. During the last two years, the Department has completed construction of 40 R.C.C. jetties in different blocks. These jetties are extremely vital for movement of people living in the remote islands in the region and for promoting tourism industry. Also, construction of another 24 jetties is expected to be completed within this year. A permanent jetty is being constructed at Lot-8 (Kakdwip) for easy flow of pilgrims and tourists to the Sagar Island.

- 4. An R.C.C. Bridge over river Saptamukhi (372.8 Metre) connecting Kakdwip and Patharpratima blocks has been completed and put to use. Also, construction of a 722 meter Bridge over river Mridangabhanga connecting Mathurapur-II and Patharpratima blocks is progressing satisfactorily. The Department has also taken steps to prepare a Detailed Project Report for construction of an R.C.C. Bridge for connecting Gadkhali and Gosaba Bazar with a view to giving tremendous boost to tourism development in the Sundarbans.
- 5. During the last two years the Department has installed nearly 950 tube-wells in the different Blocks for providing safe drinking water to people. Installation of another 650 tube-wells is to completed in the next few months.
- 6. The Department is constructing a Sports Complex at Canning through P.W.D. It is expected to be completed this year.
- 7. Through Additional Central Assistance programme (OTACA), the Department has played a crucial role in extending grid power (Electricity) to the Sagar Island. Rural electrification in many remote mouzas in Gosaba and Patharpratima Blocks has also been taken by the Department during the last two years through OTACA.
- 8. The Department is also coordinating construction of 3090 dwelling units for AlLA-affected families in different Blocks in the Sundarban Region.
- 9. The Department completed distribution of bicycles to more than 33,500 girl students of Class-IX in 2011-12.
- 10. In the agriculture sector, nearby 45,000 farmers have been supplied with moong seeds and 40080 farmers have been given sunflower seeds during the last two years. Also, hand sprayers have been distributed to nearly14000 farmers and vermi-compost to 25,000 farmers. Nearly 4500 fish-farmers have been given lime and fish-feed.
- 11. During the last two years, mangrove plantation has been raised in 2600 hectares of char land. Jhaw plantation has been raised in another 875 hectares.
- 12. Grid Power has been extended to Sagar & Gosaba island and other remote areas.





West Bengal possesses a very important geo-strategic location. The State capital is the commercial hub of the entire region. The State is rich in art, culture and heritage and at the same time the state is endowed with rich natural bounty. Truly speaking it reflects a complete representation of the Indian Sub-continent in its physical form, Apart from aesthetic interest, to harness the socio-economic ramifications of the Tourism sector, the present State Government has attached paramount Interest and unprecedented priority for broad based tourism, focusing on tourism resources, hitherto unexplored & untapped. It also provides administrative and legal framework for the same. Its activities include issue of licences and permits. The functioning of this vital public service oriented department has great importance for the new Government.

together-with other important industrial cities / towns in the State, a MoU (Memorandum of Understanding) between the State Government and Pawan Hans Limited has been signed on 18th March, 2013 in presence of Hon'ble Chief Minister and other Hon'ble Ministers, Industrialists, Consular Personnel, various service providers in the Tourist Sectors and other Higher Officials of the State Government.

9. The existing runway of Coochbehar Airport is to be extended for operation of bigger aircraft. As per proposal submitted by Airport Authority of India(AAI) administrative approval has been accorded for construction of one box culvert over river "Mora Torsa" with a project cost of Rs.25.62 crore. 30% of the project cost will be provided by the planning commission as OTACA and the remaining 70% of the expenditure will

The Water Resources Investigation and Development Department (WRI&DD) is mainly responsible for providing irrigation services to the small and marginal farmers of West Bengal by implementing minor irrigation schemes and takes up the work of investigation and assessment of water resources in the state. The Department is also involved for development of Command Area of major irrigation projects by construction of field channel schemes and water management programmes.

Performance during the period May -2011 to March, 2013.

 Creation of Irrigation Potential through Minor Irrigation Projects is about 54353 hectare.

 Total no. of Minor Irrigation Schemes completed & handed over to the beneficiaries is about 3784.

Total anticipated expenditure incurred out of Plan Fund through different programme like Core Sector, RIDF, AIBP, ADMI, CAD&WM, etc., is about Rs. 205.55 Crore.

In the Centrally Sponsored Command Area Development & Water Management programme, about 10750 hectare CCA has been brought under assured irrigation by construction of Field Channels through 4 CADAs viz., Damodar Valley, Kangsabati, Mayurakshi & Teesta. 156 Water User's Associations (WUAs) has been formed out of which 122 has been registered up to Feburary 2013.

Under Jal Dharo Jal Bharo Programme, more than 50,080 water conservation & water harvesting structures have been completed in convergence with the programme under MGNREGA in collaboration with P&RD Department. WRI&DD has been taken up re-excavation of 116 water bodies under MGNREGA with an estimated cost of Rs.12.09 crore. 15 schemes have been

re-excavation of tanks have been sanctioned with an estimated cost of Rs. 4.09 crore and persondays of 2.71 lakh.

Mass awareness campaign of the programme has been continued in Kolkata and different districts of the State through daily leading Newspapers, display of Hoarding, Cycle Rally, Documentary Film in different versions, participation in mela etc.

West Bengal Accelerated Development of Minor Irrigation Project in West Bengal (WBADMIP), an externally aided World Bank Project has been launched for creation of additional about 1.39 lakh ha of CCA with an estimated cost of Rs. 1380.00 Crore. 388 DPRs have been prepared, tendering and implementation are in progress. 316 Water Users Associations have been formed by Support organisations out of which 179 registered.

Under Centrally Sponsored Accelerated Irrigation Benefit Programme (AIBP), 26 Surface MI Schemes in the districts of Purulia&Bankura have been completed and 1804 hectare additional MI Potential created.

25 Artificial Recharge & Rain Water Harvesting schemes have been completed, 10 in progress and 18 have been taken up in different districts by State Water Investigation Directorate(SWID).

Under Green Revolution (Phase-I & Phase-II), 917 STW (D) schemes and 110 Km. field channel with an additional irrigation potential of about 11004 hectares have been completed.

In response to the emerging challenges the Department has embarked upon large scale harvesting of rain water. Jal Dharo-Jal Bharo Programme has been initiated on multiple platforms. 50,028 water bodies have been excavated/re-excavated in less than 2 years against a 5 year target of 50,000 waterbodies.

The Women Development & Social Welfare Deptt., Govt. of West Bengal is working at the grass root level on various welfare activities for the well being of weaker and vulnerable sections of the society specially for women, persons with disabilities, old and infirm persons, Vagrants, Ex-Servicemen and their families. The Department serves the people in primarily three sectors.

- a) WOMEN DEVELOPMENT AND EMPOWERMENT
- b) SOCIAL WELFARE
- c) DISABILITY WELFARE

A) - WOMEN DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME KANYASHREE PRAKALPA

A Flagship scheme launched in February 2013 for the welfare of education and adolescent girls belonging to economically week families.

The section has two components – A Scholarship of Rs.500/- per annum for all unmarried school going girls and the lumsum of incentive Rs.25,000/- at the age of 18 years provided girls who is unmarried and unearth in some schools and colleges.

PROTECTION OF WOMEN WITH DOMESTIC VIOLENCE- implemented through 20 Protection Officers covering all districts under the protection of women from Domestic Violence Act, 2005.

SABLA –scheme for adolescent girls implemented in ICDS Centres by six districts i.e. in Coochbehar, Jalpaiguri, Nadia, Malda, Kolkata and Purulia by providing READY TO EAT food in the

form of TAKE HOME RATION.

INDIRA GANDHI MATRITYA
SAHAYOHG YOJANA (IGMSY)implemented with an aim to improve
the Nutritional and Health status of the
pregnant and lactating mothers and
their new born babies in two districts of
West Bengal i.e. Bankura and Jalpaiguri.
Cash in respect of Rs.4000/- is provided
to pregnant and lactating mothers and
above the age of 19 years.

STATE WELFARE INSPECTION AND MONITORING COMMITTEE has been set up in April-2012 to visit the Homes and inspect the day to day function.

REHABILITATION OF SEX WORKERS UNDER THE DIRECTIVE OF HONBLE SUPREME COURT- the State Govt. has planned to rehabilitate sex workers and has provided fund of Rs.5.00 lakh in the Committee to the said performance by

the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India in the year 2012-13.

PURNA SHAKTI KENDRA - a project for declining child sex ratio. A pilot project in 10 (ten) Gram Panchayats each at Malda and Purba Medinipur have been selected for convergents of all Govt. Departments for welfare of women.

MISSION FOR EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN (SMA) – the formation of the said Mission Authority has been done in the year 2012 consisting of 14 Ministers under the Chairmanship of Chief Minister of West Bengal.

SRCW - State Resource Centre for women has been set up to assist the SMA.

STATE POLICY ON EMPOWERMENT OF WOMEN - Govt. of West Bengal being the first State to being the State policy on empowerment of women.

ONE STOP CRISIS CENTRE Initiative have been taken to constitute one Comprehensive Care Unit for medical as well as legal and immotional support through Inter- agency network for the victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

B). Social Welfare

The Department is entrusted with several Welfare Schemes for Vagrants and Old and Infirm people aged and senior citizens.

VAGRANTS WELFARE – Objective is to prevent beggery and vagrancy for which 10 Vagrants Homes have been set up with 3000 vagrant inmates.

ENHANCEMENT OF WAGES IN VAGRANT HOMES- daily wages of vagrant inmates has been increased from Rs. 4.10 (fixed in the year 1994) to Rs. 40.00 in 2012-13

C CTV CAMERAS - are being installed in all Govt. Homes run to keep surveillance of Home inmates in 2012-13.

OLD AGE HOME – One Home is run by the Department along with 38 Old Age Homes of the NGOs.

NEW SHELTER WITH HOMES - set up to give new shelter to homeless of the people of Kolkata, Asansol and Howrah in the Year 2011-12 maintained by the NGOs.

- Initiatives for increasing the number of subsidized gas cylinder for use of the Govt, run Homes.
- •For the homeless persons of Kolkata, Howrah and Asansol, 38 NIGHT SHELTERS have been set up and the Deptt. Has also sanctioned Rs. 80.00 lakhs in 2012-13 to construct a Shelter Home at Beliaghata, Kolkata.
- •Since 2011-12 SABLA Scheme is being implemented on Pilot basis in six districts Purulia, Jalpaiguri, Coochbehar, Malda and Nadia and READY TO EAT FOOD is being provided to adolescent girl.
- •ECONOMIC REHABILITATION GRANT (ONE TIME) for rehabilitation of persons with disabilities has increased from Rs.1000/- (in the year 2011-12) to

the Rs.10000/-(2012-13).

•Scope for expansion and coverage of Widow Pension beneficiary has been taken by adding medical insurance to cover all single women and name it as "Social Security Scheme" (Widow, divorcee, unmarried, deserted/abandoned women) to keep in tune with the times and it needs.

- Providing upgraded training courses and facilitating extension of financial support in contemporary trades and services in partnership with NSDC, UNICEF, Public Sector Organization and corporate sector anchored by Women Development Undertaking. Focused on women Self Help Groups and different abled women.
- Awareness Campaigns on rites and entitlement of women and children have been launched with a one year programme on "Narir Adhikar".
- •Mahila Gyan Kendras or e-Learning Centres for women in the Districts in PPP Model are being set up with the support of reputed corporates who have shown interest to the Hon'ble Chief Minister in supporting the State in building IT skills.
- •50% RESERVATION OF SEATS FOR WOMEN UNDER THE 3 TIER PANCHAYAT SYSTEM.

Initiative has been taken with all concerned for ensuing Organizing classes in self defense (Judo, Karate, physical fitness etc.) for beneficiaries of SABLA are being done.



Report on performance, significant achievements and pipeline projects during the period from May, 2011 to March, 2013.

From 2004-2005 and onwards upto 2010-2011, approximately Rs.7.00 crore was spent every year for implementation of different schemes like distribution of Sports Goods, Gymnasium Hall, Youth Hostel, Youth Festival, Science fair etc. The present Government has put great emphasis on the overall development of the youth, and enhanced the scope of the existing schemes, and took up new schemes like, Development of Playgrounds, Vocational Training, Mini Indoor Games Complexes, Renovation of existing Youth Hostels and construction of new Youth Hostels, celebration of Vivek Chhatra Yuba Utsav, Rakhsha Bandhan, Talent Hunt on Kabadi & Archery, Development in Jungle Mahal area etc. The departmental budget has also been Increased substantially from just Rs.20.00 crore or so to Rs.100 crore in 2012-13 and to Rs.120 crores in 2013-14.

PERFORMANCE, SIGNIFICANT ARHIEVEMENTS AND PIPELINE PROJECTS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

• Organizing Student - Youth Festival as well as upliftment of Golden Indian Culture and Heritage by Remembering Luminous and Great Personalities - The Student - Youth Festival 2011 and the Vivek Mela was held in a befitting manner in commemoration of the 150th Birth **Anniversary** of Swami Vivekananda. Two awards namely 'Vivek Sahosikata Puraskar' and 'Vivek Medha Puraskar' were introduced. In 2012-13, Youth Festival was renamed as Vivek ChatraYuba Utsab and organized throughout the State Starting from the Block/Municipal/Borough/Notified Area Level to District Level and ultimately at the State Level. State Level Competition was held at Yuba Bharati Krirangan on 7th and 8th January,2013. commemorate 150th Birth Anniversary of Swami Vivekananda, World Youth Festival was celebrated involving various Departments on 12th January, 2013 at Yuba Bharati Krirangan, Salt Lake. About one(1 lakh)lakh people gathered to witness the programme. Cultural Programme was held at Nazrul Manch. More than Rs.13.99 crore was spent for this scheme.

Jangal Mahal Vivek Chatra Yuba Utsav: Jangal Mahal Vivek Chatra Yuba Utsav was held at Paschim Medinipore on 3rd, 4th and 5th January,2013. Jungle Mahal Utsab held in order promote culture and heritage of the Jungle Mahal area.

Raksha Bandhan Utsav : Raksha Bandhan Utsav was organized by this Department throughout the State on 02/08/2012 as a part of Student Youth Festival. Raksha Bandhan Utsav at State Level was organized at Metro Channel, Kolkata, on the same date.

Development Schemes - Financial **Assistance** of for Development Playground @ Rs.2.00 lakh each, distribution of Multigym Equipments @ Rs.2.00 lakh each, construction of Mini Indoor Games Complex to different educational institutions and organizations for Rs.20.00 lakh each @ 90:10 ratio/80:20 ratio. More than Rs.4.46 crore, Rs.9.99 crore and Rs.7.63 crore respectively have been spent for above schemes.

Development in the Area of Jungle Mahal: Development schemes in the shape of Development of Playground, construction of Gymnasium and distribution of Gymnastic Equipments, contruction of Mini Indoor Games Complex, imparting Motor Driving Training and other Vocational training schemes amongst the Jungle Mahal Youths have been taken up on priority basis.

Promotion of Rural Sports: A major programme has been taken by this Department for Talent Hunt in Kabadi & Archery. A month long residential Coaching Camp during the period from 10/12/2012 to 10/01/2013 for Kabadi in all the Districts in the age group of 12-16 years, and for Archery in the age group of 12-15 years in 3 places in collaboration of SAI. Finally, SAI has selected 15 boys & 15 girls on Kabadi, and similarly 15 boys & 15 girls on Archery, and taken full responsibility of these candidates fooding, education, medical and continuous training at their

permanent residential coaching centre at SAI to enable the candidates to participate in National & International

Youth Hostels: The repair, renovation and beautification all the existing 21 Youth Hostels have been undertaken. Construction of new Youth Hostel at Asansol has been started. Execution of new construction at Cooch Behar and the Swami Vivekananda Yuba Abas at Malda is going to started very soon. Proposals for setting up of new Youth ostel at different places of interest such as ChennaiHostels at different places of interest such as Chennai, Durgapur, Jaichandi Ayodhya Pahar, Pahar, Bishnupur, Meteli, Jayanti, Nabadwip, Mayapur, Bakkhali are under process and execution will be started in the current financial year. State Youth Centre, Moulali is being converted into a world class Youth Centre by way of renovation and modernization.

Cycle Rally: A 3 members team started cycle rally on 16th October from Kolkata to spread the message of Swami Vivekananda throughout the country. They covered 9000 KM road from Kolkata to Agra, Delhi, Joypur, Ahmedabad, Mumbai, Goa, Chennai, Bisakhapatnam, and return back to Kolkata on 12th January, 2013.

Pension to Ex-Olympians: Monthly pension has been enhanced from Rs.2000/- to Rs. 5000/-.






Performance of West Bengal vis-a-vis India as a whole during the financial year 2012-13,



PERFORMANCE UNDER MGNREGS FROM 2006-07 TO 2012-13






Year wise disbursement of subsidies under SVSKP





